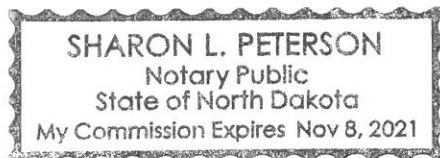

Ann Taylor, Brosz Engineering met with the Board to present cost estimates for the Burke County #11 grade raise if an additional 6" was added. After discussion it was decided to leave the project as it is at this time.

Ken Tetrault, Road Foreman met with the Board. The ATSSA conference in Fargo was cancelled due to coronavirus issues. Other items discussed were cattle passes that need repair, tarring, removing wings from motorgraders, dust control and gravel crushing.

Shawn Brien, County Sheriff met with the Board and presented an estimate for tear down of the house on Lots 13 and 14, Block 41, Shippam's Plat, Bowbells City which is a property that Burke County foreclosed on for nonpayment of taxes. This would be a site for the Sheriff's shop. Other issues discussed

were tasers, John Deere 4 wheeler, and creating an office deputy position.

Barry Jager, EMS/Grant Writer/911 met with the Board to discuss pay application #15 from American General Contractors asking for the retainage to be paid out. The matter was tabled for now.

Barry presented the Burn Ban Proclamation.

Burn Ban Proclamation For Burke County, North Dakota March 17, 2020

WHEREAS, Burke County, North Dakota has endured dry conditions, and WHEREAS, Burke County, North Dakota remains committed to protecting life and property, and

WHEREAS, the impact of fires could threaten the health, well-being, and safety of citizens of Burke County, and

WHEREAS, the cost of response and use of equipment may be in excess of Burke County and Local Fire Districts resources,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Burke County Commissioners declares a fire emergency and automatic burn ban (to include a ban on the ignition of fireworks, garbage/pit burning, campfires, and farm or crop land) remain in effect when the North Dakota Rangeland Fire Danger Rating is in the High, Very High, Extreme and/or a Red Flag warning has been issued. Additionally, burning will be allowed with a Low or Moderate Fire Danger Rating upon approval of the local fire response authority who has jurisdiction over the designated area in Burke County, North Dakota until October 1, 2020.

THE PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS BURN BAN IS A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.1.10.1: MAXIMUM SENTENCE OF 30 DAYS IN JAIL AND A \$1500.00 FINE).

Upon roll call the following Commissioners voted aye: Ryberg, Van Berkorn. The following Commissioners voted nay: none. Whereupon this proclamation was adopted.

Stacey Schoemer, Public Health Nurse joined the meeting to present information on COVID-19 and discussion was had about plans and procedures to put in place during this public health emergency.

Motion by Commissioner Ryberg, second by Commissioner Van Berkorn to adopt the following policy.

Staff that are isolated or quarantined because of the COVID-19 will be paid their regular working wages during the time that they are not at work. Staff will not be charged Annual or Sick Leave during their absence, as they are directed by the local Public Health Department or the ND State Health Department, who will confirm and document the need for a person to be isolated or quarantined. Staff will not travel out of state for any work related events until further notice. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned by Chairman Van Berkorn at 11:35 a.m. to meet again in regular session on Tuesday, April 7, 2020 at 8:30 a.m.

HEALTH EMERGENCY DECLARATION, BURKE COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA

WHEREAS, Burke County, North Dakota continues to monitor COVID-19 activity, and

WHEREAS, no drug or vaccine is currently available to treat or prevent COVID-19, and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020 (retroactive to January 27, 2020) US Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Alex M. Azar II declared a public health emergency for the United States to aid the nation's health care community responding to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, President Donald Trump proclaimed that the COVID-19 outbreak in the United States constitutes a national emergency, beginning March 1, 2020, and

WHEREAS, the impact of COVID-19 and cascading events threatens the health, well-being, and safety of citizens of Burke County, and

WHEREAS, Burke County Departments are undergoing efforts to mitigate activity through employee education, reviewing continuity of services, and purchasing supplies for increased cleaning efforts and virus protection, and

WHEREAS, the mitigation efforts may have a serious financial impact in excess of Burke County resources due to the unknown COVID-19 duration,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Burke County Commissioners declare a state of health emergency exists in Burke County, North Dakota.

Dated at Bowbells, North Dakota this 23rd day of March, 2020.

Upon roll call vote the following Commissioners voted aye: Owings, Ryberg, Van Berkorn. The following Commissioners voted nay: none. Whereupon this declaration was adopted.

