Application of SCS Carbon Transport LLC to Protect Information

Pursuant to North Dakota Administrative Code ("NDAC") § 69-02-09-01, SCS Carbon Transport LLC ("Summit") submits this application to protect from disclosure certain confidential information to be filed with the North Dakota Public Service Commission ("Commission") in the above-captioned matter. The purpose of this application for protection of information is to protect from public disclosure certain security system plans pursuant to North Dakota Century Code ("NDCC") § 44-04-24.

A security system plan includes "records, information, photographs, audio and visual presentations, schematic diagrams, surveys, recommendations, communications or consultations" relating to critical infrastructure if the plan or portion of the plan is in the possession of a public entity. *See* NDCC § 44-04-24(2)(b)(1). Critical infrastructure includes hazardous liquid pipeline systems. *See* NDCC § 44-04-24(2)(a).

In connection with its proposed interstate carbon dioxide pipeline system, Summit is required to develop an Emergency Response Plan ("ERP") and Integrity Management Plan ("IMP") in accordance with the requirements of the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration ("PHMSA"). *See* 49 C.F.R. §§ 195.402(e), 195.408 and 195.452. PHMSA

administers a national pipeline safety compliance oversight and enforcement program and is responsible for ensuring the safety of interstate carbon dioxide pipelines. *See* 49 U.S.C. § 60101 *et seq.* The ERP and IMP each qualify as "security system plans" under § 44-04-24 of the North Dakota Century Code because each contain confidential and sensitive information relating to Summit's proposed carbon dioxide pipeline (the "Pipeline") and potential threats to the Pipeline. The Pipeline meets the definition of "critical infrastructure" under § 44-04-24(2)(a) of the North Dakota Century Code.

In connection with the preparation of the ERP and IMP, Summit is required to conduct dispersion modeling relating to a release of carbon dioxide from the Pipeline (the "Dispersion Model"). Summit will submit the results of the Dispersion Model (the "Model Outputs") and the risk assessment associated therewith (the "Risk Assessment") to PHMSA as part of that agency's review of the adequacy and completeness of ERP, IMP and other programs that Summit is required to develop. Given the sensitive nature of the Model Outputs and Risk Assessment, Summit will request that PHMSA protect these materials from public release under the Agency's regulations for submission of confidential information. *See* 49 C.F.R. §§ 190.343 and 7.29.

As part of its submittal of the Model Outputs and Risk Assessment to PHMSA, Summit will seek protections for these materials, including under the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") and other authorities. Specifically, the Model Outputs and Risk Assessment qualify for protection under FOIA Exemptions 4 and 7(F). *See* 5 U.S.C. §§ 552(b)(4) and 552(b)(7)(F). Exemption 4 protects confidential commercial information that is customarily kept private. Exemption 7(F) protects information that could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual.

The Model Outputs and Risk Assessment are also subject to protection under a U.S. Department of Homeland Security ("DHS") program for protection of transportation-related Sensitive Security Information ("SSI"). *See* 49 C.F.R. Part 1520. When submitted to PHMSA, these materials would qualify as vulnerability assessments under DHS regulations that require confidential treatment and special handling. *See* 49 C.F.R. §§ 1520.5(b)(5) and 1520.9. Given the confidential commercial nature of the Model Outputs and Risk Assessment, and, more importantly, the utility of such materials to those who may wish to damage to pipeline facilities, ¹ Summit expects to receive federal protections against public release of these materials.

Although the Model Outputs and Risk Assessment must be protected from public release for the reasons described above, it should also be noted that Summit is required to use these materials to develop numerous safety programs intended to protect the public in the event of a release. These programs include the IMP and ERP noted above, as well as Summit's required Public Awareness Program. *See* 49 C.F.R. § 195.440.

The Commission has requested a copy of the Model Outputs and Risk Assessment. Summit has agreed to provide unreducted copies of the Model Outputs and Risk Assessment provided that such information is afforded the same confidentiality and protection it is given under federal law, discussed above.

Accordingly, Summit requests that protection be given to the unredacted Model Outputs and Risk Assessment attached hereto as Exhibit A and submitted to the Commission by Summit in this matter and any other information which may be submitted to the Commission which was

prepared in connection with or as a part of the ERP or IMP. Specifically, Summit requests that

the information be available only to the Administrative Law Judge, the Commission, the

Commission's counsel, and the Commission's siting analysts.

Furthermore, Summit respectfully requests that the Commission waive the requirement to

file redacted, public versions of the Model Outputs and Risk Assessment pursuant to NDAC § 69-

02-09-01. The filing of a redacted version of the Information is not possible due to the highly

confidential and sensitive nature of the information sought to be protected and the potential

negative consequences which may result from the public disclosure of any part or portion thereof.
