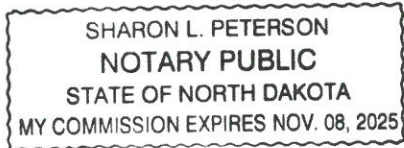

Bugbee: Advised the Commission Board and the Constituents of Tioga, that she would like to thank all the Street and Water Department staff that have been working hard on clearing all the snow in town and she would like to acknowledge all the people who have come out of their homes to help their neighbor or anyone in need. Tioga is a very giving community and there was so many people helping clear out snow, lending generators, giving food and diapers and gas. Moore Engineering: Reiner –Reiner advised Commission Board of status update for North East Reconstruction Project Phase 2 and handed exhibit to Commission Board of task order for Moore to oversee the project. Reiner is seeking approval contingent on Attorney's review. Christianson made a motion to approve task order from Moore Engineering for construction services contingent on the review of Tioga City Attorney Pendlay, second by Maize. Call: Ayes; Christianson, Travis, Steele, Maize. 3. Tioga Economic Development Update – Dennis Lindahl – Advised Commission Board on upcoming drone camp, Increased inflation, pilot program, finding skills trade, robot camp for kids, go for launch (Nasa Astronauts) asking for a \$50,000 grant sponsorship, and working on new survey for local consumer needs. **New Business:** 4. Tioga Equalization – Salinas advised Commission Board that the equalization was completed at an

earlier meeting. 5. Sharla Candelaria/GS Solutions –Candelaria advised Commission Board that she had complaints and it feels as if she is being singled out and the City is out to close her business. Discussions held, City Attorney Pendlay stated that no application has been received from her conditional use, before the Commission can make a decision the application has to be submitted and it has to go through the process. 6. Community Center Partition Storage Unit – Salinas handed exhibit to Commission Board for their review and consideration of estimate from Portable Church Industries for a partition storage unit in the amount of \$3,620.18. Tioga New Hope Church stated they are willing to donate half in the amount of \$1,810.09. Travis made a motion to approve the estimate from Portable Church Industries for a partition storage unit in the amount of \$3,620.18, second by Maize. to Commission Board for their review and consideration of payroll for 04-07-2022. 10. 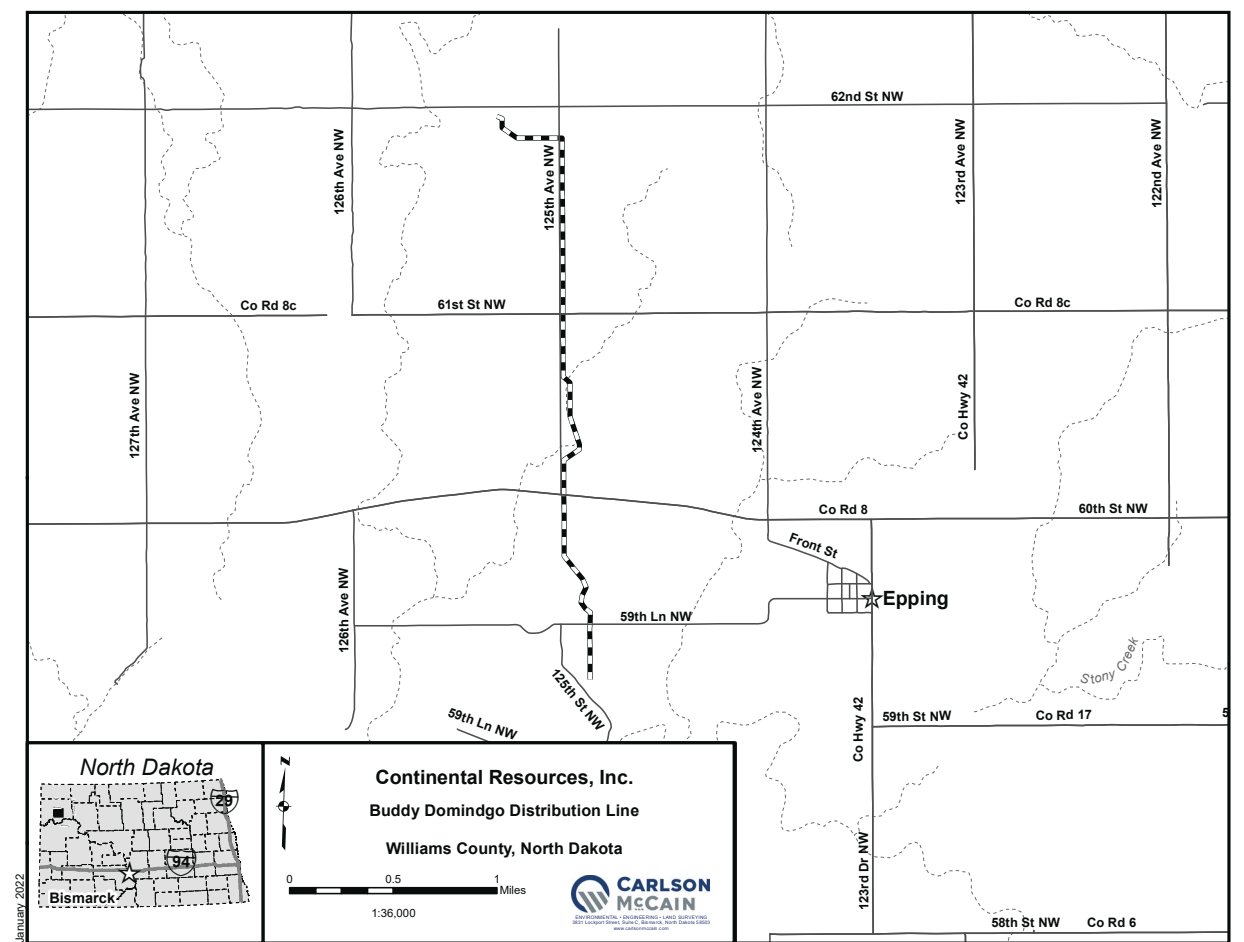

