On May 1, 2019, the Commission issued Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order in PU-18-399. In accordance with Order Finding of Fact No. 21, ONEOK Bakken Pipeline, L.L.C. ("ONEOK") engaged Braun Intertec Corporation ("Braun Intertec") to conduct geotechnical evaluations on areas identified by the North Dakota Geological Survey ("NDGS") as having the potential for future slope instability. The geotechnical evaluations for these locations determined that the proposed depth of horizontal directional drilling ("HDD") of the pipeline in these areas is sufficient, and construction may proceed as planned.


Enclosed for filing in the above-referenced matter, are eight copies of Braun Intertec's Final Comprehensive Report. The report contains geotechnical evaluations for all areas having the potential for future slope instability located along the Demicks Lake Pipeline project, as identified by the NDGS.

On June 25, 2019, ONEOK filed geotechnical evaluations for HDD sites located at mileposts 38.1 and 47.2 (Docket No. 86). On June 28, 2019, Commission staff filed a response (Docket No. 88) containing several questions with respect to ONEOK's June 25th filing. The enclosed filing is responsive to staff's inquiry regarding the timing and filing of a final report. With respect to staff's remaining questions, ONEOK will file a supplemental response to address these items.
