A **Public Hearing** on the application in Case No. PU-20-430 will be held remotely on March 22, 2021 at 8:00 AM CT.

**Public input** received by the Commission will be placed into the record for consideration. The Commission will receive testimony through the following methods:

- **Telephonic** – The public may provide input over the phone by calling 701-328-4081 to be placed on a list. On March 22, 2021 the Commission will call you back to receive your input at the end of the hearing in an order determined by the Administrative Law Judge.

On October 21, 2020, Bridger Pipeline LLC (Bridger) filed a combined application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and route permit concerning the location of an approximately 27 mile-long existing 8-inch crude oil gathering pipeline that will be converted to a transmission line, along with the construction of an approximately 2.4 mile-long 8-inch crude oil transmission line, which will comprise one pipeline. The pipeline will be located within McKenzie County, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map.

The issues in the application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and route permits are:

1. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facilities at the proposed locations produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facilities at the proposed locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
