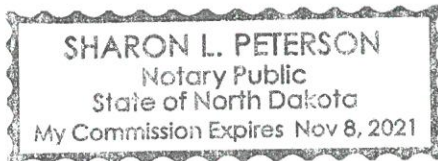

Local officiating crew well known across state

Klier and Kline have worked together the longest; then Krahler joined the crew, followed by Weninger and Lemer. Klier, Kline and Lemer are from Harvey. Krahler is from Fessenden and Weninger lives in Drake.

Ages range from Lemer, who is 32, to Klier, age 61.

"There's a big age difference," admits Klier, but it's not noticeable on the field, he hints.

On the field Klier is the referee, Krahler the umpire, Kline the head linesman, Weninger the line judge and Lemer is the back judge.

Athletic directors and seasoned coaches know the local officiating crew well; they appreciate their work, especially how they handle the players and coaches. ADs and coaches recognize the crew's knowledge of the game and its rules. The importance of the game, whether it's the first game of the season or a playoff game, is never lost on Dean Klier's white hat crew.

They're popular with the North Dakota High School Activities Association, as evidenced by the "big" games the team is assigned, including several Dakota Bowl games.

Coaches know if they have a kid acting out, they better do something, or the refs will. But not before the coaches have an opportunity to address the situation.

The young piss and vinegar coaches generally have to be cautioned once and early.

Friday night stories

It's a tight bunch, the crew Dean Klier has brought together.

Brad Kline recalls his first year of refereeing. He was ready to quit after the last game. He was talked back into returning.

"Now I live for Friday nights. I love it."

The five men enjoy the company of each other before the game and after each contest.

In overland trips to games, family stories are recounted. Favorite stories of games played long ago are invariably brought up, much to the chagrin of the man the inflated tale is built around.

Kurt Weninger is often forced to retell his second game officiating; it was in Harvey, a junior high game between two Class A schools.

The play was coming at Kurt on the near sideline, or so he thought. "I could have sworn I saw the ball on the ground." Play

over.

When Weninger blew the whistle and the play dead, the quarterback was running a bootleg down the far sideline for a first down and more.

"Go tell the coach you blew the whistle," Klier instructed Weninger.

"The coach wasn't happy," remembers Kurt, who was glad it was a junior high game not a varsity game.

Kurt Weninger still remembers what crew chief Dean Klier told him that night. "Never, I repeat, never blow the whistle until you see the ball on the ground." Not when you think it's on the ground, when you see it on the ground.

It's also a little intimidating for a first-year ref when Fred Fridley, legendary coach at Watford City, "comes marching on the field questioning your call," added Weninger.

Kurt Weninger also remembers one of the more important points Dean Klier continues to make at the start of every season: "Treat every game like it's a playoff game, like it's the most important game in a kid's life, because it just might very well be the most important game in the boy's life."

In other words, don't take your eye off the ball, not for a second.

The five seasoned referees all tell stories of the weather conditions they've worked in, from rain the entire game two years ago at Rolette to the game in Cooperstown, where hurricane-force winds disrupted play.

The stories are many: Shoveling snow to uncover the lines on the field in a game between Mad-dock and New Rockford. Thawing the ice-covered glasses of a fellow referee in a game at Devils Lake.

"We've seen in all," repeated Klier, who prefers the climate-controlled atmosphere of domes.

Klier's officiating days date back to the old days, when two-man crews worked games in the late 1970s.

"You were running over the entire field," Krahler and Kline said.

Those were the days of the naked sidelines, they noted, chuckling.

Over time, officials were added to each crew working the Friday night games.

Five-man crews are fine with the five working out of Harvey.

It's the cat's meow," offered Klier

"It's nice, much nicer," said Kline, who on Friday night was

awarded the state's Official of the Year plaque, recognizing his work in the 2019-2020 season.

His crewmates were proud of the award given Brad Kline.

"Well deserved," they agreed. "Brad's a stand-up guy," said Klier. "You're not going to find a better guy than Brad. He's very particular, very professional and very good at what he does."

Sportsmanship today

The five-man Harvey crew credits the High School Activities Association for the improved sportsmanship seen on all playing fields today.

"They clamped down on the disruptive behavior." Coaches and players, alike, it's a better game with the increased involvement of the activities association, the Lonetree referees agree.

Not that the local referees aren't questioned on occasion.

"You have to tune them out," suggested Krahler. But you know who they are, the loudmouths at every game site, Weninger hinted.

Said Lemer: "They like to tell us at halftime what we're doing wrong."

Dean Klier would like to trade places with the loud and unruly fan, just once.

He'd like to see him "run up the down the field a couple of times." And see if he had enough air in his lungs to blow the whistle.

Klier and Co. "don't just walk onto the field, unprepared."

"We come prepared," stressed Krahler and Klier. "We do our homework." Off season workshops and clinics keep the team up to date on rule changes.

Time, in fact, is spent before each game in Harvey, in Brad Kline's garage, reviewing assigned duties and the night's game plan, down to the minute they leave Brad's garage to the minute they step on the field to the exact second the game clock is turned on.

The minutes are counted off till kickoff.

The crew of Klier, Kline, Krahler, Weninger and Lemer plan to work another year.

The season will be evaluated after the last game.

Until then, they've got some Friday night games to work.

Truth is, they can't wait for the next kickoff.

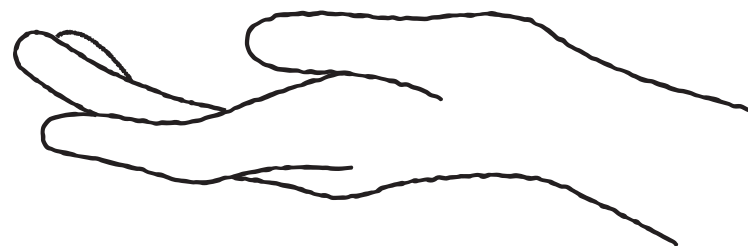

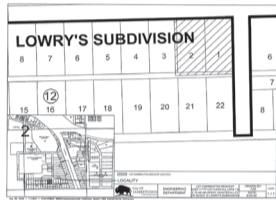

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: Anne Carlsen Center proposes to embark on the most significant expansion in their nearly 80 year history as a part of its Anne Carlsen Center Pathways Project. The new building and site will be located directly off interstate I-94, which east/west runs through Jamestown, ND. The site will offer visibility, space, and opportunity for growth that the Anne Carlsen Center will utilize as they continually expand and spread their model of care throughout the city, state, and region. The new facility is envisioned to actively promote the active integration and inclusion of individuals with disabilities into community life and ensure that the families of those receiving services can stay actively involved in their children's lives.

The Anne Carlsen Center's current Jamestown Campus comprises 54 Intermediate Care Facility (ICF-ID/DD) beds for individuals with developmental and intellectual disabilities and complex medical and behavioral needs. Thirty (30) of those beds are in the primary campus building, while the additional twenty-four (24) are in three 8-bed cottages adjacent to the campus structure. The Anne Carlsen Center serves children from across the entire state of North Dakota and its central location helps to minimize travel for parents actively involved in their children's care. Our other seven community-based locations in the region serve as important transition points as these children return to their home communities. These community-based sites include the cities of Fargo, Grand Forks, Devils Lake, Bottineau, Minot, Bismarck and most recently, Moorhead, Minnesota. Built in 1941, the current campus structure is nearly 80 years old and located in the Northwest corner of the community of Jamestown. The facility was built next to the James River in the James River Valley and has weathered several flood-risk related incidents. The building itself presents many challenges including overcrowding, multiple children per room in our medically complex unit, poor accommodation for family visitation and extended stays, outdated classrooms that aren't configurable to individualized learning environments, aging infrastructure, and asbestos in the structure.

Anne Carlsen purchased 21.02 acres significantly away from flood risk prone areas to build a new campus setting. The location selected is close to a major highway for better access and adjacent to the major hospital in the region, the Jamestown Regional medical Center, to provide advanced and emergent medical care. The new Anne Carlsen facility would support 34 individuals. This would comprise 24 individuals (primarily children) with medically complex needs and 10 individuals (primarily children) with intellectual, developmental and behavioral challenges. The 24 individuals in the cottage programs on the existing campus would stay in their current locations, with future plans to relocate these programs to other communities across the state.

The new Anne Carlsen Center facility is projected to be approximately 110,000 square feet and will house multiple departments that will serve not only the clients that live at the facility but also clients that come in from the community and outlying areas. In addition to the client residential rooms noted above, the building will include an educational wing, a therapy department, administration and education center (research and development into treatment best practices) components and associated support spaces. Also, it is the intent that the site is utilized to allow for therapy and wellness opportunities outdoors through defined areas around the building. Metcalf Archaeological Consultants, Inc., an environmental consultant, prepared an environmental assessment for USDARD that describes the project, assesses the proposed project's environmental impacts, and summarizes as applicable any mitigation measures used to minimize environmental effects. USDARD has conducted an independent evaluation of the environmental assessment and believes that it accurately assesses the impacts of the proposed project. conditions with most lakes at or near record water levels, with flooded vegetation for the young fish to hide and plenty of food for them to eat, which bodes well for future fishing opportunities.

I grew up listening to Casey Kasem's Weekly Top 40 music countdown. It was a different era where musical success wasn't measured by downloads and clicks. Even to this day I can't say I really understood how his Top 40 was compiled, but I was hip to the long-distance dedications.

Listeners (maybe thousands?) would write the show and Kasem would read one on air and the dedication was granted. How he picked the song and when to play it was seemingly sort of science based on geography and popularity. He knew which one would draw in the listeners.

