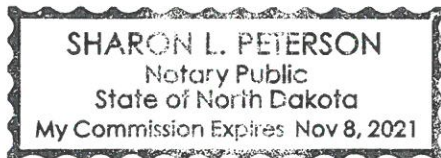

Minutes of the Board of Ward County Commissioners July 20, 2021

The regular meeting of the Ward County Commission was called to order by Chairman Fjeldahl at 9:00 AM with Commissioners, Anderson, Pietsch, Rostad, and Wepler present. Also present were department heads Dana Larsen, Emily Burkett, Jason Blowers, Kristin Kowalczyk, Leona Lochthowe, Marisa Haman, Noreen Barton, Robert Roed, Roza Larson, and Tammy Terras. Moved by Comm. Wepler, seconded by Comm. Rostad to approve the agenda. Roll call; all voted yes; motion carried. Moved by Comm. Anderson, seconded by Comm. Pietsch to approve the minutes from the Regular Commission Meeting on July 6, 2021, minutes from the Special Meeting on July 12, 2021, and minutes from the Ward County Board of Equalization June 1, 2021. Roll call; all voted yes; motion carried. Moved by Comm. Rostad, seconded by Comm. Wepler to approve the regular bills totaling \$459,827.01 and Human Service Zone direct cost bills totaling \$4,706.73. Roll call; all voted yes; motion carried. Sheriff Robert Roed presented Lieutenant Deputy Dale Clemens a 10 Years of Service Ward County Centennial Coin. Janet Mathstad appeared regarding refugees, immigrants, and sanctuary cities all being lumped together at the last Commission meeting. Ms. Mathstad came to clarify that refugees are legal when they come to the United States as they go through an approved government process. State's Attorney Roza Larson presented a Resolution of the Ward County Board of Commissioners for review. Travis Zaboltny of Minot spoke regarding the resolution and stated he would like there to be language in the Resolution defending our 2nd Amendment rights. He mentioned there are 1930 2nd Amendment sanctuary counties in the United States as of today, up from 1188 on March 1, 2021, which represents 61.3% of counties in the US. Moved by Comm. Anderson, seconded by Comm. Rostad to table discussion until the next Commission meeting. Roll call; all voted yes; motion carried. Ryan Ackerman, Administrator for Souris River Joint Board (SRJB), presented an

update on the Mouse River Enhanced Flood Protection Project. Some of the areas the SRJB are working on include flood control funding; flood control within the cities of Burlington and Minot; bridge replacements in Sawyer, Velva, and Mouse River Park, and reservoir management to include dam infrastructure. State's Attorney Roza Larson appeared to request approval to proceed with eminent domain as part of the Mouse River Enhanced Flood Protection Project. Approval has to come from Ward County Commissioners in order to send a letter out to the property owner to invite him to bring any information and speak before the Commissioners. There has not been an agreement reached between the SRJB and the property owner to date. Lynn Mesteth of Dwyer Law Office appeared stating negotiations had been ongoing since 2019. Numerous phone calls and letters were exchanged but has resulted in an impasse. Ms. Mesteth stated under NDCC 61-16.1, Ward County Commission approval is needed to move forward. All statutory requirements have been met and SRJB approval has been given to come before the Commission. Ryan Ackerman appeared to state this property remains to be acquired for this project as SRJB is looking to secure a ROW easement for the levy. Moved by Comm. Pietsch, seconded by Comm. Wepler to approve sending a letter to the landowner with a 30-day notice inviting him to appear before the commission on September 7, 2021 to present any information before moving forward with the process of eminent domain. Roll call; all voted yes; motion carried. Human Resource Director Tammy Terras appeared and held discussion on the Annual Leave Policy related to separations. Ward County is obligated to pay out annual leave. Ms. Terras is seeking to present language that will allow one lump sum on an employee's last check rather than extending annual leave and working possibly up to 6 weeks longer which costs the county additional health insurance premiums. Moved by Comm. Wepler, seconded by Comm. Anderson to allow Human Resource Department to present language to the Commission limiting the practice of drawing annual leave out. Roll call; all voted yes; motion carried. Moved by Comm. Rostad, seconded by Comm. Pietsch to approve the following payroll amendments: M. Kuske, Highway Department and B. McDonald, Highway Department. Roll call; all voted yes; motion carried. Auditor/Treasurer Marisa Haman appeared. Moved by Comm. Wepler, seconded by Comm. Rostad to receive and file the following correspondence: Letters from Division of Waste Management, NDSU North Central Research Extension Center, and Aux Sable Midstream. 2. Rainbow Garden: This stunning public garden is both an impressive floral feat as well as a great outdoor art gallery. 3. Crow Flies High Butte: This jaw dropping view can be found at Crow Flies High Butte looking over Lake

