Donald was preceded in death by his parents; and one sister-in-law, Karen Larsen.

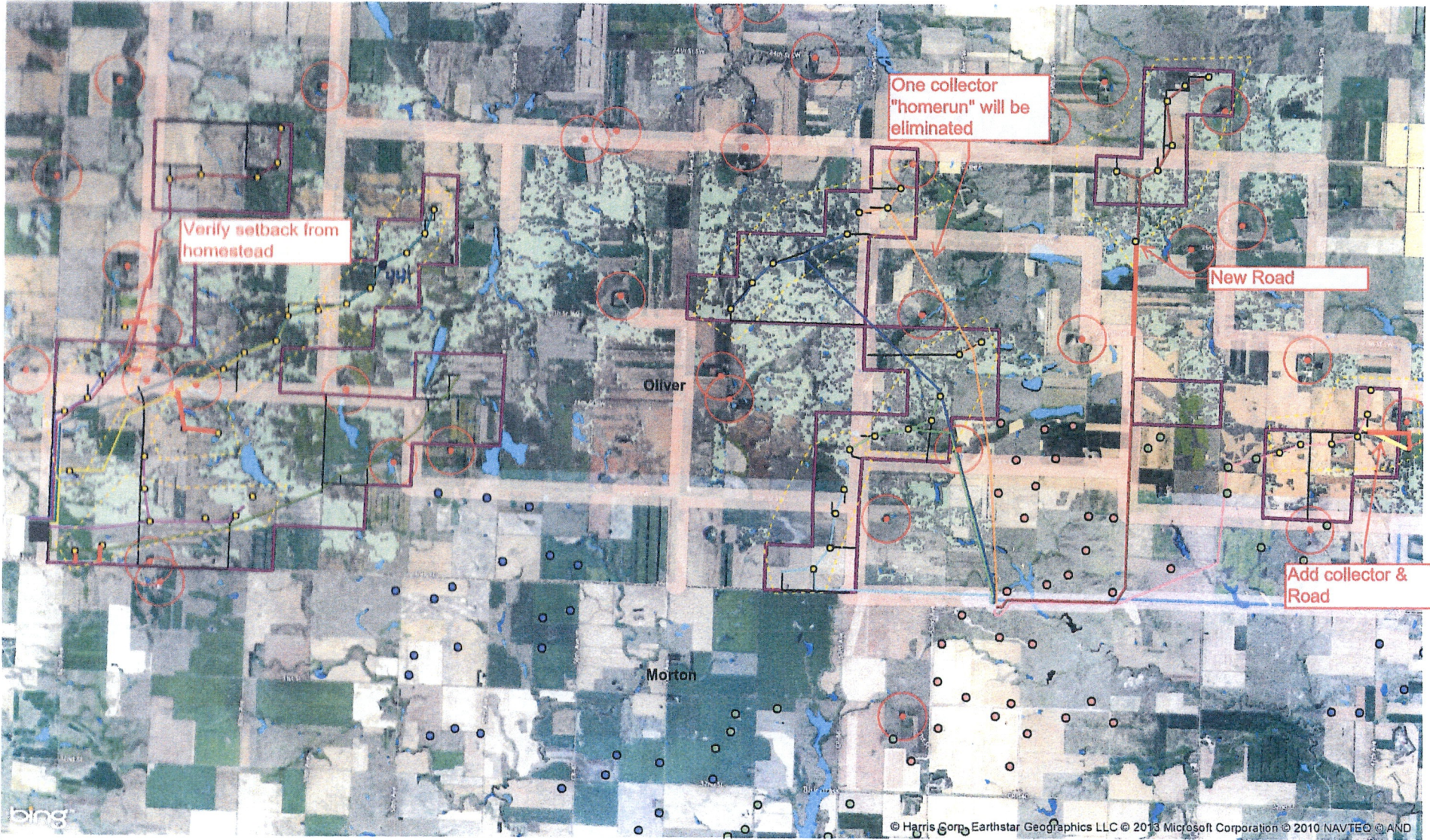