Hard to believe I can relate fish stocking in the state to a popular music radio show from three decades ago, but work with me. The North Dakota Game and Fish Department receives many requests for fish stocking on specific waters and preferred species. While Department fisheries personnel would love to make everyone happy, there are a number of management concerns that need to be addressed before simply stocking fish here or there.

Even so, this year a fish stocking record in North Dakota was broken as

Department fisheries personnel stocked a record 180 lakes across the landscape with 12 million walleye fingerlings.

Jerry Weigel, Department fisheries production and development supervisor, said the number of lakes bested the previous high by nearly 30 waters.

"There is record water across the state, so timing of a near record walleye production could not have come at a better time," he said. "Valley City and Garrison Dam national fish hatcheries contributed to make this happen. Both hatcheries have been outstanding in helping address our demand for walleye fingerlings."

Garrison Dam National Fish Hatchery set a record for the most pounds shipped of these 1- to 1.5-inch fingerlings, with more than 8,400 total pounds. Given the record walleye production, coupled with a record number of lakes stocked, resulted in a lot of driving time for fish haulers.

"Just in the first seven days of this year's walleye production, haulers traveled more than 8,200 miles and stocked over 150 lakes with 7.6 million fish," Weigel said.

Crews had near perfect

"One of the biggest challenges this year was access to some lakes," Weigel said. "As a result of last fall's record rains, a lot of local roads in central and eastern North Dakota remained flooded and often closed, thus making navigating some roads more challenging."

Later this fall, fisheries personal will sample walleye lakes to assess success of this year's walleye stocking, as well as what Mother Nature provided.

One common observation fish haulers noted while traveling across the state, Weigel said, was the high amount of fishing taking place, both from shore and from boats.

"It's a great time to fish for walleye," he said. "Statewide, there are a lot of opportunities, and a good chance of success. This is especially true if you live in rural North Dakota where a lot of varied fishing opportunities exist."

Does Ransom County need a \$136,000 Court House?

PART TWO OF A THREE-PART HISTORICAL SERIES...

Editor's note: This is the second in a three-part series that talks about the controversy surrounding the construction of a new Ransom County courthouse in 1936 and how our courthouse, now on the National Register of Historic Places, came to be.

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE ARGUMENT

There were many people who felt that the building of a new courthouse was an unnecessary expense at the time. A "Committee of Taxpayers" formed an active campaign against the new courthouse idea.

"With so many of our people on relief and unable to pay taxes, with the tax burden of those who can pay every increasing, and with crop returns still uncertain, can we afford to bond ourselves for a court house, the cost of which, even in the most prosperous times, would by sound thinking men be considered extravagant?" a counter-statement by this committee asked the Ransom County taxpayer.

"When you and your neighbors are just beginning to see the possibility of returning prosperity, are you willing to spend one-seventh of a million dollars for a building that is not now a necessity, and which even in the best of times would be considered a luxury?"

Not \$110,000, but \$136,000 This committee laid out the numbers of this 'luxury' in their statement. "Those urging the expenditure of this tremendous amount of money inform you that the building completely equipped will cost not to exceed \$110,000; that the government will make an outright grant of 45 percent of the cost of the building, and that the taxpayers of Ransom County must supply the other 55 percent, of \$75,000.

"They are wrong in their figures. If Ransom County is to pay \$75,000, which represents 55 percent of the total amount to be expended for a courthouse, then it is apparent that the total cost of the courthouse will be approximately \$136,000 instead of \$110,000. Of course, you will be told that all the money available will not be expended. Very few public bodies fail to spend all money legally available."

GRANT MONIES QUESTIONABLE

The other side of the argument said that the grants available were questionable. "How sure are we of securing the 45 percent government grant?" they asked. "When the Democratic administration first announced plans for the expenditure of its five billion dollar relief fund, much was said about the great amount of public building that could now be done. "Shortly after these first an-

nouncements were made, the administration discovered that if any appreciable amount of money were to be spent for materials, there would be very little left for labor.

"Since the main purpose of spending the five billion dollars is to relieve unemployment, the administration has revised its first estimates, and according to newspaper reports, it is not planned to make grants only on projects were a large proportion of the money will go directly to labor. Approximately 20 percent of the cost of a large building is spent in labor. DO you think it probably that this 45 percent grant will be made?"

"If the 45 percent grant is made, how much will Ransom County benefit in dollars and cents? Many voters of Ransom County have observed government-controlled construction. Virtually all voters of Ransom County have had personal experience with the maze of red tape attached to the spending of government money.

"You would not build a home of your own with your own money if it were necessary to secure the government's approval to your plans, to employ only at a rate specified by the government. Are you willing then to build a courthouse in Ransom County under such wasteful conditions?"

"If we must have a courthouse, the voters should demand that they be given an opportunity to vote on the construction of a building of reasonable cost, one of simple but sound construction, and without all of the frills and fancies of a civic monument. The voters may do this by voting 'NO' at Monday's election."

THE DESIGN OF THE

RANSOM COUNTY COURTHOUSE

The type of courthouse in a North Dakota county typically depends on what year it was built.

There were eight courthouses built in North Dakota during the Depression years until the Second World War, from 1929-1940. Most of these are built in the same style that the Ransom County Courthouse is, called "Art Deco." These courthouses are located in Burleigh, Emmons, Hettinger, Sheridan, Stark, Walsh, Ward, and Ransom Counties, and are recognized as this "Art Deco" style, because of their use of stylized exterior decoration, emphasis on the vertical, use of exotic materials on the interior and exterior, and use of setbacks and telescoping structural bays.

Where a courthouse is located is generally undramatic in North Dakota. North Dakota in general lacks the examples of the courthouse square, which can be found in many other states. Instead, the courthouse is usually situated on a regular town block, so that the block is pretty indistinguishable from any other city block on a town's grid of streets.

Some courthouses in ND are located on the outskirts of town, but there were no real rules that governed where a courthouse would appear in a North Dakota town. Probably the most important event which determined the location of a courthouse was the donation of a block or series of lots for the facility, even though this wasn't the case in Lisbon.

The Ransom County Courthouse was nominated to the National Register of Historic Places as well as most other courthouses. On the nomination form, it states that: "All of the Art Deco court-

houses of the 1930's have been included. Their construction dates extend as late as 1940, i.e. beyond the normal National Register fifty-year guideline for eligibility.

"Architecturally these buildings have some of the most sophisticated designs and impressive materials, as well as the highest degree of integrity.

"The year 1940 also represents a dramatic break in courthouse construction throughout the state, so that the Art Deco courthouses truly belong to a historic period and that those constructed in 1952 and afterward represent a modern phase.

"Historically the Deco courthouses are very significant. Their construction costs went beyond what citizens conceived that buildings might cost. Nevertheless, federal financial assistance in the form of matching PWA and WPA grants allowed counties to accept the financial risk during the Depression.

"Their erection during that period represents an important mixture of federal relief programs and local self-confidence a formula on which many during the Depression hung their hopes. North Dakota, as many agricultural states in the Great Plains, was hard hit by the Depression; courthouse construction gave work to many unemployed laborers. The existence of such fine structures during that trying period gives the buildings constructed from 1935-1940 an exceptional significance."

The argument must have worked, because the Ransom County Courthouse was listed on the National Register of historic places in 1985.

Dakota Datebook: Portable Lungs

September 7, 2020 — "Not until we have removed the shadow of the Crippler from the future of every child can we furl the flags of battle and still the trumpets of attack. The fight against infantile paralysis is a fight to the finish, and the terms are unconditional surrender."

Those were the words of President Franklin Roosevelt in 1944. He was referring to poliomyelitis – or polio – the disease that had put him in his wheelchair.

In 1962, editor J. I. Rodale wrote, "In the earlier days, polio victims had their affected limbs splinted and bandaged into complete immobility until, even if there were a return of muscle power, the function had been partially or completely lost by atrophy of the limb. With the treatment devised by the gallant and forceful Australian nurse, Sister Kenny, a new attitude toward polio-paralyzed limbs was adopted," he wrote. "She proved that action, not immobility was the key to bringing affected arms and legs back to usefulness."

The polio virus attacks nerves in the spinal cord, causing paralysis of those parts of the body controlled by the infected nerves. Of crucial importance was the diaphragm, a

muscle above the stomach that controls the lungs, which don't have their own muscles. As the diaphragm moves up, it pushes air out, and when it moves down, air is sucked inward. If the polio virus attacks the nerves that control the diaphragm, patients can die of suffocation.

To combat this problem, Philip Drinker and Louis Shaw of Harvard Medical School introduced the iron lung in 1928. This sealed, tank-like contrivance served as the first form of artificial respiration. Polio patients lay inside a chamber with just their head showing at one end. Inside, the machine worked much like the bellows of an accordion. A vacuum within the chamber allowed patients' lungs to fill with air, and a subsequent cycle of pressure forced them to exhale.

By 1952, the reported cases of polio reached an all-time high, and the public was panicking. As with previous epidemics, people grasped at straws, trying to understand what was causing the disease. Water was tested, and all possible remedies were tried. Parents were forced to climb ladders to visit their quarantined children through hospital windows.

Victims with paralyzed lungs were completely dependent on their mechanical breathing machines; if the electricity went out, their lives were instantly in danger. Pa-

tients in iron lungs also couldn't be moved. The portable iron lung, invented in 1937, was a major breakthrough, because it could be switched to battery power in emergencies.

It was on this date in 1953 that Cass County got its first portable lung. It was given to St. Luke's Hospital by the Fargo Kiwanis Club, which raised the money through a network of gumball machines. Before the machine could be officially presented, it was put into use by Dale Carlson, a 14-year-old patient who had been hospitalized in Devils Lake for the previous three weeks.