Sakakawea. Interestingly enough, this area used to be North Dakota's second national park. Today, it only has one, but if this lake didn't exist, it may still have two. Crow Flies High Butte is what is left of it and it is beautiful. Located just outside of New Town, ND.

4. Ronald Reagan Minuteman Missile Site: This unusual yet totally awesome attraction will take you a step back in time and deep underground. Within this heavily fortified underground bunker is the launch controls for missiles that might have saved us from nuclear threats during the Cold War. 5. Chateau Des Mores: This majestic mansion on a hill is the Chateau Des Mores, once the residence of the Marquis des Mores himself - the man who founded Medora, ND. It has been beautifully kept over all this time and has simply stunning views, and you can take a tour of it! It is like a time capsule. Located at 3448 Chateau Rd, Medora, ND 58645.

6. Dinosaurs on the Prairie: This unusual yet fascinating spot just outside of Napoleon is a testament to the history of the state. These "dinosaurs" are old threshing machines that used to be on nearly every farm in North Dakota. This collection of them goes up a ridgeline with a great final view and is well worth checking out for

yourself. Located off of Highway 34 near Napoleon, ND.

7. Fort Mandan: This historic site is open to the public to explore and is unlike any other fort in North Dakota. It feels like you're walking into a time machine back to the earliest days of settlers in this state. Fur traders, pioneers, and more passed through here. Located at 838 28th Ave SW, Washburn, ND 58577.

8. Fargo Air Museum: This is one of the coolest air museums ever. Whether you are an aviation enthusiast, history buff, or just a casual visitor, you can find enjoyment in checking this place out. They have planes from all eras of all sizes, many of which are still flyable - and they do fly them today. Located at 1609

FEMA Provides \$3.9 Million for North Dakota Mitigation Project

FEMA has awarded \$3.9 million to the State of North Dakota for a hazard mitigation project on the campus of the University of Mary in Bismarck. The project is designed to protect South Administrative Building and surrounding area against a potential landslide. This area is along a bluff threat-

ened by erosion from the Missouri River.

As part of the project, regrading of the slope will serve to divert water into valleys to control flow to the river. A retaining wall will also be constructed to hold back land around the building.

Funding was provided through FEMA's Pre-Disaster Mitigation

Grant Program, which is designed to assist states, U.S. territories, federally-recognized tribes, and local communities in implementing a sustained pre-disaster natural hazard mitigation program.

The goal is to reduce overall risk to the population and structures from future hazard events, while also reduc-

ing reliance on federal funding in future disasters.

The program has a maximum 75 percent federal cost share, with the remaining costs the responsibility of the state and the applicant.

youth also have the option of arranging for a mentor on their own.

“More than 110 young producers have taken advantage of the opportunity to learn about sheep, lamb and wool production in North Dakota with this program,” says Travis Hoffman, NDSU Extension sheep specialist. “Sheep prices are at record highs, so if feed is available, this is a phenomenal opportunity to get your start as a young sheep enthusiast by receiving 10 ewes with limited risk through a great loan program.”

The youth must pay back 70% of the value

of the ewes. The first payment is due by Nov. 1 of the second year the youth have the ewes. The youth have two more years to pay off the balance of the loan.

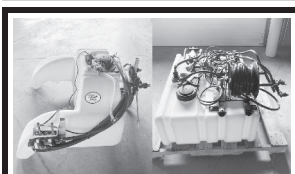

WHEREAS, a motion to adopt the proposed amendments, having been made and seconded, was submitted to a roll call vote of the elected members of the Board and passed by majority vote.