Stacey Schoemer, Public Health Nurse, gave updated information on the COVID-19 outbreak across North Dakota and discussed cleaning and related issues related to the virus.

Motion by Commissioner Ryberg, second by Commissioner Owings that the Board of County Commissioners mandates that all county employees who have traveled out of the state for any reason in the previous fourteen days from this date (March 26, 2020) self-report to the ND Department of Health before returning to work until further notice. Motion carried.

A quote was received from CleanTech in Minot for one day of deep cleaning of the common areas and bathrooms in the Courthouse. Barry Jager, Emergency Manager/Grant Writer/911 voiced his suggestion that the County go to a four day work week, with a day for deep cleaning on Friday (if possible). After discussion it was decided to add the bathroom in the Social Services addition, and the break room and bathroom at the County shop to the cleaning schedule. Much discussion was had on cleaning issues, reduced work week, and work from home options.

Motion by Commissioner Owings, second by Commissioner Ryberg that Burke County go to a four day work week for Courthouse employees with regular hours and no decrease in pay to allow for one day of deep cleaning for the week of March 30, 2020 through April 3, 2020. The Road Crew will continue to work hours as normal and this issue will be addressed at the next regular Board meeting on April 7, 2020.

Meeting was adjourned by Chairman Van Berkorn at 10:00 a.m. to meet again in regular session at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, April 7, 2020.

