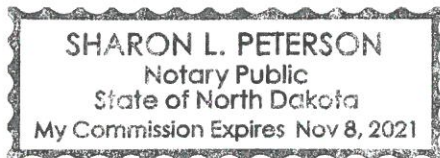

Motion made by Sigvaldsen second by Kupper to approve the consent agenda. Carried unanimously.

Mrs. Perdue reported two upcoming activities for family engagement. A STEM night is planned for February 20, 2020 with 13 - 14 stations set up for the kids and families to try various activities. Porter the Hoarder books have been ordered and will be distributed to the first grade students. The book will come with materials for the student and family to work through with the book.

Aimsweb testing for students grades K - 6 shows growth in reading and math. The math instructional coach will be here again on Friday, January 24, 2020. She will help us interpret test data and try to help with determining interventions. The MTSS (Multi-Tiered Systems for Support) committee are working on discipline plans as well as collaboration between administration and staff.

Mr. Heier reported the full day

of professional development was held on January 13, 2020. Teachers and administrators worked collaboratively within 4 person groups to come up with ideas for community involvement. Student interventions continue and we hope to see improvement next week when eligibility reports are completed. Semester two schedules are now locked in.

Scheduling continues with 2020-2021 basketball games as well as looking for additional JV football games for next fall. Coaches are needed for boys & girls golf and track & field.

Mr. Schafer reported construction is going well and is actually ahead of schedule right now. Construction meetings have been changed to bi-weekly on Mondays at 2 p.m.

Pending final interviews, the Williams County Study should be completed out to us in February. The Strategic Planning Committee met to look over the plan and adjusted some goal dates. The plan will be brought to the February board meeting. We received our AdvancEd/ Cognia Review report today. The review went well and we have received a good score.

Mr. Schafer gave the bus report. The mini bus recently purchased is running great and is helping out with the bus shortage situation. The new gas bus is here. Bus #16 is down and it has been hard to get

parts for it. Ottetail has hired a new driver but training and testing needs to be completed before driving.

The building project was reviewed. The first floor of the high school addition is being framed and is 85% complete. Next week they will be framing the second floor. The exterior windows and stairs are going in this week. The south addition is going slow because of having to work around activities being held in the gym.

A tuition free agreement was presented from Tioga Public School District #15 for two students transferring to Tioga for second semester. Motion was made by Olson second by Kupper to approve tuition free agreement #S2-2020-21 with Tioga Public School District #15. Carried unanimously.

The Great Western Network 2020-2021 school year calendar was shared with the board. Keeping this schedule in mind, the 2020-2021 school calendar was tabled for further review.

The board reviewed the calendar to set the school board election date. Our regular monthly meeting is set for May 19, 2020. Motion was made by Kupper second by Sigvaldsen to set the school board election date as May 12, 2020 with poles open from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., at the Ray Public School. Carried unanimously.

To aid in controls within the busi-

ness office, the auditors are requesting that one of the administrative assistants be given account inquiry authorization on the school district's bank accounts to assist in the reconciliation process. Motion was made by Kupper second by Olson to authorize a designated administrative assistant to have account inquiry access only to the school district's accounts. Carried unanimously.

Discussion was held concerning the districts homeless and foster care policies and procedures. Motion was made by Sigvaldsen second by Kupper to name Alesha Oster the district homeless liaison. Carried unanimously. Motion was made by Olson second by Sigvaldsen to name Alesha Oster the district foster care liaison. Carried unanimously. Motion was made by Kupper second by Olson to approve the Best Interest Determination for Foster Care School Placement form, the Transportation Plan for Students in Foster Care form, the Child Welfare Point of Contact Notification Letter form, the Foster Care Liaison Information form used within our foster care policy. Carried unanimously.