The Fargo Forum reported, "The portable lung consists of a large plastic case, covering the chest of the patient, connected to a respirator apparatus." Indeed, the portable lung looked like a space-age device compared to its submarine-like predecessor.

Interestingly, the hospital's iron lungs were maintained by the fire department ... probably because they could be used to revive victims of smoke inhalation.

and storage system to be \$1 billion. Not many coal-fired power plants around the world use the technology, and the system at the Milton R. Young Station in Oliver County would be a first-of-its-kind project, which would likely make it more expensive than a future iteration at another facility.

The project involves a lot of explaining as its leaders court potential investors. If the plant were to convert to natural gas, for example, it would emit substantially more carbon dioxide than if it were to operate with coal and a carbon capture system, McLennan said. Project

Tundra aims to capture at least 90% of the facility's carbon emissions.

"Capture is better from an environmental perspective," McLennan said. "But it's going to be to convince people that it's safe to invest in, convince them that you have an asset that can survive what is a challenging set of economics right now."

He and others in attendance also addressed what they described as distortion within power markets, which have been flooded with cheap natural gas and renewable energy in recent years.

Coal-fired power plants operate most efficiently when they run all the time, an attribute often referred to by the state's coal industry as "baseload" power. Coal can

ensure a constant, steady stream of electricity even when the wind isn't blowing or the sun isn't shining.

"The markets are missing the attributes of resilience and the dispatchability of baseload energy," Lignite Energy Council President and CEO Jason Bohrer said.

The state's coal industry is looking at new revenue streams for lignite, such as extracting rare earth elements to make products such as cell phones or using carbon emissions in commercial greenhouses, he said.

Those applications "rest on the ability to continue to produce electrons first," Bohrer said.

Brouillette said he and President Donald Trump believe in an "all-of-the-above" energy landscape that

includes fossil fuels in the nation's energy mix.

He pointed to recent blackouts in California amid a heatwave, saying that they were "the result of choosing the wrong energy policy." California has aggressively pushed to build solar and wind farms.

Brouillette said the U.S. energy mix needs to be balanced.

"We should have a diversity of choice," he said.

During a separate discussion with oil leaders, Brouillette stressed the importance of pipelines such as Dakota Access.

"Our challenge in America is no longer production," he said. "Our challenge is getting products to market."

Efforts to litigate pipelines are "a

tactic to shut down fossil fuel development here in the United States," he said, adding, "We have to look at it and address it very squarely."

Tad True, vice president of Wyoming-based Bridger Pipeline, said the pipeline industry has become a "very risky" business in recent years.

When embarking on a new pipeline project, his company must weigh whether it's going to receive its necessary government permits and whether they could be revoked if someone challenges the project.

"The uncertainty we're facing right now is really incredible," he said.

have decided to postpone the 2020 event to 2021."

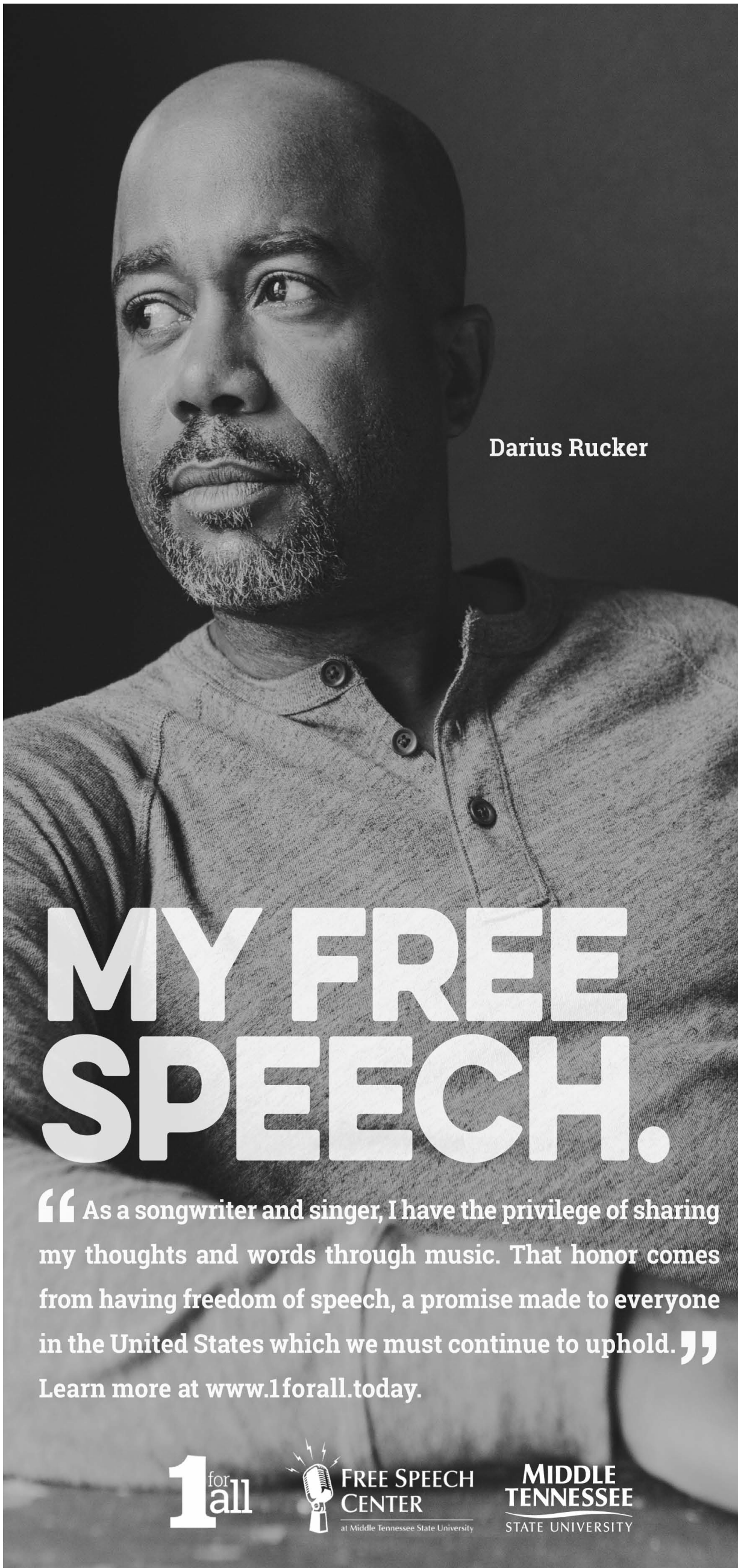

Public Access for all county board meetings

All Sargent County board meetings, including County Commissioners, Water Resource Board, Weed Board and Fair Board should have public access using the GoToMeeting platform to which Sargent County Commissioners have a subscription.

Commissioners had recently received a complaint that members of the public were not provided with a GoToMeeting access code to a recent Water Resource board meeting. But, Water Board attorneys and engineers had used the teleconferencing platform to attend the meeting.

Commissioners tasked States Attorney Jayne Pfau with drafting a revision to county policy to require all county board meetings to provide remote access to their meetings.

North Dakota Public Health Insurance Trust had presented their insurance plans to the County Commissioners during the commissioner's meeting on August 18. The County now uses PERS for its health and life insurance and retirement plans.

Commissioner Bill Anderson said he felt that with PHIT, the county would have more control over the program since PHIT has an appointed board from the cities and counties it serves which oversees its operations.

PHIT also has more tiers for coverage and provides Medicare Supplement plans, which PERS does not.

Premiums would remain the same, but an additional \$36,000 would be due to enroll. Premium increases would be capped at 3 to 5% per year. A 20% increase in insurance premiums has been budgeted for 2021. Such an increase won't happen if the county chooses PHIT as their insurance provider.

Life insurance and the retirement plan would remain with PERS.

A motion that Sargent County enroll in NDPHIT with the first premium paid in December of 2020 to begin coverage in January of 2021 passed by a vote of 3-2, with Jerry Waswick and Richard Ruch voting no.

Several applications for the position of county road supervisor have been received. The Road Commissioner, Jason Arth, States Attorney Pfau and the Commission Chair will conduct interviews and make a recommendation to the commission as soon as possible.

Clerk of Court Allison Toepke reported that District Court had been moving forward with a combination of in-person and Zoom court appearances.

Courthouses in some counties have again closed doors to the public. Sargent County Courthouse had been closed to the public earlier in the year when there were no cases in the county, but now remains open with seven active cases.

Each department head has been given the authority to take precautions that work best for their office to protect both employees and the public from COVID-19.

Sargent County District Health Administrator Brenda Peterson said that while the explosion of cases in the state is cause for concern, testing among students returning to college has increased the number of cases. A number of large gatherings were also cited as a cause.

The ND Department of Health has devised a new Local Public Health Decision Making Protocol to Assist School Districts. It contains a flow chart to help identify what next steps to take in the event of a positive case identified at a school.

"For example, one or two classrooms could be closed but the building could remain open," Peterson said. "They are trying their best to keep kids in school, but safe."

The Dashboard on the ND Department

of Health website, health.nd.gov/diseases-conditions, monitors positive case numbers by county. One positive case in Sargent County is different than one case in Cass County because of the difference in population.

The County Transmissions Levels outlines the parameters using guidance for levels at 0-49 and 50+. Levels are determined using the 14 day positive rate per 10,000 people in the county. As of August 31, Sargent County is at 18. If that level goes to 50 plus, schools would not close but safety plans would likely change.

The District Health Unit does testing on Wednesdays at their office, but cautions the public that if they have symptoms, they should contact their care provider. Symptoms may not be from COVID-19. Care providers can often have test results in 24 hours.