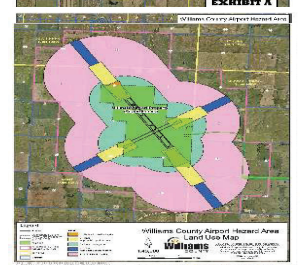

2. Appendix E is amended to replace the existing Airport Hazard Area Overlay Map and the existing Land Use Map with the revised Airport Hazard Area Overlay Map and the revised Land Use Map attached to this Ordinance.
3. These amendments to the Williams County Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision Regulations adopted on September 15, 2015, as amended, substantially complies with the Williams County Comprehensive Plan 2035, furthers the purpose and intent of the Williams County Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision Regulations adopted on September 15, 2015, as amended, and is designed to address the changing conditions caused by the annexation of certain portions of the Airport Hazard Area into the city corporate limits by the City of Williston.
4. This Ordinance and the amendments approved herein shall be immediately incorporated into the officially adopted text and appendices of the Williams County Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision Regulations adopted on September 15, 2015, as amended, and shall be effective the date of adoption on the 3rd day of August, 2021.

Doncic signs \$207M extension

Luka Doncic welcomed all his bosses with the Dallas Mavericks to his home country of Slovenia to watch the young superstar sign the richest contract in club history.

Now that the record rookie supermax extension of \$207 million is in the books, it’s back to the business of trying to win for a franchise that hasn’t advanced in the playoffs since winning its only championship 10 years ago.

“I’m proud of Luka,” owner Mark Cuban said Tuesday as he sat next to his point guard during a news conference in Doncic’s hometown, the Slovenian capital of Ljubljana.

“I’ve seen when he first came in, the pressure that was on him and the way he dealt with it, how hard he worked,” Cuban said. “How he recognized that it was always about the team winning and that was what was most important to him. That was always most important to me, whatever we could do to win.”

The Mavericks have the most important piece of their next title pursuit under contract through 2026-27, although that final season in a five-year deal that starts in 2022-23 is a player option.

Doncic was eligible for the massive payday because he made the All-NBA first team twice, in his second and third seasons. At 22, he is the youngest in league history with multiple first-team selections.

“I still kind of don’t know what to say because I never imagined this happening,” Doncic said. “I was only

dreaming of only playing in the NBA.”

New general manager Nico Harrison made the trip along with new coach Jason Kidd. Both were hired after the firing of longtime GM Donnie Nelson in June, followed a day later by the resignation of coach Rick Carlisle.

Agent Bill Duffy acknowledged Nelson’s role in targeting Doncic when he was a teenager playing for Real Madrid, and engineering the draft night trade in 2018 that sent Doncic, the third overall pick, to Dallas while Atlanta got No. 5 selection Trae Young.

Kidd, the point guard when another European star in Dirk Nowitzki led the Mavericks to the 2011 title, once again tried to explain his role in helping Doncic find postseason success for Dallas again.

“I think when you talk about Luka’s gift, he’s a special player,” Kidd said. “And for me, as a coach, it’s just to guide him. Be an extra set

of eyes and ears to make the game as simple and as easy for him on the court. To give him the answers to the test so that he can do what he does at a very high level.”

Doncic put his name in the company of LeBron James with an early penchant for triple-doubles, and now sits 11th on that all-time list. The two-time All-Star has averaged 33.5 points in the playoffs with six 40-point games in two postseasons.

Both playoff trips ended in the first round against the Los Angeles Clippers, and now Doncic is fresh off leading Slovenia to its first-ever Olympics in basketball and a fourth-place finish in Tokyo.

Kidd believes he can turn Doncic and Kristaps Porzingis into the European duo the Mavericks envisioned when getting the 7-foot-3 Latvian in a blockbuster deal with the New York Knicks. The Mavericks also just resigned a secondary piece in that trade, shooting guard Tim Hardaway Jr., to a \$75 million, four-year contract.

The Lakers believe they can take full advantage of both James and Westbrook, a pairing that seems potentially difficult. Westbrook famously is among the most ball-dominant players of his generation, while James has become an exceptional offensive initiator and point guard alongside his innumerable other skills.

