

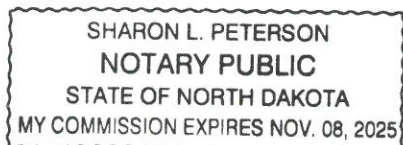

MARCH 1, 2022 9:00 A.M.

Chairman Paul J. Schmitz called the meeting to order. Commissioners Robert Schmeling and Adam Smith were present along with States Attorney Christina Wenko.

Commissioner Schmitz moved to accept the agenda as written and Commissioner Smith seconded. Motion carried.

Commissioner Schmeling moved to approve the February meeting minutes and Commissioner Smith seconded. Motion carried.

Commissioner Schmeling moved to approve the current vouchers for payment and Commissioner Smith seconded. Motion carried.

Current business brought forward to the Board:

Commissioner Schmeling moved to appoint Joanna Jenkins and Brooke Ford to the Golden Valley County Fair Board and Commissioner Schmitz seconded. Motion carried.

Discussion was held in regard to an invitation to participate as a cooperating agency in the NEPA process. County Auditor Sperry will request additional information from the Bureau of Land Management.

Commissioner Smith moved to set the starting salary of the newly elected treasurer after the 2022 Elections at a minimum of \$42,500 and Commissioner Schmeling seconded. Motion carried.

Commissioner Smith moved to enter into a funding agreement for the 2023-2025 biennium to receive reimbursement for providing clerk services and Commissioner Schmitz seconded. Motion carried.

Commissioner Schmeling moved to amend the revenue and expenditure road and bridge budget by \$842,633 to reflect the HB 1505 funds that were received and to create fund HB 1505 and to transfer \$842,633 from the Road and Bridge fund to HB 1505 as the funds were placed in the wrong fund and amend the HB 1505 revenue budget to reflect the transfer and Commissioner Smith seconded. Motion carried.

kota, with Commissioners Lawlar, Skarda, Brown, Hystad, and Wold present, and WHEREAS, testimony has been received and evidence examined in favor of the discontinuance of said roadways, on motion made by Commissioner Brown, seconded by Commissioner Wold, and a vote of 5 aye and 0 nay.

IT IS RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners for McKenzie County, North Dakota, that in the interest of the public and the parties involved granting the petition and hereby declaring the described section line roadways to be discontinued.

Yellowstone School District Superintendent Gackle requested financial support from the County for building projects within the school district. Gackle stated there are several areas that need to be addressed due to safety concerns, ADA compliance, and not meeting current code requirements. The project was discussed in three phases with Phase 1 as a needed kitchen upgrade, Phase 2 as the addition of classrooms, and Phase 3 as a new front entrance. Gackle stated the estimated cost of all three phases is \$6.5M. Gackle discussed the indebtedness limits for the district and the need for a vote of citizens within the district as even with an approved vote the district is not able to borrow the entire amount needed. The Board was in support of assisting with the project in all three phases. 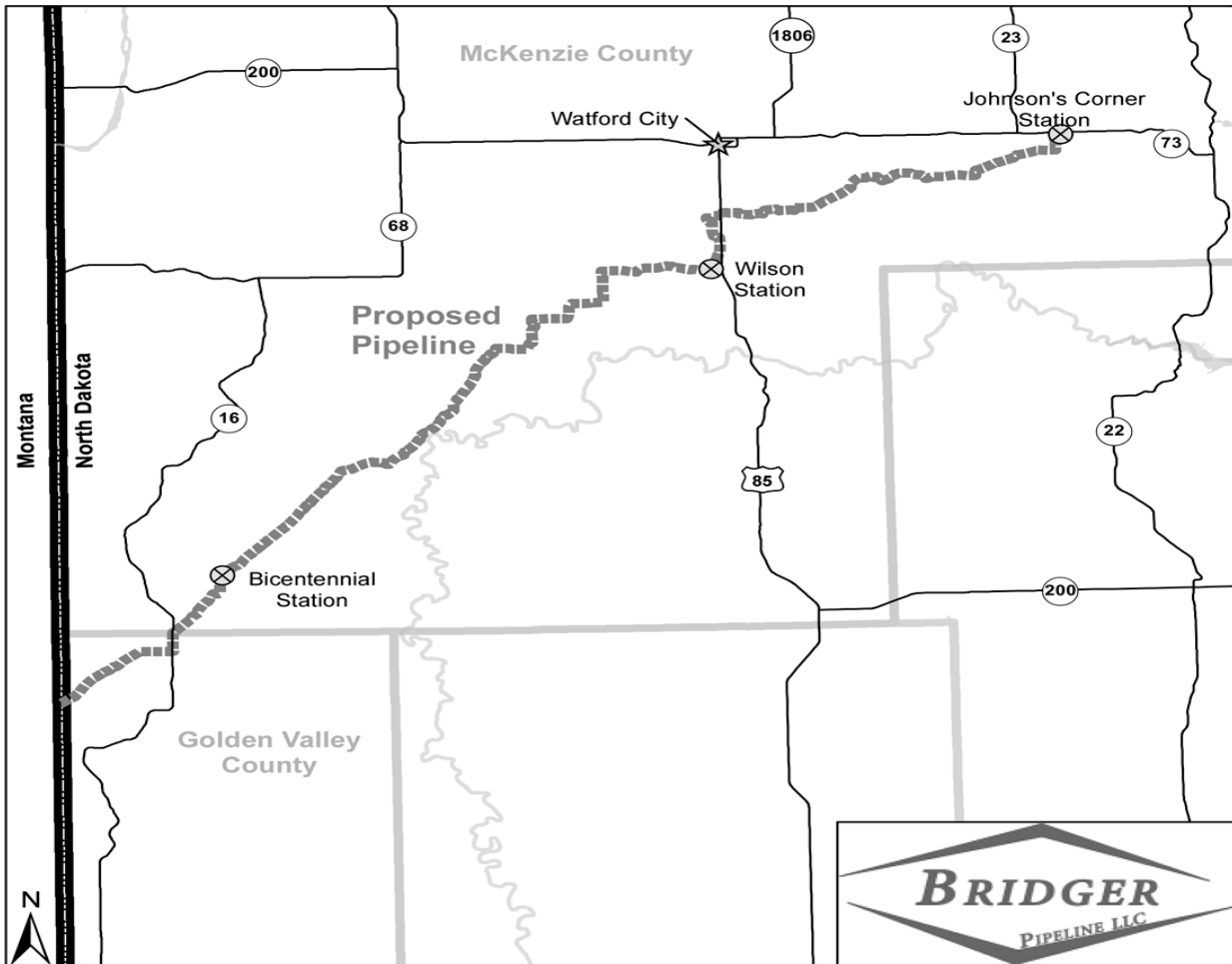