The CARES Act reimbursement of \$133,000 has been received by the county.

Although the payroll of the Sheriff's Department was used to determine reimbursement levels to counties, the funds are deposited in the general fund to be used to offset expenses incurred by the county for public health and safety during COVID-19. This method was used to get funds to counties more quickly.

Commissioners will investigate whether and how much reimbursement should be paid to cities who contract with the county to provide policing services.

A portion of the funds will be used to update radios for the Sheriff's Department to be compatible with the Statewide Integrated Radio Network. The department needs three mobile radios and five portable radios.

Radios for other emergency services will also need to be updated.

Vanessa Bayger reported that the next Sargent County Fair has been scheduled

for July 22 -25, 2021.

The Fair Board has voted to demolish the auditorium and will get quotes. The board will investigate salvaging the stadium seating, hardwood floors and other items. Bayger said that the board was questioning who would pay for the demolition as the auditorium is a county building.

The board is also seeking bids to replace the lighting in the exhibit building and will explore grants for funding. New sand has been placed in the outdoor arena.

The handicap accessible door to the courthouse is in need of replacement. Commissioner Lyle Bopp stated that the House of Glass had provided a quote of \$5900 for replacement. DRN and House of Glass will confer to make sure the security system and access system work together.

Peterson stated that County Health Nurse Joyce Chapin has resigned and she would like to offer the position to Brianna Spellberg. Commissioners approved and also approved hiring temporary LPN and RN services as needed during maternity leave of an employee using the state pay scale.

Road Supervisor Sparky Engquist said that graveling in the west side of the county would be complete this week. Crandall Construction is graveling County Road #14 near Dakota Micro. Mahrer Construction is behind schedule, but working on CR #5 east of Hwy 32 and near Silver Lake.

The box culvert in Taylor Township is scheduled for installation in mid-September.

Engquist would provide Pfau with a list of names to be contacted for easements for the mitigation project along CR 1. Damon DeVillers, county engineer, will determine the scope of the tile project.

Engquist was asked to provide a letter indicating the time line for his retirement.

Final 2021 budget hearing is scheduled for Oct. 6 at 6 p.m. Next meeting will be Sept. 16 at 9 a.m.

Seeding Rye and Winter Wheat

NDSU recommends seeding rye at 56-75 lbs per acre and winter wheat at 70-80 lbs per acre. The optimum planting date for the northern half of the state is September 1-15 and for the southern half it is September 15-30. Seeding earlier increases chances of disease and insect problems. Seeding later reduces chance of survival, generally delays maturity, and reduces yield potential. Grassy weeds and small grain volunteers should be controlled two weeks prior to planting winter wheat to avoid wheat streak mosaic virus, as we have struggled with it in Logan County in the past. This will break the "green bridge" that the wheat curl mite survives on, as the mite is responsible for transferring the virus. Planting adjacent to green corn fields should also be avoided with regard to wheat streak, as the mite can survive on corn.

Snow cover is necessary to protect dormant plants from winter kill and provide early spring moisture. Rye is more winter hardy than winter wheat. Several methods can be used to provide snow cover. Winter wheat can be no-till seeded directly into flax, barley, or other

standing crop residues left to catch the snow. Seeding into wheat or durum stubble will increase the risk of some diseases, but even this practice is often preferred to seeding into fields with no stubble. Grain stubble should be left at least 6 inches tall to obtain the minimum snow cover required.

Phosphorus aids overwinter survival by stimulating root growth and fall tillering. While important, the contribution of phosphorus to overwinter survival is secondary to varietal winter hardiness and soil temperatures at the growing point in the plant crown. Where soil tests results indicate phosphorus is low, a broadcast, drill row, or banded application of the needed rate is recommended. Phosphorus placed with or near the seed is most efficient. 20-30 lbs. of P2O5 applied at planting will increase winter survival and vigor. Excessive N prior to winter freeze-up, however, can reduce winter survival. Do not apply more than 10-15 lbs. nitrogen and potassium with seed alone or in combination.

In no-till operations, getting fertilizer into the soil is best done before or at plant-

ing. Urea can be applied in the spring with the hopes that a rain will bring it into the soil. Generally, fall verse spring applied N is about the same as far as response and efficiency is concerned; as long as there is not a lot of leaching to deal with.

Plant 1 to 1.5 inches deep. Seed about a million seeds per acre. This applies to both winter wheat and winter rye for grain. Generally, a seeding rate of 900,000 to 1.2 million viable seed per acre is adequate. The higher seeding rate may be appropriate if planting late or when planting into poor seedbeds. Since winter cereals tend to tiller more profusely than spring cereals, 1.2 million seeds per acre is the upper end of the recommended seeding rate. Excessively high seeding rates can result in more lodging by harvest time, particularly if you are using a taller variety. Lodging can certainly be a problem for rye.

And if that age may indeed change, what about your other plans for retirement? Will you now be free to travel more or pursue other hobbies? The Pixellot camera system through the National Federation of State High School Associations is available to livestream games. That video can then be viewed online via a subscription service by those unable to attend the events.

To access the system, log onto <https://www.nfhsnetwork.com>, then click on the "Subscribe" button. Through the website subscription service, an annual pass is \$69.99 or a monthly pass is \$10.99. A portion of the subscription fees goes toward the school. Events can then be viewed for each school at "Mott-Regent High School - Mott, ND" or "New England High School - New England, ND."

Athletes will receive passes to share with family members for away matches. To

move matches along at a quicker pace, teams may shorten the warmup times between matches. Region 7 matches will be three matches for JV and best of five for varsity.

Athletes will not shake hands, and will hold "touchless celebrations."

After the match, 10 minutes will be placed on the clock and fans must exit the gym within that time, with no congregating in the gym, hallway or lobby.

The Mott school does not have a credit card reader, so is asking for cash transactions, and that the exact amount be used.

"We're encouraging the exact amount. The less money our ticket taker can handle, the better off we are," Meier said. The fee is \$6 for

adults and \$4 for students.

In New England, concessions will not be served; however, vending machines will be available. Water fountains have been turned off, but bottle fillers are activated on the water fountains.

Ultimately, fans are responsible for their own well-being with social distancing.

Visiting fans are expected to follow the local guidelines of the host school. Every week, the directors will call competitors to get the school's guidelines for visiting teams.

Patrons may call the directors at each school if they have questions or require special accommodations.

Our Outdoors: In Good Standing

I've never been fond of heights. Despite being marketed (and statistically confirmed) as the safest way to travel, airplanes have always made me uneasy. Even the top of the Ferris wheel in the Fargo Scheels makes my stomach drop a little bit when my son and I reach the apex on the slow-moving trip to the second story. With lightning striking and rendering a trusted deer stand inoperable, what with its melted bolts and connection points, charred footpad from the point of impact and twisted legs that transferred the discharge into the ground, I began the process of shopping around and balancing my need for concealment in the treetops this coming season against my well-established acrophobia.

Of course, as with all good things, the lightweight telescopic aluminum model I had secured some time ago was no longer available for purchase, even in the deepest reaches of internet, as the business which built it had been acquired by another, which in turn discontinued the model. Perhaps the nicest thing about the electrified set of scrap resting alongside my garage was its adjustability from eight feet on up to 15 feet. It could be easily raised or lowered to match branches on a tree and came mostly assembled straight out of the box. But with all the interlocking holes showing the stress of 1.21

gigawatts, it was beyond saving. Thus, I was left to procure a standard ladder stand to replace it, and the options were endless and towering.

Everything on the store shelves seemed to be more or less the same - 15 feet this, 18.5 feet that - all of which were near the top of my comfort level for being suspended in space, even if tethered to the tree by a nylon strap and my safety harness, which I wear religiously under my early autumn camo and November blaze. Finding one with a folding seat and a removable shooting rail which would be unnecessary for the parcel I bow hunt, I spent a hot hour in the sun assembling the stand on my tailgate and slid the rungs into place to get an idea of how high it would be. It didn't look too bad.

Following a sweaty drag from the truck into the wooded north edge of the field where I had watched countless deer filter in and out over the past two seasons, I reassembled the ladder legs and placed the base of the stand against the lone boxelder tree that had managed to grow straight up along the slight dip which led to the nearby creek. Slowly, I lifted the stand into place and heard the seat crunch against the small branches above. I balked at the idea of climbing up and doing some saw work on them and noted that they would likely provide a good back drop to break up my silhouette if I only lowered the stand. Again

bracing the metal rungs and slowly walking the elevated perch back to the ground, I removed the lowest portion and raised it back into place. Falling perfectly in line with the first set of branches and leaves, I sighed a bit of relief as I knocked the climb down to 13 feet. With a quick insertion of the brace and the addition of a ratchet strap for stability, I climbed up and locked the teeth of the seat tight into the tree, secured the base and trimmed off two small branches for comfort and ease of draw.

In the end it was a fortuitous coming together of factors: a tree with perfect placement just off the edge of the main field providing a 20-yard shot to the travel corridor, a perfect backdrop to break up my form while on stand, and a vantage point that didn't make my nose bleed or my stomach flip on the climb up or down. With a solid canopy of branches providing a great screen with two good shooting lanes for deer coming into and leaving the field, I found even greater comfort in both the stand modification and its placement. While I know that height plays a big role in lifting scent away from the sensitive noses of deer and likely helps reduce the chances of them seeing an unintentional shift of a foot or the drawing back of a bow, comfort and safety on stand is perhaps the most important consideration of any hunt. With those items combined and the season start just a few weeks away, I loaded up the truck and headed home, finding myself in good standing once again...in our outdoors.

