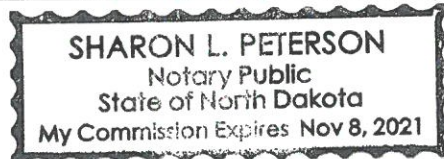

On March 14, 2018, in Case No. PU-17-97, the Commission issued to Cenex Pipeline, LLC (Cenex), Certificate of Corridor Compatibility No. 202 and Route Permit No. 212 designating a corridor and a route for the construction, operation, and maintenance of 149.7 miles of 10-inch diameter pipeline for the transmission of refined petroleum products in Williams, Mountrail, and Ward Counties, North Dakota.

On November 17, 2020, Cenex filed with the Commission a consolidated application to amend the designated corridor and route in Williams County, Township 156, Range 98, Sections 35-36 where a segment of the pipeline was constructed outside the designated corridor.

Cenex also filed with the Commission an application to amend the designated route where constructed pipeline segments deviated from the designated route by twenty-one (21) feet or more but within the designated 200 foot corridor at:

- Williams County, Township 155N, Range 102W, Section 3
- Williams County, Township 156N, Range 96W, Section 34

On November 17, 2020, Cenex filed with the Commission a request to waive or reduce procedures requiring a hearing and instead proceed by virtue of a notice and opportunity for hearing procedure.

The issues in the application for waiver of procedures and time schedules are:

1. Are the proposed facilities of such length, design, location, or purpose that they will produce minimal adverse effects and that adherence to applicable procedures and time schedules may be waived?

2. Is it appropriate for the Commission to waive any procedures and time schedules as requested in the application?

The issues in the consolidated application for an amended certificate of corridor compatibility and an amended route permit are:

1. Will the location and operation of the proposed facility produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?

2. Is the proposed facility compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?

3. Will the proposed facility location minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

Comments and requests for hearing on the matters must be received by January 15, 2021. Persons or parties desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a hearing.

December 23, 2020 — Some Christmases take on a completely different meaning than others. It was like that a year ago today outside a Mandan hospital.

Jim Tescher, one of the state's greatest rodeo champs, was from Sentinel Butte, the middle child of 15 kids. He grew up during the depression, began his rodeo career at age 16 and went on to capture some of the nation's highest honors, including the 1955 steer wrestling title at Madison Square Garden.

In August 2003, 74-year-old Tescher had a four-wheeler accident that put him in a Mandan hospital. A broken neck left him partially paralyzed — a tough break for a very tough cowboy.

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horse gelding named Bonner. He was Jim's favorite horse; he had raised him from a colt and over the next 20 or so years, he came to depend on Bonner for his hardest ranch jobs. Bonnie had brought the horse in from Sentinel Butte to see his master.

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The weather dipped below zero as Tescher's friends and fellow cowboys carried his casket to his final resting place. As the people moved away, bronco champion Brad Gjermundson led Bonner to Jim's grave-side to say goodbye. The cedar casket was branded with Tescher's brands, and on top was a spray of Badlands cedar, prairie trimmings, Jim's worn boots, his spurs and a rope.

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
