

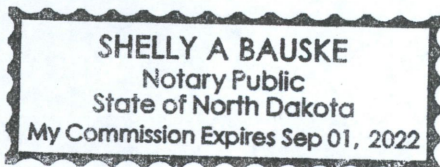

NOTICE OF FILING AND PUBLIC HEARING

May 1, 2019

A public hearing on the application in Case No. PU-18-405 is scheduled for **June 10, 2019, at 1:00 p.m. Central Time (12:00 p.m. Mountain Time) at TownePlace Suites by Marriott, 240 29th Street West, Dickinson, ND 58601.**

Belle Fourche Pipeline Company filed a combined application for a corridor certificate and a route permit for the conversion of an approximately 18-mile-long, 6-inch existing crude oil gathering pipeline to a crude oil transmission line in Stark, Dunn, and Billings Counties, North Dakota. The pipeline location is shown on the attached map.

The issues in the combined application are:

1. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facility at the proposed location produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Is the proposed facility compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facility at the proposed location minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