Weed cutting notice to all landowners or Operators that weeds must be cut

Notice is hereby given to all landowners or operators to cut all weeds and grasses adjoining their lands along those roads defined as roadways by the Township supervisors and the Hettinger County Board of Commissioners including weeds and grasses growing within the public right-of-way bordering such highways and their lands. Such cutting shall be completed by October 1, 2020. Cutting with a swather is not adequate, maximum stubble height of 4 inches and a minimum of 13 feet must be cut using a mower. If the weeds and grasses are not cut along county roads or is not cut adequately to prevent snow build-up, the county will mow the weeds and grasses and charge the adjacent landowner at a rate of \$150.00 per one-half mile. The county will begin cutting ditches on October 1, 2020

If the landowner fails to cut the weeds and grasses along township roads adjoining their lands, the township Board of Supervisors may cause such weeds and grasses to be cut and the actual cost shall be charged against the land of the landowner and shall become part of the taxes levied against the land in the ensuing year. Also if hay bales remain in the ditches of county roads after October 15, 2019 the county will remove the hay bales and the landowner may redeem them by paying the cost of removal. If not redeemed by November the hay will be sold to pay the cost of removal.

The Township Board of Supervisors do not need to advertise for weed cutting in their Township.

The following resolution was adopted: **RESOLUTION TO INCREASE THE EXISTING EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMUNICATIONS (9-1-1) FEE** WHEREAS, the emergency services communication (9-1-1) system is critical to public safety in Pierce County; and WHEREAS, the monthly 9-1-1 fee on "assessed communications service" (telephone access line, wireless access line, and unique voice over internet protocol service) imposed pursuant to the North Dakota Century Code (NDCC) 57-40.6 is essential to the operation and maintenance of the emergency services communications (9-1-1) system for Pierce County; and WHEREAS, NDCC Section 57-40.6-02(2) mandates a political subdivision shall apply an additional fifty cents fee on top of the local 9-1-1 fee established under North Dakota Century Code. Section 57-40.6-02 (01) to be remitted to the State Treasurer for implementation of the statewide interoperable radio network; and WHEREAS, the current Pierce County fee limited to \$1.00 per month per assessed communications service is no longer adequate to appropriately fund the operation and maintenance of the emergency services communications (9-1-1) system for Pierce County; and WHEREAS, NDCC Section 57-40.6-02 provides a process of imposing 9-1-1 fees by governing board resolution and approval of the voters of up to \$1.50 per month per assessed communications service. Pierce County Measure #1 Should the current emergency service communication (9-1-1) fee of \$1.00 per month per communication connection applied to all assessed communication services (telephone access line, wireless access line, and unique voice over internet protocol service) be increased to a maximum local (not to exceed) collection of \$1.50 per month per communication connection commencing on January 1, 2021, for the operation and maintenance of the emergency services communications (9-1-1) system for Pierce County? YES - A "YES" vote means you approve the increase of the local fee up to \$1.50 per month. NO - A "NO" vote means you do not approve the increase of the local fee and it would remain at \$1.00 per month. Josh Siegler, Pierce County Sheriff, met and gave the board a report for the month of July, for his department. 

Jokic, Nuggets advance with a Game 7 nail-biter

LAKE BUENA VISTA, Fla. — Nikola Jokic made the tie-breaking basket with 27 seconds left and the Denver Nuggets advanced to the second round of the playoffs by the slimmest of margins, beating the Utah Jazz 80-78 in Game 7 on Tuesday night when Mike Conley's 3-pointer spun out at the buzzer.

The Nuggets became the 12th team in NBA history to overcome a 3-1 deficit to win a series, but only after they blew a 19-point lead in this game.

After Jokic's basket, the Jazz got the ball to Donovan Mitchell following a timeout. The Nuggets stole it from him and raced down for a fast break, but Torrey Craig missed the layup. Utah rebounded and pushed the ball up the floor to Conley, whose jumper looked good all

the way until it fell out. Jokic had 30 points and 14 rebounds and Jamal Murray scored 17 points. No. 3 seed Denver advanced to face the second-seeded Los Angeles Clippers in the Western Conference semifinals. Donovan Mitchell scored 22 points and Rudy Gobert finished with 19 points and 18 rebounds after a huge second half for the Jazz.

CELTICS 102, RAPTORS 99: Jayson Tatum scored 34 points, and Marcus Smart made five 3-pointers in the fourth quarter as Boston beat Toronto in Game 2 of their Eastern Conference semifinal series, putting the reigning NBA champions in serious trouble. Smart scored 19 points, Kemba Walker hit 17 and

Jaylen Brown scored 16 for the Celtics, who now hold a 2-0 series lead. The Celtics are 3-0 against Toronto in the NBA's restart bubble at Walt Disney World, and 5-1 against the Raptors this season.

OG Anunoby had 20 points for Toronto, which got 19 from Fred VanVleet — who missed a 28-footer as time expired. Serge Ibaka and Pascal Siakam scored 17 points apiece and Kyle Lowry added 16 for Toronto.

The Raptors scored five straight to make it a 95-92 game with 3:35 left, and got within one on a pair of free throws by Lowry with 1:01 remaining.

But Walker hit a stepback on the next Boston possession, and the Celtics held on from there.

Fournette now a free agent

Grievance filed against former team

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP) — Running back Leonard Fournette is now a free agent.

Fournette went unclaimed after Jacksonville waived him Monday. Fournette's representatives responded by formally filing a grievance against the

Jaguars in an effort to recoup the \$4.17 million in base salary he was initially guaranteed for this season.

Jacksonville voided all remaining guarantees in Fournette's rookie deal late in 2018. The void only came into play because the Jags parted ways with the fourth overall pick in the 2017 draft.

The Jaguars took the unusual action following Fournette's one-game suspension for fighting with Buffalo linebacker Shaq Lawson in November 2018.

Then-Jaguars personnel chief Tom Coughlin publicly ripped Fournette weeks later for being "disrespectful" and "selfish" for sitting on the bench while injured and inactive during the season finale. Coughlin tried to fine Fournette an entire game check — around \$99,000 — for his actions that day, but it was eventually rescinded.

Behavioral Health Division's

The start of school and fall
activities can be stressful under

"Parents are making difficult
decisions relating to child care,
education and managing careers,"

The Behavioral Health Divi-
sion continues to develop new

N.D. Farmers and
Ranchers Should
Apply for
CFAP Support

Only 63% of North Dakota
farmers and ranchers have taken
advantage of the Coronavirus
Food Assistance Program (CFAP)
so far, and a North Dakota State
University Extension agricultural
economist encourages more to
apply.

"This U.S. Department of
Agriculture program supports
any farmer or rancher whose
operation has been impacted by
the coronavirus pandemic," says
Ron Haugen, NDSU Extension
farm management specialist. "The
CFAP provides direct relief to pro-
ducers who faced price declines
and additional marketing costs
due to COVID-19 -- and that's
nearly all North Dakota produc-
ers."

Recently, the application dead-
line was extended to Sept. 11, and
the commodities included was
expanded.

Contact your local Farm Service
Agency (FSA) office to apply or
apply online.

"It is very easy to apply online,"
Haugen says. "A calculator (an
Excel spreadsheet) is provided at
<https://www.farmers.gov/cfap>
to enter your numbers. The informa-
tion you need is your commodity
sales quantities, sales dates and
inventory. The calculator will do
the rest. It automatically puts
the information into the proper
FSA form, which can be printed
or scanned and sent to your local
FSA office. Payment is usually
received within two weeks."

Haugen says this program offers
payments to crop and livestock
producers. Most of North Dakota's
livestock producers have faced
additional costs in marketing their
inventories due to unexpected sur-
plus and disrupted markets. How-
ever, some livestock producers
may not have as much experience
dealing with FSA as crop produc-
ers. He encourages them to apply
because it is a simple process for
the inexperienced producer.

In addition to livestock, tradi-
tional (nonspecialty) and specialty
crops, wool, dairy, nursery crops,
aquaculture and eggs are included

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Walleye fingerlings ready for stocking. By NDGF

I grew up listening to Casey Kasem's Weekly Top 40 music countdown. It was a different era where musical success wasn't measured by downloads and clicks. Even to this day I can't say I really understood how his Top 40 was compiled, but I was hip to the long-distance dedications.

Listeners (maybe thousands?) would write the show and Kasem would read one on air and the dedication was granted. How he picked the song and when to play it was seemingly sort of science based on geography and popularity. He knew which one would draw in the listeners.

Hard to believe I can relate fish stocking in the state to a popular music radio show from three decades ago, but work with me. The North Dakota Game and Fish Department receives many requests for fish stocking on specific waters and preferred species. While Department fisheries personnel would love to make everyone happy, there are a number of management concerns that need to be addressed before simply stocking fish here or there.

Even so, this year a fish stocking record in North Dakota was broken as Department fisheries personnel stocked a record 180 lakes across the landscape with 12 million walleye fingerlings.

Jerry Weigel, Department fisheries production and development supervisor, said the number of lakes bested the previous high by nearly 30 waters.

"There is record water across the state, so timing of a near record walleye production could not have come at a better time," he said. "Valley City and Garrison Dam national fish hatcheries contributed to make this happen. Both hatcheries have been outstanding in helping address our demand for walleye fingerlings."

Garrison Dam National Fish Hatchery set a record for the most pounds shipped of these 1- to 1.5-inch fingerlings, with more than 8,400 total pounds. Given the record walleye production, coupled with a record number of lakes stocked, resulted in a lot of driving time for fish haulers.

"Just in the first seven days of

this year's walleye production, haulers traveled more than 8,200 miles and stocked over 150 lakes with 7.6 million fish," Weigel said.

