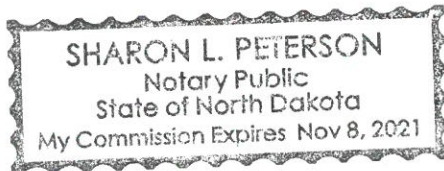

over others.

Section 230 gives media companies a LOT of power. For many people, social media is the modern "town square"—a public place where people can freely exchange ideas. Again, people disagree on whether media companies are banning users and deleting posts from users with certain political beliefs, but it is true that, under the current legal system, this type of censorship would be allowed. Internet companies wield an extraordinary amount of power, as it is only through them that many people can share their opinion with a wider group. Should powerful tech companies be able to moderate content with little outside oversight?

Internet companies do have some strong arguments against this, however. Repre-

sentatives of these companies have argued being forced to carry all speech, whether the company's executives wanted it to or not, would be compelled speech—that is, the government forcing the company to say something. A full repeal could also make it much harder for internet companies to moderate other speech, too, like defamation, without opening themselves up to legal action. They would have to carry potentially harmful speech, too, which, although legal, might cause real harm to the public. That includes speech advocating for the policies of Nazi Germany or in support of violent terrorism.

Ultimately, I think this whole issue is one of classification. It depends on whether you see websites like Facebook and YouTube as common carriers—that is, like telephone companies and cable companies that have no speech rights and are merely neutral carriers of information—or as private companies with speech rights. The latter would prevent any real moderation, even of dangerous pro-Nazi or pro-terrorist speech, and the former puts all the power in tech companies' hands.

There are pros and cons to both approaches, and there are middle-ground options. But it's clear that the issue of social media censorship doesn't have a clear right or wrong answer, no matter how many of us might want that.

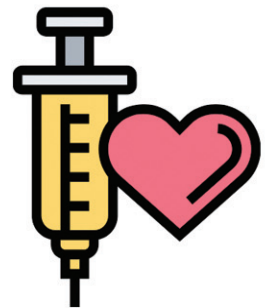
