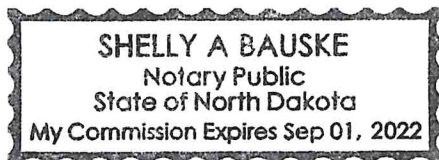


**A Public Hearing on the applications in Case No. PU-21-48 is scheduled for May 5, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. Central Time, at Teddy's Residential Suites, 113 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue SE, Watford City, ND 58854.**

On March 10, 2022, Bridger Pipeline LLC filed an amended combined application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and route permit concerning the location of approximately 80 miles of 16-inch crude oil pipeline in McKenzie and Golden Valley Counties, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map.


The issues in the application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and route permit are:

1. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facilities at the proposed locations produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facilities at the proposed locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
