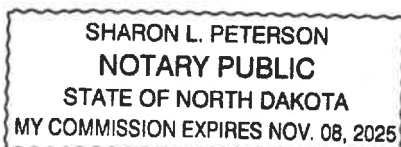

Preliminary Statement
On October 28, 2020, the Public Service Commission received the application for Revision No. 8 to Surface Coal Mining Permit BNCR-1101 from BNI Coal, Ltd. (BNI) for its Center Mine located southeast of Center, North Dakota in Oliver County. Revision No. 8 adds 2,661.04 acres to the existing permit in Sections 11, 14, 15, 16, 22, and 23, T14N, R84W, adds plans to mine the 320-acre federal coal tract located in the E1/2NE1/4, the S1/2SW1/4, and the SE1/4 of Section 14, T14N, R84W, and proposes to modify the postmining topography for 1,211 acres in the existing permit area. The revision updates nearly every section of the permit. The Commission received requests for an Informal Conference on the application from Brian Dresser on July 18, 2023, and David and Debra Berger on July 19, 2023, with concerns about coal mining operations being conducted within 500 feet of residences, and the lack of design plans in the permit for the haul road crossing 37th Avenue. NORTH DAKOTA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION REQUESTS BIDS FOR construction of a 7,650 square-foot pre-engineered steel equipment storage building and removal of existing equipment storage building at Center, ND. Sealed bids will be received by the North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) at the NDDOT Building located on the Capitol Grounds at 608 East Boulevard Avenue, Bismarck, North Dakota 58505-0700, until 10:00 A.M. Bids shall be sealed and endorsed "Sealed Bids for Equipment Storage Building, Center Section".

No bid may be read or considered if it does not fully comply with requirements of North Dakota Century Code Section 48. Any deficient bid submitted will be resealed and returned to the bidder immediately. Late bids will be returned unopened.

Bids shall be submitted on exact copies of the bid form provided in the bid package. Each bid shall be accompanied by a separate envelope containing the contractor's license and bid security, and this envelope shall be attached to the outside of the envelope containing the bid. The bid security must be in a sum equal to five percent of the full amount of the bid including alternates and must be in the form of a bidder's bond. A bidder's bond must be executed by the bidder as principal and

by a surety company authorized to do business in North Dakota, conditioned that if the principal's bid is accepted and the contract awarded to the principal, the principal, within 10 days after notice of the award, shall execute a contract in accordance with the terms of the bid and the bid bond as required by law and regulations of the NDDOT. If a successful bidder does not execute a contract within the 10 days allowed, the bidder's bond will be forfeited to the NDDOT.

Bidders must be licensed for the full amount of the bid including alternates as required by North Dakota Century Code Section 43-07-12. Such license must have been in effect at least 10 days prior to the date of the bid opening. NDDOT reserves the right to reject any and all bids.