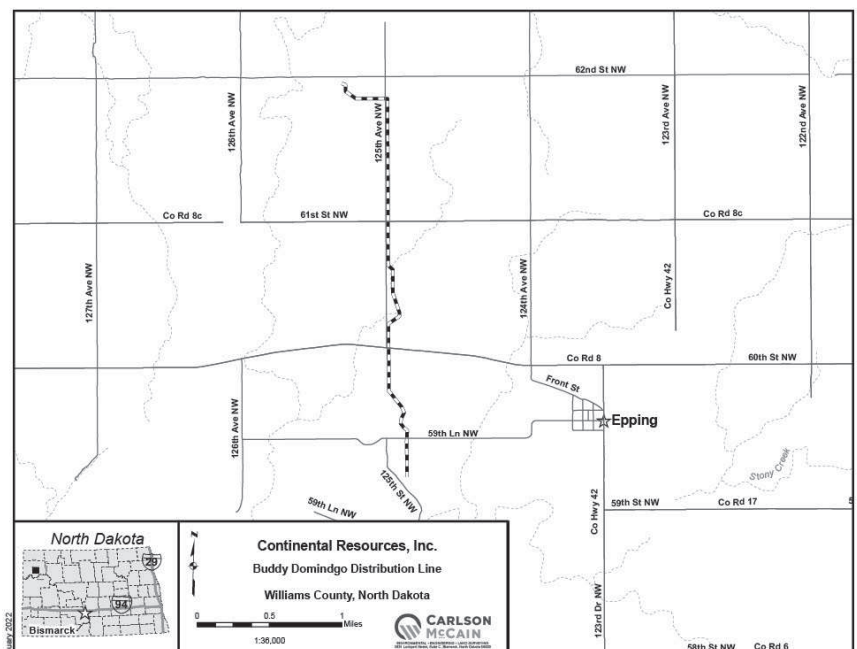
