

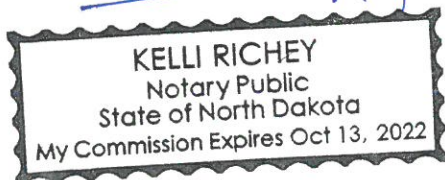

WENTZ JOINS COVID-19 LIST AS COLTS TRY TO EARN PLAYOFF SPOT

Indianapolis Colts quarterback Carson Wentz (2) throws a pass against the Arizona Cardinals. Wentz, who tested positive for COVID on Tuesday, has been placed into the NFL's COVID protocols and it is unclear whether the QB will be available for the Colts' game against Las Vegas on Sunday. While Wentz is unvaccinated, it is not clear yet as to whether he tested positive or was a close contact of someone who did. If he was a close contact only, Wentz's path to returning to action immediately is much clearer. If Wentz tested positive, he will have to proceed through the NFL's newly abbreviated COVID protocols to return to action. Sam Ehlinger would be the likely replacement for Wentz if he misses Sunday's game.

 Effective August 1, 2021, North Dakota Century Code section 49-06-02 requires that the Commission allow a public utility, in relation to facilities using lignite mined in North Dakota as its primary fuel, [t]o recover costs in rates, including a financial incentive set at a reasonable rate for power purchase agreements of a dispatchable on-demand generating unit, plant, or facility deemed to protect grid reliability."

The issues in the application for the financial incentive are:
 1. Whether the purchase agreements are for power from a new or existing facility utilizing lignite mined in this state as its primary fuel, and
 2. Whether the purchase agreements are for power from a dispatchable on-demand generating unit, plant, or facility, and
 3. Whether the purchase agreements are for power that will protect grid reliability, and if so,
 4. What is a reasonable rate for the financial incentive for the power purchase agreements, and
 5. Is it appropriate for the financial incentive to be included in the company's existing Generation Resource Recovery Rider – Rate 567?

Consensus Council Awards More Than \$200,000 in Grants

 Bismarck, ND – Consensus Council awarded \$214,633.73 in the final round of its 2021 Community Innovation grant program, a partnership with the Bush Foundation. Sixteen organizations within North Dakota and Native nations sharing the same geography received funding for projects ranging from developing Sharia-compliant lending to inclusion-based dance programs for people with disabilities, to creating a dictionary to preserve an endangered Dakota dialect.

“All of these projects prioritize collaboration and inclusion, demonstrating how partnerships and diversity make our communities stronger,” said Ann Crews Melton, Consensus Council Executive Director. “We celebrate the creative and instrumental systemic change these grants have enabled in our state over the past eight years.”

Community Innovation (CI) grants fund community-based problem-solving, enabling people to determine and develop solutions unique to issues impacting them, leading to more effective, equitable, and sustainable change. Non-profit organizations and government entities are eligible for CI grants up to \$15,000. At least 50% of the grants are awarded to projects seeking to actively reduce structural and/or systemic gaps in access, outcomes, opportunities or treatment based on race/ethnicity or economic standing.

Since 2014, Consensus Council has awarded up to \$400,000 annually in its CI grant program in partnership with the Bush Foundation.
