Wagner Excavation ND One-Call Complaint

On June 3rd, 2020 at approximately 4:08 PM, Dan Ryan, Construction Coordinator – Minot, received a call from Jesse with Wagner Construction. Jesse told Dan he thinks he hit our 96-count fiber. As a point of reference, this cut was on 6th St. SE between 27th and 31st Ave which is in the area of an on-going road project for the past few weeks.

Technicians started breaking out and traying the fiber approximately 5:10 PM. The plan was to restore the business customers first followed by the nodes, first one being the Gate City Bank circuit, which started at 5:30 PM.

As fiber splicing was being performed and circuits were coming back on-line, approximately 6:00 PM, the excavation operator from Wagner Construction informed us they cut the same 96-count fiber we were restoring, another 700 feet to the south of the first cut. Reggie Schaan went to look at the possible second cut location and indeed they (Wagner) had cut Midco's 96-count fiber. Again, there were no locate flags or paint marking the Midco fiber as Wagner failed to maintain markings during the excavation. Project Engineer from Apex Engineering when asked why they were digging with no locates replied "I'm not even sure why they are digging in this spot, they should not have been digging here".