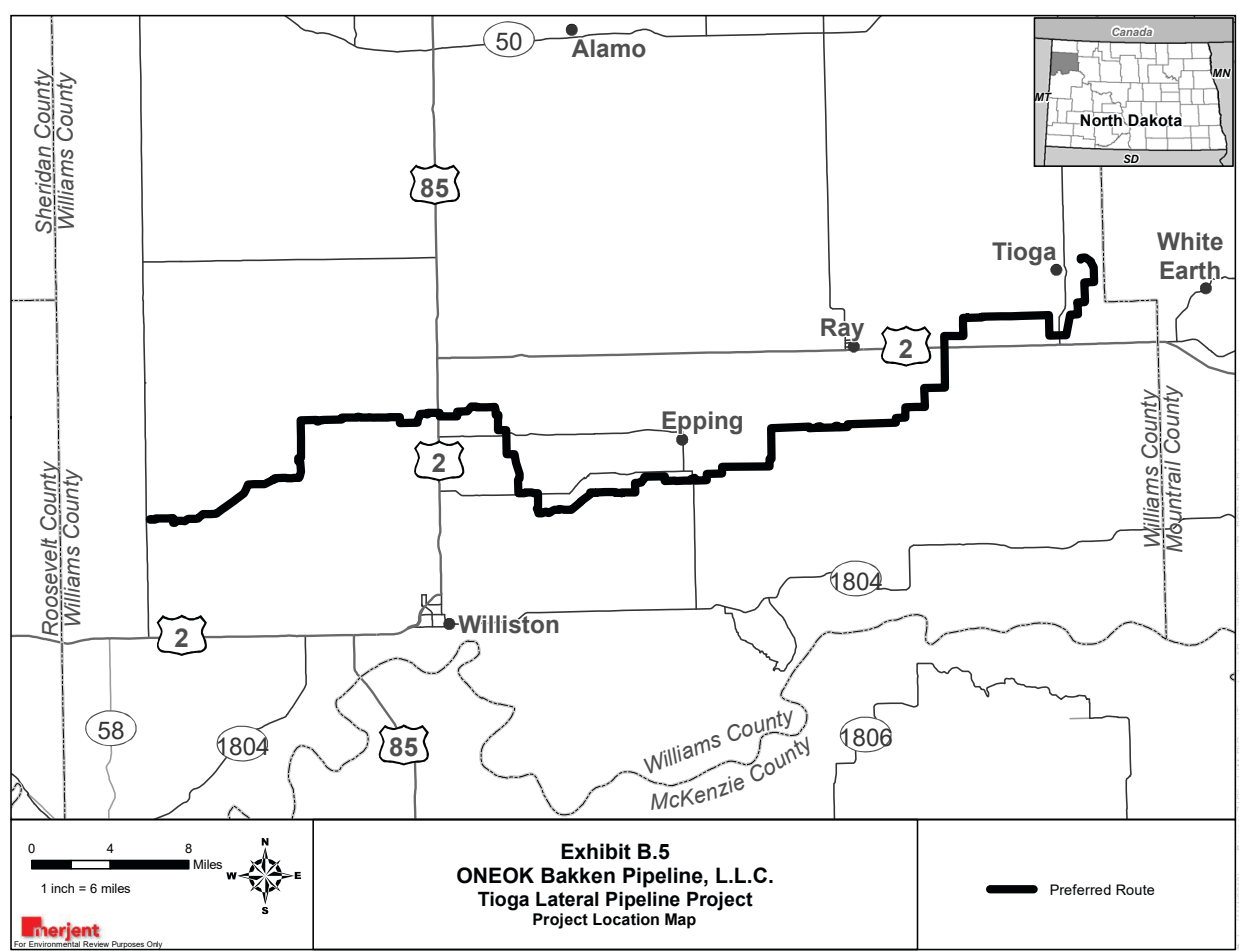

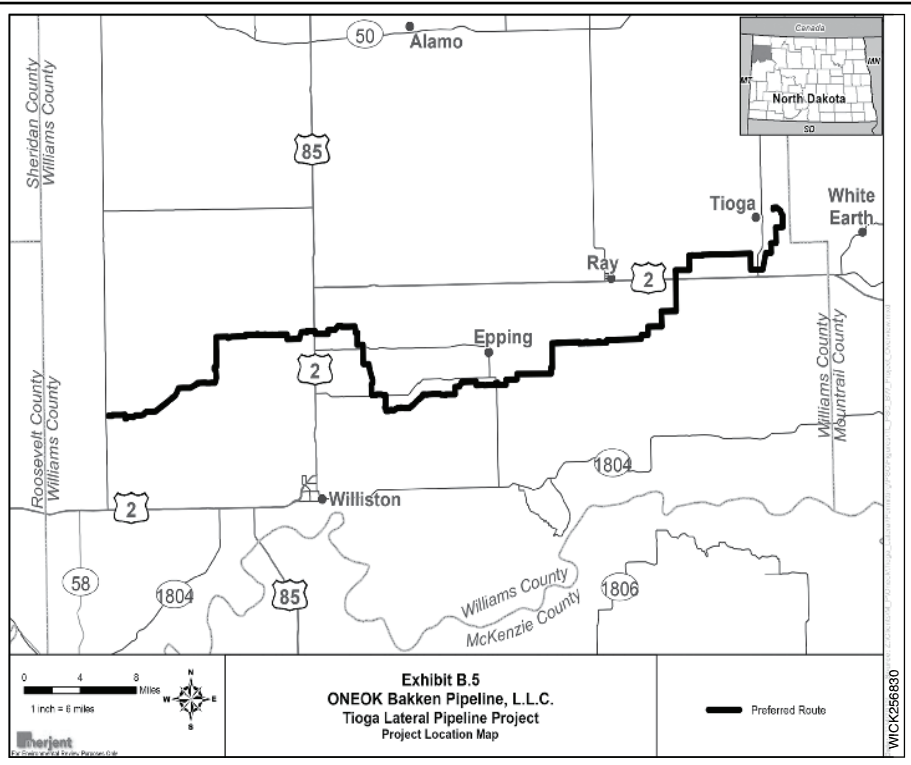

ATTENTION GOOSE HUNTERS

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department announces the following summary of regulations for the 2020 Spring Light Goose Conservation Order. Note: 2019-2020 season begins on March 31, 2020.