Crews had near perfect conditions with most lakes at or near record water levels, with flooded vegetation for the young fish to hide and plenty of food for them to eat, which bodes well for future fishing opportunities.

"One of the biggest challenges this year was access to some lakes," Weigel said. "As a result of last fall's record rains, a lot of local roads in central and eastern North Dakota remained flooded and often closed, thus making navigating some roads more challenging."

Later this fall, fisheries personnel will sample walleye lakes to assess success of this year's walleye stocking, as well as what Mother Nature provided.

One common observation fish haulers noted while traveling across the state, Weigel said, was the high amount of fishing taking place, both from shore and from boats.

"It's a great time to fish for walleye," he said. "Statewide, there are a lot of opportunities, and a good chance of success. This is especially true if you live in rural North Dakota where a lot of varied fishing opportunities exist."

Hunters can HIP certify when purchasing a license at the North Dakota Game and Fish Department website, gf.nd.gov. In addition, hunters can call 888-634-4798.

Those who registered to hunt the spring light goose season in North Dakota do not have to register with HIP again, as it is required only once per year.

HIP registration is a cooperative program designed to determine a sample of hunters from which to measure the harvest of migratory birds for management purposes.

NOTICE to Sioux County Voters

The November 3, 2020 General Election in Sioux County will be "Vote-By-Mail". This means that the primary means of voting will be by mail, and that only one polling location, the Sioux County Courthouse will be open on Election Day for in-person voting. Also, there will be early in-person voting which will be called "Super Saturday" for those who want to come into the Courthouse to vote early and it will be held on October 31st, 2020 from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Applications will be mailed out to all "active" & "inactive" voters in Sioux County and they will be mailed on September 14th, 2020. Persons who wish to vote may complete and sign the application, and return it to the Sioux County Auditor at the address listed above or DROP IN THE BALLOT BOX AT SIOUX COUNTY COURTHOUSE.

When the application is received in the Auditor's Office, receipt of the application will be logged into the Central Voter File, and the appropriate ballot will be mailed to the voter along with paid postage from the County to return the voted ballot to the Auditor. The voter may then vote their ballot in the privacy of their own home at their leisure. After marking the ballot, conceal the ballot by folding it & inserting it into the brown secrecy envelope or "sleeve" which you may then insert the secrecy envelope into the return envelope and seal. The voter will then need to fill out the voter's affidavit found on the back of the return envelope. Your signature on your affidavit will be compared to your signature on your ballot application. If signatures do not appear to match, the ballot could be rejected- however, not before an attempt will be made to contact the voter to provide opportunity to verify the authenticity of the signatures so it's important to provide a phone number you can be reached at. Absentee ballots will start going out on September 24th, 2020. If you checked the GENERAL or STATEWIDE election box on the absentee ballot application for the Primary Election you will automatically receive a ballot for the General Election. If you checked any of those boxes, YOU WILL NOT HAVE TO FILL OUT ANOTHER ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATION. You can call the Auditor or Auditor's Assistant to find out if you're already in the queue for a ballot going out for the General Election.

Ballots must be either mailed back (must be post-marked by the day before the Election Day – in this case, November 2, 2020, in order to be counted), or they may be hand-delivered to the Auditor's Office up until close of business at 5 p.m. (CT) on November 2nd. If a voter misses those deadlines, they may still vote in person until 7 p.m. on Election Day at the Sioux County Courthouse.

There will be one polling place open on Election Day from 9:00 am to 7:00 pm for those individuals who need or wish to vote in person on Election Day, or those who miss the mail-ballot return deadlines. If you miss the deadline and still want to vote, please bring the mail ballot with you to the polls and turn it in to the election workers, who will then change your record from a mail-ballot voter to an in-person voter. In order to accommodate possibly larger turnout at the single polling location, there will be a larger than normal election board appointed to handle those duties on Election Day at the Courthouse. There will also be a special election board set up to process the Vote-By-Mail ballots on November 2nd. Election workers will still be required to attend training, as they have in the past. SIOUX COUNTY IS CURRENTLY LOOKING FOR CLERKS TO WORK THE ELECTION POLLS ON OCTOBER 31ST AND NOVEMBER 3RD. IF YOU ARE INTERESTED PLEASE CONTACT CASSIE LeCOMPTE OR LUCY HARRISON AT THE SIOUX COUNTY COURTHOUSE.

The current ND Central Voter File for Sioux County Residents lists 3,201 people as "active" and "inactive" voters. An active voter is someone who has voted at least once in the last two election cycles (essentially, the last four years). An inactive voter is someone who has not voted in at least one election in the last 2 election cycles (essentially, the last four years). We would expect that there may be a high number of Sioux County residents who are not in the Central Voter File who may wish to vote. Anyone who does not receive an application may either request one from the Sioux County Auditor's Office (701-854-3481), or download the application form from the North Dakota Secretary of State's website. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a lot of states and counties in North Dakota have gone to Vote-By-Mail. Most of them have seen increases in voter turnout, and some of them have increased quite dramatically. Fire Danger Index for Fall Outdoor Activity

As hunting seasons and other fall outdoor activities get underway, the North Dakota Game and Fish Department reminds hunters, anglers and other enthusiasts to be aware of the daily fire danger index.

Recent high daytime temperatures, combined with typical dry, late-summer ground conditions, has caused an elevated fire danger index in some counties that will influence outdoor activities.

Hunters are urged to keep up with the daily rural fire danger index, issued by the National Weather Service, to alert the public to conditions that may be conducive to accidental starting or spread of fires.

In addition, county governments have the authority to adopt penalties for violations of county restrictions related to burning bans. These restrictions apply regardless of the daily fire danger index and remain in place until each county's commission rescinds the ban.

The fire danger index can

change daily depending on temperature, wind and precipitation forecasts. If the index reaches the extreme category, open burning is prohibited; off-road travel with a motorized vehicle is prohibited, except for people engaged in a trade, business or occupation where it is required; and smoking is restricted to inside of vehicles, hard surface areas, homes or in approved buildings.

Hunters Reminded Of Big Game Transport Rules

Big game hunters are reminded of requirements for transporting deer, elk and moose carcasses and carcass parts into and within North Dakota, as a precaution against the possible spread of chronic wasting disease.

Hunters are prohibited from transporting into or within North Dakota the whole carcass of deer, elk, moose or other members of the cervid family from states and provinces with documented occurrences of CWD in wild populations, or in captive cervids.

In addition, hunters harvesting a white-tailed deer or mule deer from deer hunting units 3A1, 3B1, 3F2, 4B and 4C, a moose from moose hunting units M10 and M11, or an elk from elk hunting units E2 and E6, cannot transport the whole carcass outside the unit. However, hunters can transport the whole carcass between adjoining CWD carcass restricted units.

North Dakota Game and Fish Department district game wardens will be enforcing all CWD transportation laws.

Hunters are encouraged to plan accordingly and be prepared to quarter a carcass, cape out an animal, or clean a skull in the field, or find a taxidermist or meat locker within the unit or state who can assist.

Game and Fish maintains several freezers throughout the region for submitting heads for CWD testing, beginning Sept. 1.

For questions about how to comply with this regulation, hunters should contact a district game warden or other department staff ahead of the planned hunt.

The following lower-risk portions of the carcass can be transported:

- Meat that has been boned out.
- Quarters or other portions of meat with no part of the spinal column or head attached.
- Meat that is cut and wrapped either commercially or privately.
- Hides with no heads attached.
- Skull plates with antlers attached with no hide or brain tissue present.
- Intact skulls with the hide, eyes, lower jaw and associated soft tissue removed, and no visible brain or spinal cord tissue present.
- Antlers with no meat or tissue attached.
- Upper canine teeth, also known as buglers, whistlers or ivories.
- Finished taxidermy heads.



Pembina Blood Drive

On Friday, August 28 Vitalant, one of the nation's oldest and largest nonprofit transfusion medicine organizations, conducted a blood drive in Pembina at Larry Wilwant Community Center. Vitalant supplies comprehensive transfusion medicine services and is the sole blood provider to nearly 1,000 hospitals in the U.S. and health care for patients in need across 40 states. All blood, platelet and plasma donations is tested for antibodies to COVID-19. A Vitalant spokesperson stated, "We are providing this test to help identify donors who could help COVID-19 patients by becoming future convalescent plasma donors. Antibodies are proteins within plasma that help fight off infections. Because antibodies are part of the body's immune response and not the virus itself, antibody testing cannot be used to diagnose current coronavirus infection."

The blood drive was organized by District 10 Dem-NPL Chairman Elsie Magnus. Elsie said "This was a successful blood drive in Pembina. We met our goal with two first-time donors added to the list of those who 'Give the Gift of Life'. Vitalant conducted the blood drive in their usual friendly and professional manner. The need for donors has increased during the pandemic, not only because of needed blood products, but also due to reluctance of donors to risk exposure. I also want to express thanks to Melissa Anderson and Charlie Hart for their assistance."

Mud on Roadway Policy

This policy refers to instances where farm or commercial activities from an owner, renter or contractor of land or property adjacent or near a county roadway that is maintained with public funds, deposits mud or other debris upon the roadway.

The objective is to minimize or remove deposits from the roadway that may constitute a road safety hazard for roadway users. In particular, mud is considered to be a danger to users of the roadway because it may lead to accidents. This can be accelerated in adverse weather conditions.

