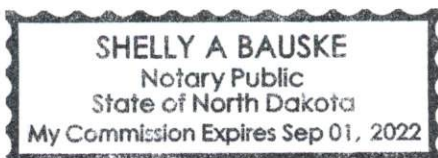

NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

February 3, 2021

On January 19, 2021, Otter Tail Power Company (Otter Tail) filed an application to change its Renewable Resource Cost Recovery (RRCR) rates. The new rates reflect projected costs through March 2022 related to investments in the Ashtabula and Langdon Wind Energy Facilities and the Merricourt Wind Energy Project. Otter Tail proposes to increase the RRCR from the current charge of 5.637 percent to 11.825 percent effective April 1, 2021. The effect of the rate change on the bill for a residential customer using 1000 kWh per month is an increase of \$4.24 per month.


The issues to consider in this proceeding are:

1. Whether the investments and associated costs for the resources qualify for recovery,
2. Whether the incurred costs are reasonable and prudent, and
3. Whether the rate adjustments are consistent with the terms of MDU's tariff.

Those interested are invited to comment on the application in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. **Comments and requests for hearing must be received by March 12, 2021.** If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a hearing.