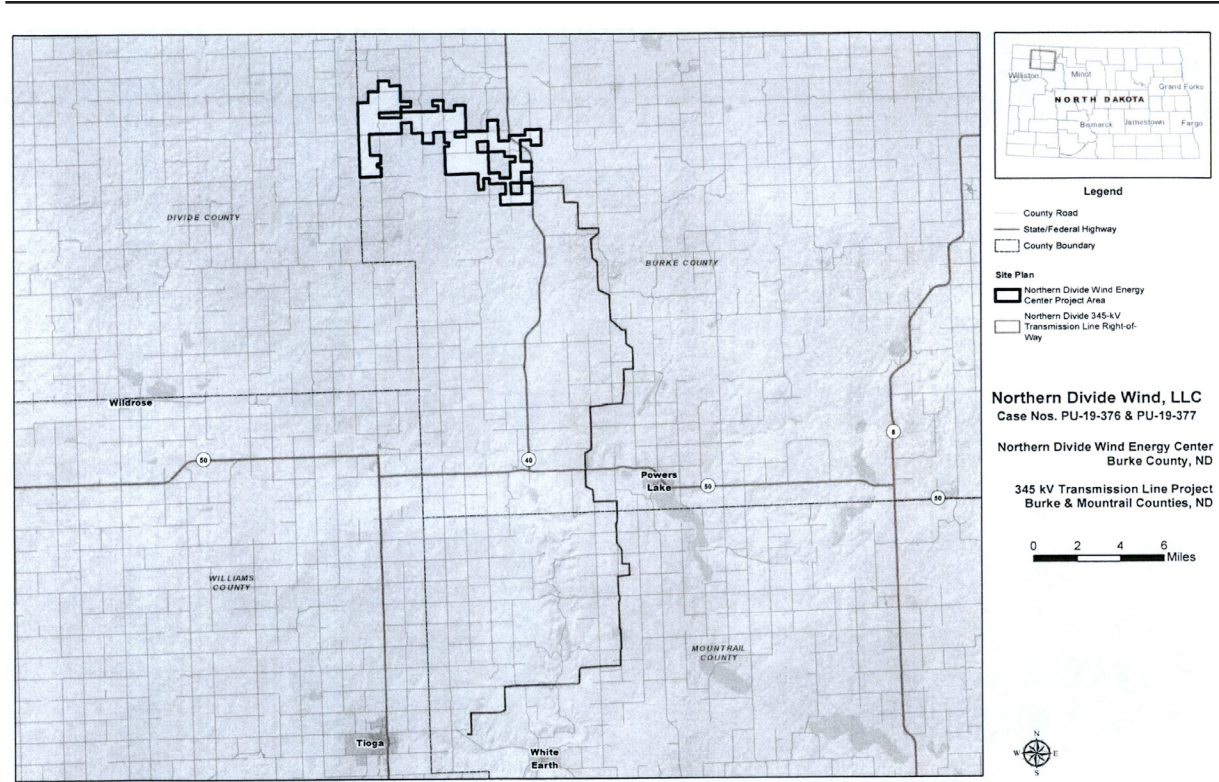

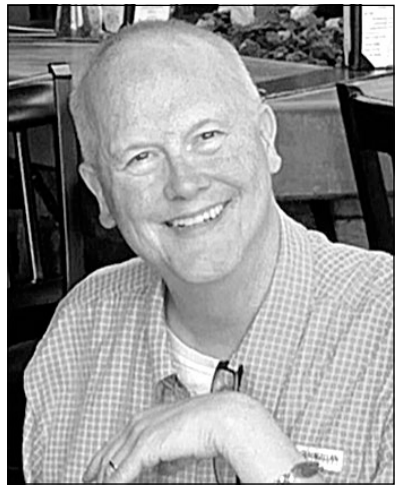

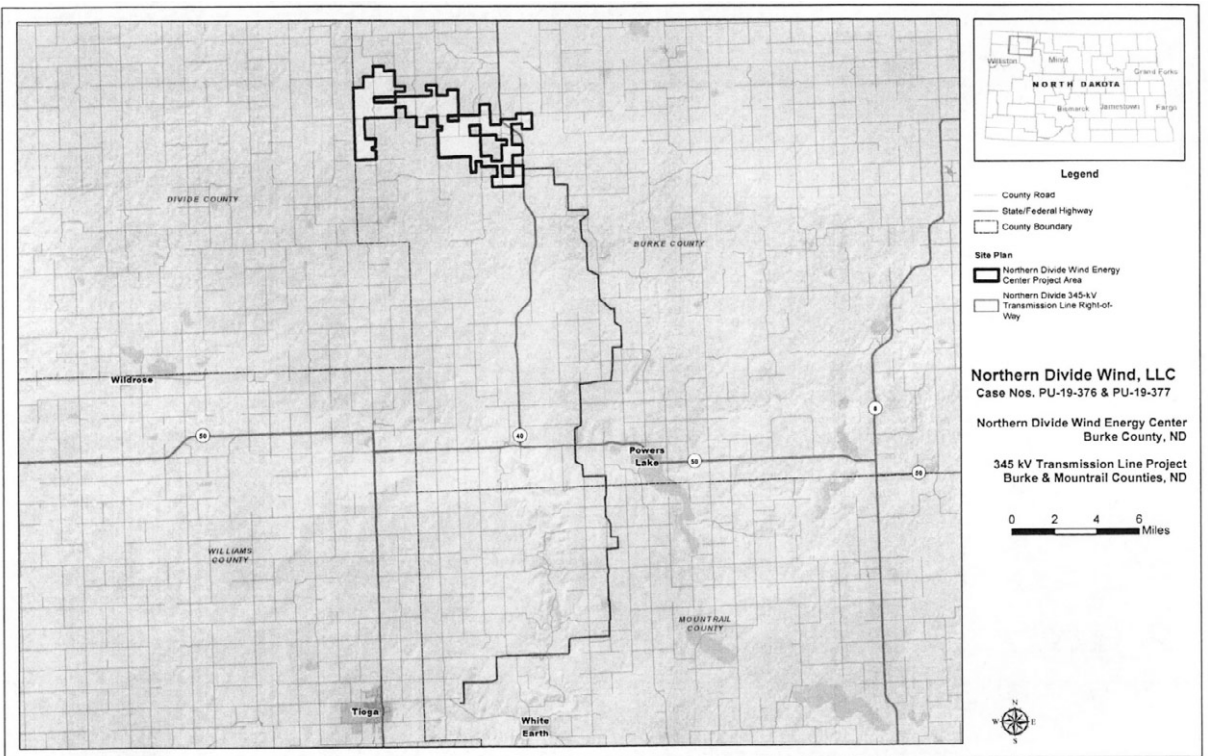
Also on December 5, 2019, in Case No. PU-19-377, Northern Divide Wind, LLC filed a combined application for a corridor certificate and a route permit to construct approximately 41 miles of 345 kV electric transmission line and associated facilities extending from the 200 MW Northern Divide Wind Energy Center in Burke County to Basin Electric's Tande Substation in Mountrail County, North Dakota, also as shown on the attached map.

Believing that there will be no prejudice to the rights of the parties or the public interest, and finding the cases involve similar questions of law and fact, the Commission is consolidating these cases for hearing under North Dakota Admin. Code section 69-02-04-04.

The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