Owners, renters or contractors are responsible for the following:

1. Do everything possible to prevent mud or other debris from being deposited on the roadway.
2. Use "Mud on Roadway" or "Slippery Road" signs when necessary to inform the public of the hazard. Make sure signs are positioned to give maximum visibility and warning to other road users.
3. Clean the road as necessary during the day and at the end of the working day.
4. When asked by any law enforcement agency or by any highway department official to clean the roadway, the roadway shall be cleaned within two hours of being notified.
5. Labor, equipment and material costs associated with replacing any gravel in order to ensure the safety of all county residents and to restore the roadway to pre-harvest conditions. This will be done at the discretion of the Pembina County Highway Dept. and billed to the owner, renter, or contractor.

If the owner, renter, or contractor fails to follow this policy as set by the Pembina County Board of Commissioners, the Pembina County Highway Department may cause the mud or other debris to be removed and the cost of removing the mud or other debris, and/or the replacement of any gravel or other material, if necessary, shall be billed to the landowner, renter, or contractor. If the bill remains unpaid for two consecutive months, the bill will be certified to the County Auditor, and all of the expenses shall be charged against the land and shall become a part of the taxes to be levied against the land for the ensuing year and shall be collected in the same manner as other real estate taxes are collected.

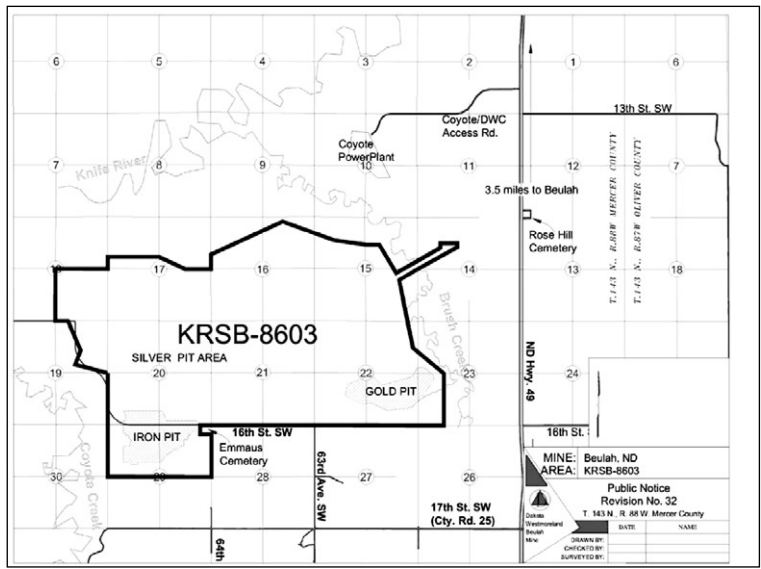

Eating also is important. One of the hardest parts about holding school at home for working parents is the near constant need to supply snacks and lunches, as well as an evening meal.

Make packing lunches and snacks a part of everyone's evening routine. This will save time, as well as reduce waste and arguments in the morning. If your children are learning at home, keep the same meal and snack schedule your students would have at school to keep the family from snacking out of boredom and the dishes from piling up in the sink.

Exercise needs to be part of our daily routine, too. Schedule breaks to move during the day. Teachers provide their students with brain boosts to keep the oxygen flowing. What can you do from home?

Walk around the block swinging your arms, march, skip - the possibilities are numerous. Have a dance party in the driveway, make up your own family cheer complete with actions,

2020 FALL WILD TURKEY HUNTING PROCLAMATION SUMMARY

The North Dakota Game & Fish Department announces the following summary of regulations and changes for the 2020 Fall Wild Turkey hunting season.

- Licenses will be issued by a weighted lottery procedure. Applications may be submitted online or by phone. Only residents may apply. The deadline for submitting online or phone applications is September 2, 2020.
- The season will run from October 10, 2020 through January 3, 2021.
- The bag limit will be one wild turkey of any sex or age per license.

Nuggets edge Jazz 80-78 to complete comeback from 3-1 down

LAKE BUENA VISTA, Fla. (AP) — Jamal Murray helped a heartbroken Donovan Mitchell off the floor for a handshake and hug, a show of respect between players who had a memorable battle in the bubble.

They traded historic offensive fireworks for six games, before Game 7 turned into an old-fashioned defensive struggle.

"It was a great battle. I don't know what else to say. I'm speechless," Murray said.

The ending left everyone out of words.

Nikola Jokic made the tiebreaking basket with 27 seconds left and the Nuggets advanced to the second round of the playoffs, beating the Utah Jazz 80-78 on Tuesday night when Mike Conley's 3-pointer spun out at the buzzer.

The Nuggets became the 12th team in NBA history to

overcome a 3-1 deficit to win a series, but only after they blew a 19-point lead in this game.

"A lot of teams would have just given in, especially when you consider we've been here 57 days away from our families," Nuggets coach Michael Malone said.

After Jokic's basket, the Jazz got the ball to Mitchell following a timeout. The Nuggets stole it from him and raced down for a fast break, but Torrey Craig missed the layup. Utah rebounded and pushed the ball up the floor to Conley, whose jumper looked good all the way until it fell out.

"It looked good, man. Sometimes, it's just the way it works," Mitchell said.

"We fought hard and came back. I'd go to war with any one of these guys in the locker room, any one of these coaches. We could've easy chalked it up in the first half.

We have grit and fight. That's all you can really ask for."

Jokic had 30 points and 14 rebounds and Murray scored 17 points. No. 3 seed Denver advanced to face the second-seeded Los Angeles Clippers in the Western Conference semifinals.

"Before the series started I felt it was going to be an interesting series. But after 3-1 I didn't think it was going to be this interesting," Jokic said. "So I'm glad that we won the game and I'm glad that we won the series."

Mitchell scored 22 points and Rudy Gobert finished with 19 points and 18 rebounds after a huge second half for the Jazz.

Murray shot only 7 for 21, far off his performances of the past three games. So the Nuggets turned more to Jokic, their All-Star center who tossed in a short hook shot in the lane after

the Jazz had tied it at 78.

"That's when you need Nikola to step up," Malone said.

Murray and Mitchell became the first pair of players to have two 50-point games in the same series, but the men in the middle were the biggest factors in this one.

After a quiet first half in which Mitchell was all the Jazz had going, Gobert began dominating the paint, keeping possessions alive on offense and stopping Denver drives on defense.

But the Nuggets prevailed in their third Game 7 in the last two years, having defeated San Antonio in the first round last year before getting knocked out by Portland. They played three more do-or-die games in the bubble to extend their stay.

Denver controlled the first half and had a 19-point lead a minute into the third quarter. Mitchell then scored nine straight

points before Conley hit a 3-pointer that cut it to 55-48. The Jazz got it all the way down to 65-60 after Gobert converted a three-point play for the final points of the period.

Utah then got the first eight of the fourth, the final six by Gobert, to open a 68-65 lead.

"What I remember about tonight, we were dead in the water in the first half and weren't playing well in a lot of ways," Utah coach Quin Snyder said. "Our group just kept grinding and kept competing. That to me is as significant as anything that happened in the game."

The Jazz won three straight games after Denver took the opener in overtime, and were poised to put away the series when they led by 15 points in the second half of Game 5.

But Murray, who had scored 50 points in Game 4, rallied the

Nuggets and finished with 42, then came back with 50 again in Game 6, a three-game total of 142 that had been topped in the playoffs by only Jerry West and Michael Jordan.

MITCHELL'S MESSAGE

Mitchell said the pain on his face was nothing compared to the families of people who have been victims of police brutality and racism.

"I can only imagine. I wanted to say that. I wanted to get that out there," he said. "The way I'm feeling right now is nothing compared to that."

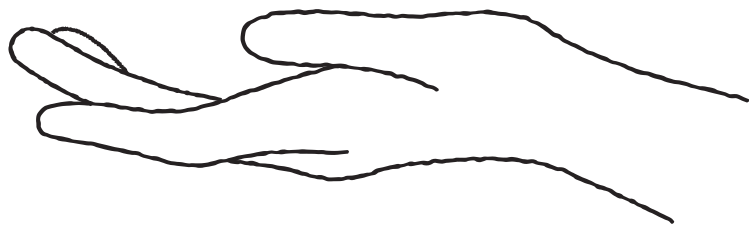

As reported recently in the InFORum by CS Hagen and Michelle Griffith, many ND public schools will not alert the public to COVID-19 cases within the school.

State Superintendent Kirsten Baesler has also noted that the manner of disclosing COVID-19 in schools must be done in a manner that protects the private health information of all individuals.

With non-identifying information about COVID-19's presence in schools released to the public by releasing only minimum information required for the particular case, such information made public would not violate and FERPA of HIPPA laws.

Baesler was quoted by the InFORum writers that the state is working to develop a plan to release statewide COVID-19 school data to the public regularly. No further details were noted.

There will be no mass testing for schools as the turnaround time for test results (up to three days) defeat the need for test accuracy.

Parents already have the rights and option to have their children tested at local testing events or through local health care.

Students and/or staff members testing positive for COVID-19 results would be sent to state and local health departments and an investigation would attempt to track how the illness was contracted.

McClusky School District President Heidi Strobel said that besides these procedures to protect individual health information, there is also a "point of contact" within each school to communicate needed class attendance and other information to the health departments.

This is the same procedure other schools are using.

BLOSSOM END ROT OF TOMATOES

Many people have asked about the tomatoes from their garden that appear to be rotten on one end of the plant. It may range from a small spot to rotting half the tomato. This is commonly known as blossom end rot.

Blossom end rot is a physiological condition which develops in tomatoes. Blossom end rot is actually caused by a deficiency of calcium. Fruits are most commonly affected when a third to half grown but can be attacked at any stage. The first signs of the disease is a water soaked spot near the blossom end of the fruit. This spot darkens and enlarges until it covers 1/2 the fruit. As it increases in size, the tissues shrink and the surface of the spot becomes dark and leathery.

