ORDER ON PROTECTION OF INFORMATION

February 22, 2023

Preliminary Statement

On August 4, 2022, Northern States Power Company (NSP) filed an Application for Protection of Information to protect certain information in the captioned case.

On January 3, 2023, Staff reviewed the request of NSP for protection of information.

Discussion

The information for which the Company seeks protection includes cost information, as well as other commercial information and contract terms associated with the Company's proposed Competitive Response Rider.

The Company states that this information is commercial information because it is "information pertaining to buying and selling of goods and services that has not been previously publicly disclosed and that if the information were to be disclosed . . . would cause substantial competitive injury to the person from which the information was obtained," as provided in N.D.C.C. § 44-04-18.4(2)(a).

The Company further states that the cost information is trade secret because it is information that "(1) [d]erives independent economic value, actual or potential, from not being generally known to, and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by, other persons that can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use; and (2) [i]s the subject of efforts that are reasonable under the circumstances to maintain the secrecy of the information," as provided in N.D.C.C. § 44-04-18.4(2)(d). The Company further states that the information sought to be protected meets the definition of "trade secret" set forth in N.D.C.C. § 47-25.1-01(4).

The application further states that the information could have economic value to competitors, vendors, and/or counterparties, as it provides details on the Company's costs and how the Company may calculate the proposed competitive rates. If not protected, the information could provide an unfair advantage to competitors. Disclosure of this information could adversely affect prices for future material or services thereby increasing costs to the ultimate disadvantage of their customers.

The confidentiality of this information has been maintained by NSP. The information is not disclosed to the public or to persons other than employees or authorized agents who need to know the information to fulfill their responsibilities in connection with the Company's proposal, or to third persons pursuant to nondisclosure agreements to maintain the confidentiality of the information.

Staff believes that the application satisfies the requirements of the law, which allows the Commission to grant protection of information in this proceeding.

The Commission concludes NSP's application satisfies the requirements of the North Dakota Century Code for protection of the information, which is the subject of this request.

Order

The Commission orders the August 4, 2022, application of Northern States Power Company for protection of information is GRANTED.
