**Notes:** USFWS designated critical habitat for the Poweshiek skipperling occurs approximately 8.4 miles south of the Project in Richland County, North Dakota. Though critical habitat has been designated, the Poweshiek skipperling is considered extirpated from its historic range in North Dakota (Dyke et al 2015; USFWS 2021). Poweshiek skipperling habitat or occurrences were not identified within the 200-foot siting corridor; therefore, the species was removed from Table 5.5.1.
