Re: Badger Wind Project

Dear Ms. Martella:

Based on our prior conversations, the Red Lake Township Board of Supervisors (“Board”) understands that Badger Wind, LLC (“Badger Wind”) is proposing to develop a wind energy conversion facility and associated 230 kilovolt transmission line in McIntosh and Logan Counties, North Dakota (the “Project”), including in Red Lake Township. Badger Wind has asked the Board to provide this letter regarding Red Lake Township’s permitting requirements for the Project.

Red Lake Township has not enacted a zoning ordinance. As such, the Project does not need to obtain any zoning or land use permits from Red Lake Township.

Badger Wind has indicated it will enter into a road use agreement with Logan County regarding the use, improvement, and restoration of local roads in connection with Project construction. Red Lake Township intends to sign off on or otherwise ratify Badger Wind’s road use agreement with Logan County so that it also applies to the Red Lake Township roads (including section lines rights-of-way). The only permit that will be required from Red Lake Township is a Truck Permit (also known as an overweight/oversized load permit). No utility crossing or approach permits will be required from Red Lake Township.

It is also the Board’s understanding that Badger Wind will comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations when constructing and operating the Project, including but not limited to the North Dakota Public Service Commission’s permitting requirements and Logan County’s permitting requirements.