Westbrook, who has several eponymous auto dealerships in the Los Angeles area, is ready to play a com-

plementary role to keep the Lakers on the road to a title.

“LeBron is one of the best players to play this game, and his ability to do everything on the floor allows me to just figure it out,” Westbrook said. “I’m coming to a championship-caliber team, and my job is to make his game easy for him, and I’ll find ways to do that. As it pertains to ball-handling, it really doesn’t matter. There’s many different ways you can impact the game without having the ball in your hands. I’ve been able to do that for a number of years, and we’ll figure it out.”

Westbrook’s confidence is echoed by coach Frank Vogel, whose recent contract extension underlines Pelinka’s faith in his ability to figure out how to win with this extremely talented, not-so-young roster. Along with Davis, Los Angeles will have three of the NBA’s top five active scoring leaders with James (first), Carmelo Anthony (second) and Westbrook (fifth).

“Anytime you have three great players like this, there is an element of sacrifice required, and we’ve all talked about that and are all-in on that,” Vogel said.

A quarterback is supposed to be a leader, someone who pulls the team together toward the common goal of a Super Bowl. Cousins is doing the opposite, and it has already cost the Vikings valuable practice time as he and two other quarterbacks were sidelined last week because of possible exposure to COVID.

It also had coach Mike Zimmer shaking his head over where the players are getting their information about vaccines.

“Some of the things they read are just ...” Zimmer said before pausing, “out there.”

That makes what Lane Kiffin and his staff have done in college even more impressive. Kiffin said last week his Mississippi football players are 100 percent vaccinated after an education program helped everybody buy-in — not just for the sake of their own health but the team’s success in a league where forfeits loom if a school can’t field a team.

“Nobody wants to be in a position to forfeit games,” Kiffin said.

This was supposed to be the time when sports

returned to normal after more than a year of missed games, empty stadiums and constant testing. But with the emergence of the Delta variant and the refusal of some players to get vaccines, COVID figures to again dominate the landscape of fall sports heading into winter.

It’s not just football players with their helmets in the sand. Just listen to Bryson DeChambeau, who already had a well-deserved reputation as a petulant and self-absorbed player even before he made some ignorant remarks about the vaccine last week.

“I’m young enough, I’d rather give it (the vaccine) to people who need it,” DeChambeau said. “I don’t need it. I’m a healthy, young individual that will continue to work on my health.”

Apparently DeChambeau has been so busy bulking up and trying to smash a golf ball 400 yards that he hasn’t been paying attention to the news. Had he been doing so, he would have figured out that young people are being hospitalized — and some are dying — despite being otherwise healthy before catching the virus.

And he surely would have known that anyone

in the United States who wants the vaccine can get it — and get it quickly.

And then there’s Washington State football coach Nick Rolovich, whose job is both to win games for his university and provide a role model for the young men in his program. Rolovich was banned from the Pac-12 media day because he refuses to get vaccinated and said the other day that he couldn’t say how many of his players have gotten the vaccine.

Odds makers figure the Cougars will win six games this season. The case could be made that the team never plays six games the entire season.

There are consequences for passing on the vaccine and getting COVID is, of course, the biggest one.

There are also consequences on the job. Around the country, companies, schools and government agencies are beginning to require vaccinations to remain employed. Soon vaccines will be necessary if you want to be in the armed forces.

Sports should be no different. For the good of their sports and their teammates athletes should face only one simple choice.

Get the shot or take the ball and go home.

Dakota. The team reached the NCAA quarterfinals two straight years when future U.S. Olympic stars Monique and Jocelyne Lamoureux were on the roster. Several other former North Dakota players participated in the Olympics.

Attorney Daniel Siegel, who represented the players in the original lawsuit,

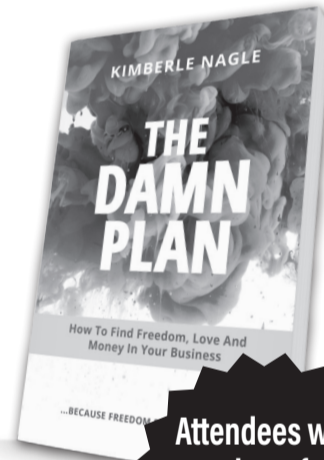
