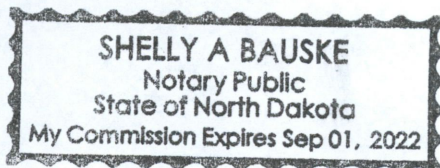


NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

October 22, 2019

On October 1, 2019, Montana-Dakota Utilities Co., a Division of MDU Resources Group, Inc. (MDU) filed an application for approval of an electric service agreement with the State of North Dakota, Office of Management and Budget. The agreement provides the State Capitol would continue to take electric service from MDU under its Interruptible Large Power Demand Response Rate 39 while MDU would continue to purchase the installed generating capacity of the Capitol's generator and any excess energy generated by the Capitol during service interruptions.

The issue to be considered in this matter is whether the electric service agreement should be approved.

Those interested are invited to comment on the application in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. **Comments and requests for hearings must be received by December 3, 2019.** If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a hearing.