So what can we do to prevent blossom end rot? Don't focus on the soil. Most soils in ND have plenty of calcium. Focus on watering. The uptake of calcium depends on the uptake of water. Irrigate regularly. Avoid the extremes of waterlogged soil and droughty soil. Mulch to maintain consistent levels of moisture in the soil. Cultivate shallowly. Don't damage the roots of your vines. We need these roots to absorb calcium. Avoid over fertilization, especially with ammonia and nitrogen fertilizers (ammonium nitrate and most complete fertilizers such as 10-10-10). Ammonium competes with calcium for uptake. Calcium nitrate is a better choice.

Vines should be green but not lush. Lush vines are more likely to suffer rot since actively growing leaves take calcium from the vine before the fruits get it. As a general rule, don't side dress a vine until after its first fruit is set. Pinch suckers. Calcium sprays might (or might not) help. Mix four tablespoons of calcium nitrate per gallon of water. Spray fruits, not leaves, two to three times a week. The key time is when tomatoes are dime-sized or smaller. Once a tomato fruit has the condition it will continue to develop on that fruit, but other fruits on the same plant may not be affected.

CLEAN GRAIN BINS TO PREVENT GRAIN INSECT INFESTATIONS

In the following article Janet J. Knodel, NDSU Extension Entomologist, points out a number of concerns regarding insects in stored grain. Now is the time to prepare your

storage and equipment to assure that you can avoid any costly insect infestations.

The key to preventing grain insect problems in grain bins is deep cleaning empty grain bins and trucks hauling new grain. Any old grain, or even dust residue, left in the bin is enough for some grain insects to survive and lead to new infestations, reducing the quality and salability of your new grain. Bins need to be super clean, completely empty, and free of insect-infested grain. Leftover grain should be removed from the bin, and the walls should be swept and vacuumed. All grain handling equipment, including augers, combines, trucks, and wagons, also need to be thoroughly cleaned and grain residues removed before harvest.

The area outside of the grain bins needs to be cleaned and treated. Remove weeds and vegetation, up to a 10 ft. border around empty grain bins. Treat the outside surfaces, especially cracks and ledges near doors and fans, to prevent insect pests from entering grain bins.

Once the cleaning and repairs are done, it's time to spray a residual bin spray, both inside and outside the grain bin. Some insecticide examples are Malathion, Tempo, Centryal EC, Diacon IGR Plus (insect growth regulator + adjuvant), or a combination of chemicals. They should be applied to bin surface areas two to three weeks before new grain is placed in the bin. The treatment will kill insects emerging from their hiding places (cracks, crevices, under floors, and in aeration systems). Also, insects crawling or flying in from the outside will be killed. Apply the spray to as many surfaces as possible, especially joints, seams, cracks, ledges and corners. Spray the ceiling, walls and floors to the point of runoff. Use a coarse spray at a pressure of more than 30 lb. per square inch and aim for the cracks and crevices.

Any grain that will be stored for long-term, more than 10 months, should have an insecticide protectant on it to maintain the commodities quality and protect your investment. Cooling the grain to < 50 degrees F will keep insects dormant, and temperature < 20 to 25 degrees F will kill insects. Please see the stored grains section of the 2020 North Dakota Field Crop Insect Management Guide for insecticides registered in stored grains.

"I hope every producer understands the importance of these data and will take the time to respond if they receive this survey. Producers can lose out when there are no data to determine accurate rates for loans, disaster payments, crop insurance price elections, and more. When enough producers do not respond to surveys, NASS is not able to publish data. Without data, agencies such as USDA's Risk Management Agency or Farm Service Agency do not have information on which to base the programs that serve those same producers."

You are encouraged to respond online at agcount.nsd.gov, or by mail. Alternatively, within the next few weeks NASS representatives will contact selected North Dakota growers to arrange telephone interviews to complete the survey.

NASS safeguards the privacy of all respondents and publishes only aggregate data, ensuring that no individual operation or producer can be identified, as required by federal law.

Ensure pre-harvest desiccant labels are followed

The North Dakota Department of Agriculture (NDDA) is reminding producers using herbicides for pre-harvest desiccation to check the label to ensure the product being used is labeled for desiccation of the crop it is being applied to. Pre-harvest desiccation refers to an herbicide application that dries the plant and leaves of a crop before harvest.

"While some products may be cheaper and provide the same level of desiccation, they cannot be used if the label does not allow it," Agriculture Commissioner Doug Goehring said. "Failure to use the correct product at the correct time may result in decreased yields, poor germination for seed crops, or the risk of having commodities rejected and potential liability for contamination."

It is a violation of state and federal law.

Flaxseed condition rated 2% very poor, 4% poor, 25% fair, 64% good, and 5% excellent. Flaxseed coloring was 93%, near 91% last year, and 94% average. Harvested was 10%.

Potato condition rated 3% very poor, 2% poor, 21% fair, 61% good, and 13% excellent. Potatoes rows closed was 95%, near 94% last year. Vines dry was 12%, equal to last year, and behind 18% average.

Dry edible bean condition rated 3% very poor, 6% poor, 27% fair, 49% good, and 15% excellent. Dry edible beans blooming was 95%. Setting pods was 88%, behind 97% last year. Dropping leaves was 21%, behind 34% last year, and well behind 43% average.

Alfalfa condition rated 4% very poor, 16% poor, 36% fair, 40% good, and 4% excellent. Alfalfa second cutting was 91%, ahead of 79% last year, and 86% average.

Lentils harvested was 38%, well ahead of 13% last year.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 4% very poor, 19% poor, 45% fair, 32% good, and 2% excellent.

Stock water supplies rated 5% very short, 24% short, 67% adequate, and 4% surplus.

Canola condition rated 1% very poor, 5% poor, 21% fair, 61% good, and 12% excellent. Canola coloring was 86%, behind 91% last year. Harvested was 14%, ahead of 9% last year, but behind 29% average.

Sugarbeet condition rated 1% very poor, 3% poor, 4% fair, 43% good, and 49% excellent. Sugarbeets harvested was 2%, near 3% both last year and average.

Oats condition rated 3% very poor, 7% poor, 30% fair, 57% good, and 3% excellent. Oats mature was 89%, ahead of 72% last year. Harvested was 48%, ahead of 34% last year, but well behind 70% average.

Barley condition rated 2% very poor, 7% poor, 29% fair, 57% good, and 5% excellent. Barley mature was 90%, near 87% last year. Harvested was 44%, ahead of 38% last year, but well behind 75% average.

Dry edible peas condition rated 1% very poor, 4% poor, 28% fair, 57% good, and 10% excellent. Dry edible peas dropping leaves was 95%. Harvested was 62%, near 66% last year and average.

NDSU research helps producers select IDC tolerant soybeans

New North Dakota State University research can help producers select soybean varieties that are more tolerant to iron-deficiency chlorosis (IDC).

During the summer of 2020, the researchers in NDSU's soybean breeding program tested 206 Enlist, LLGT27, Roundup Ready, and Xtend soybean varieties, as well as 33 conventional and Liberty Link varieties, for IDC tolerance.

The test results are based on replicated trials conducted at two locations with a past history of IDC. Visual ratings were made on a one to five scale.

IDC was prevalent in many soybean fields in eastern North Dakota and northwestern Minnesota during the 2020 growing season, according to Kandel.

This summer's tests showed significant differences among soybean varieties. For example, the average scores for the GMI group tested ranged from 1.6 (most tolerant) to 3.1 (the least tolerant variety).

Producers can utilize the NDSU data to select an appropriate IDC-tolerant soybean variety for a field with known IDC issues," Kandel says.

No soybean variety is immune to chlorosis, but differences in yellowing and subsequent plant stunting occur between the most tolerant and most susceptible varieties.

Plant leaves with IDC symptoms are yellow with green veins. Yellowing, browning, and stunting of the plants during the early vegetative stages will result in less photosynthesis in these plants, compared with healthy green plants, resulting in reduced soybean yields.

Besides evaluating IDC tolerance in soybean varieties, growers are encouraged to look at the genetic yield potential of soybean varieties. Varieties with similar IDC tolerance can vary greatly in their yield potential. NDSU conducts soybean variety yield evaluations throughout the state and results are reported on the NDSU variety trial website (<https://www.ag.ndsu.edu/varietytrials/soybean>).

BALE REMOVAL DEADLINE EXTENDED IN ND

North Dakota producers have been granted an extension to remove hay bales from CRP. The non-emergency and emergency hay removal deadline has been extended from August 31st, 2020 to October 1st, 2020.

For this year only (2020), the October 1st, 2020 deadline extension was granted to alleviate potential damage to CRP acreage caused by excess moisture received. Many fields are inaccessible and saturated with moisture from recent extreme precipitation events.

ONE-TIME PLC YIELD UPDATES - DEADLINE SEPTEMBER 30TH

Farm owners have a one-time opportunity to update PLC yields of covered commodities on the farm, regardless of Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) and Price Loss Coverage (PLC) program election. The deadline to request a PLC yield update is September 30th, 2020.

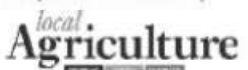
The updated yield will be equal to 90 percent of the average yield per planted acre in crop years 2013 to 2017 (excluding any year where the applicable covered commodity was not planted), subject to the ratio obtained by dividing the 2005 to 2012 average national yield by the 2013 to 2017 average national yield for the covered commodity. If the reported yield in any year is less than 75 percent of the 2013

to 2017 average county yield, then the yield will be substituted with 75 percent of the county average yield.

The chart below provides the ratio obtained by dividing the 2005 to 2012 average national yield by the 2013 to 2017 average national yield for each covered commodity:
