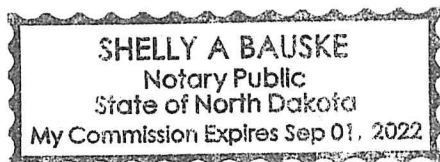


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NOTICE OF FILING AND PUBLIC HEARING

October 6, 2021

A Public Hearing on the applications in Case No. PU-21-353 is scheduled to begin **November 22, 2021 at 9:00 AM CT, at the Williston City Hall, 22 East Broadway, Williston, ND 58801.**

On July 30, 2021, Hiland Crude, LLC (Hiland) filed a combined application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and route permit concerning the location of approximately 2.9 miles of 8-inch crude oil transmission pipeline in Williams County, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map.

The issues in the application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and route permits are:

1. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facilities at the proposed locations produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facilities at the proposed locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
