Preliminary Statement

This Consent Agreement is entered into by and between JMAC Resources, Inc. (JMAC) and the Public Service Commission Advocacy Staff (Staff) (together, the “Parties”) for resolution of Docket No. PU-21-302.

On July 1, 2021, the Commission received a ND One-Call Complaint from Montana-Dakota Utilities Co. (MDU). The complaint alleged a violation by JMAC of North Dakota Century Code (NDCC) section 49-23-05(5) for failure to conduct its excavation in a careful and prudent manner.

On July 8, 2021, Commission staff issued a letter informing JMAC of MDU’s complaint filing and requested a response by July 22, 2021. JMAC’s July 16, 2021 response did not dispute the alleged failure to conduct the excavation in a careful and prudent manner.

On June 1, 2021, JMAC personnel provided an excavation notice to the North Dakota One Call Notification Center (NDOC), with work to begin on June 4, 2021. The

NDOC assigned locate ticket number 21053896 to the excavation notice, which indicates the work was demolition at 421 Airport Road, Williston, ND. The expiration date for the ticket was June 25, 2021.

On June 18, 2021, JMAC began an excavation as defined in NDCC section 49-23-01(7) while excavating for a sign base at the location cited in the excavation notice. As a result of this excavation, damage was caused to MDU's 1.25" plastic natural gas service line.

NDCC section 49-23-05(5) provides that to avoid damage and to minimize interference a ticket holder shall "Conduct the excavation in a careful and prudent manner".

Having investigated the alleged violation, Staff believes that JMAC violated NDCC section 49-23-05(5).

JMAC and Staff engaged in good faith settlement discussions resulting in this Consent Agreement. Having agreed that settlement of this proceeding will avoid further administrative proceedings or litigation and that entry of this Consent Agreement is the most appropriate means of resolving this administrative action, Staff and JMAC agree to the following, subject to the approval and acceptance of the Commission:

1. JMAC violated NDCC section 49-23-05(5) by failing to conduct its excavation in a careful and prudent manner.
2. JMAC agrees to be assessed a civil penalty of \$1,500. JMAC agrees to remit \$1,000 of the \$1,500, payable to the North Dakota Public Service Commission within ten business days of service of an Order accepting or approving the

Consent Agreement (Order). The remaining \$500 civil penalty is suspended on the condition that JMAC commits no further violation of NDCC section 49-23 within five years of the date of the Order

3. In the event the Commission finds JMAC violated the NDCC section 49-23 within five years of the date of the Order, JMAC shall remit the suspended portion of the penalty, within the time ordered by the Commission, in addition to any additional fines or penalties imposed for the subsequent violation.
4. If within five years of the date of the Order there is no subsequent violation of the NDCC section 49-23 by JMAC, the remaining \$500 penalty is withdrawn.
5. Staff agrees no other proceeding will be initiated and no other remedy or penalty will be sought based on the violation alleged in the Case.
6. JMAC consents to the filing of the Consent Agreement and an Order and hereby **waives any further procedural requirements with respect to the Order's issuance.** Provided the Public Service Commission adopts this Consent Agreement and issues an Order consistent with it, JMAC understands and agrees to waive all rights to contest the violation, the right to be represented by counsel, the right to present evidence and arguments to the Commission, the right to cross examine witnesses, or contest the validity of this Consent Agreement and Order, including all rights to administrative or judicial hearings or appeals.
7. There are no covenants, promises, undertakings, or understandings other than specifically set forth in this Consent Agreement and Order.

8. This agreement may be executed in counterparts and duplicate copies, each which shall be deemed to be an original, and which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same instrument.
9. The undersigned is authorized to act on behalf of JMAC and bind JMAC for purposes of this Consent Agreement and knows and fully understands the content and effect.
