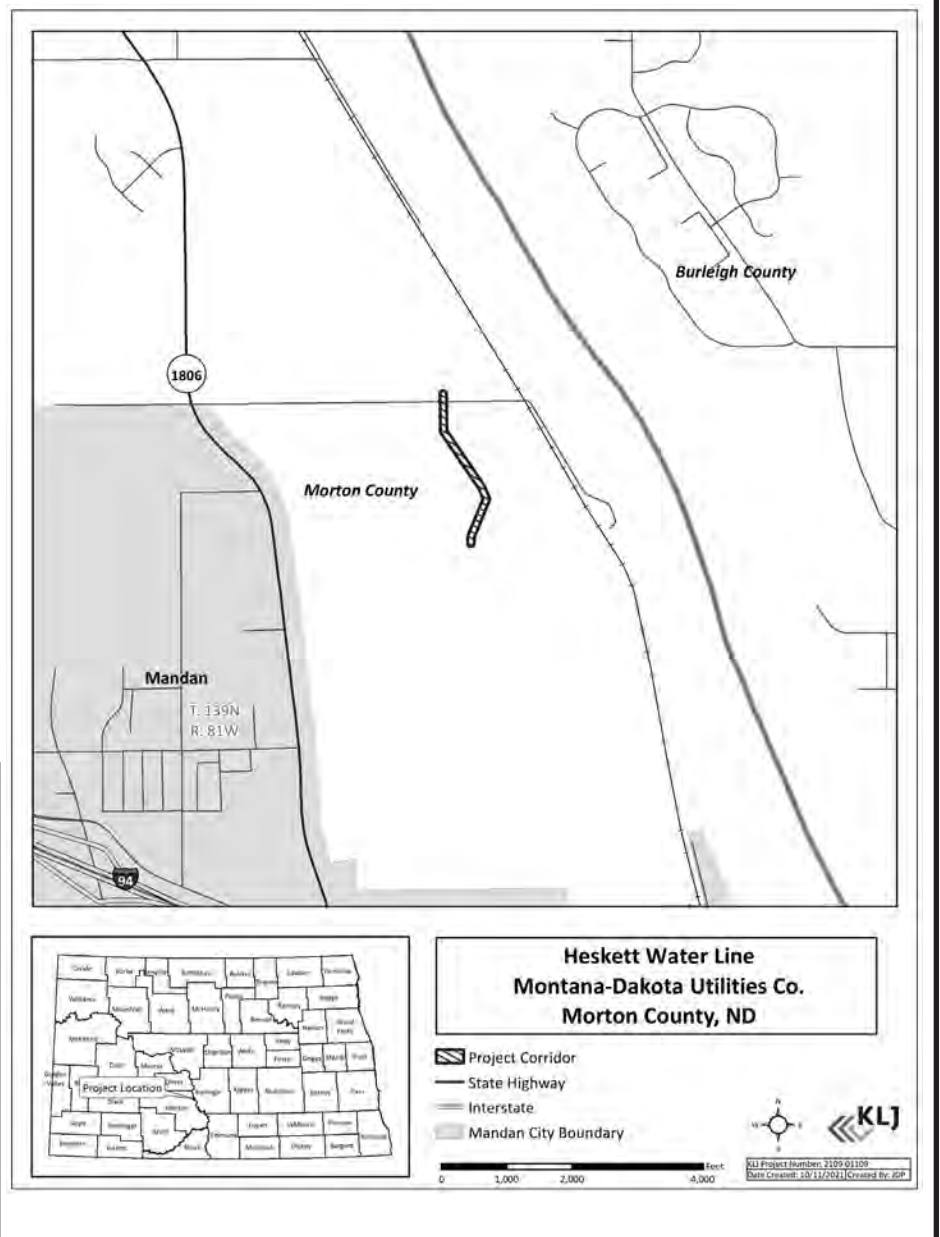
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?

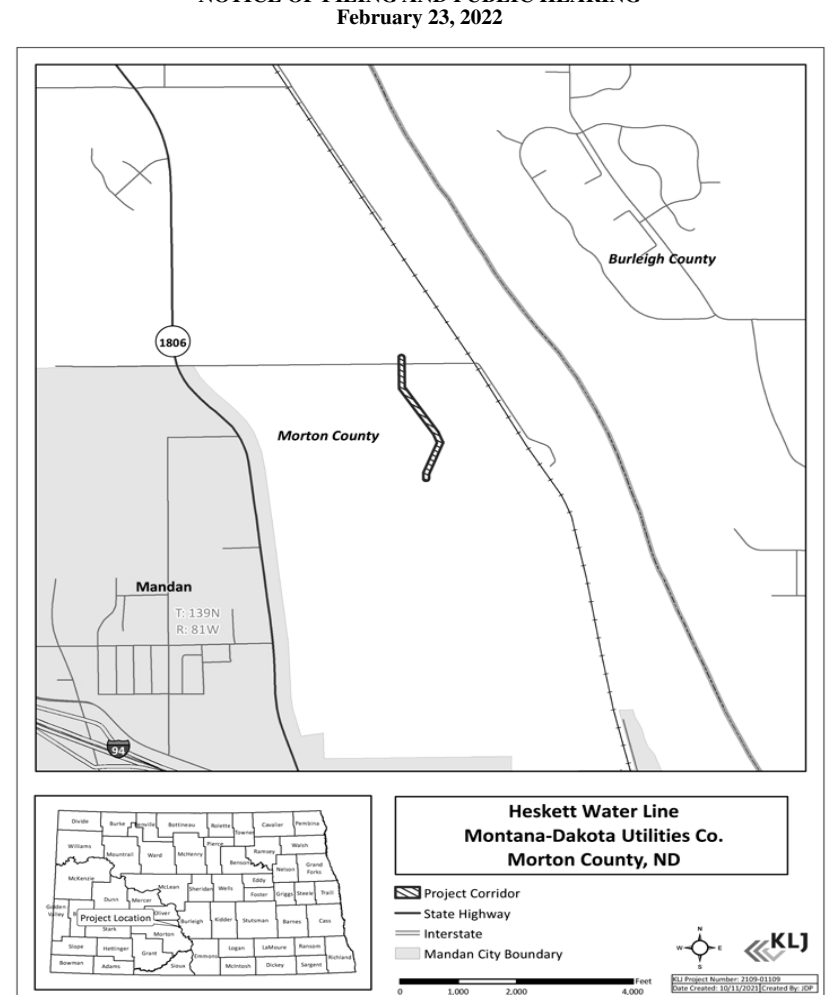
