

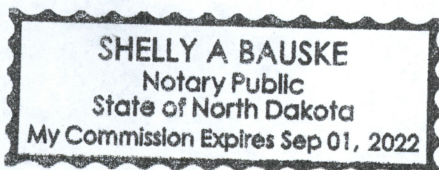

NOTICE OF FILING AND PUBLIC HEARING

February 5, 2020

A public hearing on the application in Case No. PU-19-369 is scheduled for **March 30, 2020 at 10:00 A.M. CST at Teddy's Residential Suites, 951 Eagle Drive, New Town, ND 58763.**

Whiting Oil and Gas Corporation filed an application for a certificate of site compatibility for the expansion of the existing Robinson Lake Oil Conditioning Facility, which will increase the facility's oil conditioning capacity from 45,000 barrels per day (bpd) to 65,000 bpd. The facility is located approximately 7.9 miles northeast of New Town in Mountrail County, North Dakota.

The facility's location is shown on the attached map.

The issues in the application for a certificate of site compatibility are:

1. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facility at the proposed location produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Is the proposed facility compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facility at the proposed location minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