2020 SPRING LIGHT GOOSE CONSERVATION ORDER February 22 - May 10, 2020 — Statewide

- Resident hunters must have a current hunting certificate, a small game license if ages 15 and older, and a general game and habitat license (or combination license) Note: 2019-2020 season begins on March 31, 2020.
- Nonresident hunters must have a 2020 nonresident spring light goose license (\$30.00). This license enables nonresidents to hunt statewide for the entire duration and does not affect their eligibility to purchase a regular nonresident waterfowl hunting license for the fall 2020 season.
- All 2020 Spring Light Goose Conservation Order hunters must register with the Harvest Information Program (HIP). HIP registration for ND can be obtained with license purchases through the Department's website or by calling 1-866-634-4798. HIP registration for the conservation order is also valid for fall hunting.
- The Federal Waterfowl Stamp is not required for the conservation order.
- Only light geese may be taken. Light geese include snow geese, blue geese, and Ross's geese. They may be taken statewide from February 22 to May 10, 2020.
- There will be no daily limit or possession limit on light geese during the conservation order and shooting hours will be from 1/2 hour before sunrise to 1/2 hour after sunset.
- Electronic and recorded calls, as well as shotguns capable of holding more than 3 shells, may be used to take light geese during the conservation order.
- All Waterfowl Rest Areas designated for 2019 are open during the conservation order.
- No-leads shot is required for hunting light geese.

On February 14, 2020, WBI Energy Transmission, Inc. (WBI Energy) filed an application with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) in Docket No. CP20-52-000. The application requests authority to construct, modify, operate, and maintain natural gas transmission facilities in Williams, McHenry, and Burke Counties, North Dakota. This work is collectively known as the North Bakken Expansion Project (Project). WBI Energy is a natural gas company engaged in the transportation, storage and gathering of natural gas in Minnesota, Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Wyoming. WBI Energy also operates underground storage reservoirs in the Bakken Field, Montana; the Elk Basin Field, Wyoming; and the Big Horn Field, Wyoming to serve its natural gas system.

WBI Energy proposes to: (i) construct approximately 61.9 miles of new 24-inch-diameter natural gas pipeline from WBI Energy's Toga Compressor Station in Williams County to the proposed Elkton Creek Compressor Station in McHenry County; (ii) construct approximately 0.3 mile of new 24-inch-diameter natural gas pipeline from the proposed Elkton Creek Compressor Station to a new interconnect with Northern Border Pipeline Company in McHenry County; (iii) construct approximately 20.4 miles of new 12-inch-diameter natural gas pipeline looping along WBI Energy's Line Section 25 in Mountrail and Burke Counties; (iv) construct approximately 9.4 miles of new 12-inch-diameter natural gas pipeline looping along WBI Energy's Line Section 30 in Williams County; (v) construct approximately 0.5 mile of new 20-inch-diameter natural gas pipeline to the Toga Compressor Station; (vi) upgrade WBI Energy's Line Section 25; (vii) install additional horsepower at the Toga Compressor Station; (viii) construct a new compressor station, the Elkton Creek Compressor Station, in McHenry County; and (ix) install new and modify existing delivery, receipt, and transfer stations along the pipeline routes, replace small segments of pipeline facilities and install block valves, pig launcher/receiver stations and other associated appurtenances.

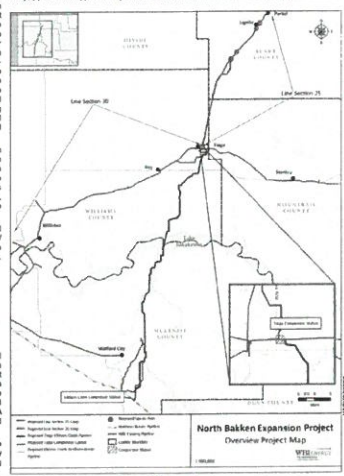
The Project will provide incremental firm transportation capacity from natural gas processing plants to a proposed interconnect with Northern Border Pipeline Company. This need for new pipeline infrastructure in the Williston Basin of northwest North Dakota is of critical importance to allow for the transportation of increasing levels of associated natural gas production and to aid in the reduction of natural gas flaring. If approved, WBI Energy plans to begin construction in the spring 2021 and have the new facilities in service by November 1, 2021.
