This letter is in response to SCS Carbon Transport LLC's ("Summit") Response to Supplemental Filing Request 3.1.3 to the North Dakota Public Service Commission ("Commission") dated March 4, 2024 (PSC Doc. 452). The information provided in this Response is misleading.

As a beginning point, the original request from the Commission sought "[m]easures taken to address all landowners who testified regarding concerns during the hearings." Supplemental Filing 3.1.3 (emphasis added). Summit's letter suggests that it has addressed all of the Landowners who testified regarding concerns with the pipeline on their property. This would be an incorrect conclusion by the PSC.

I compared Judge Hogan's witness lists and my hearing notes to Summit's response. The following names are Landowner Intervenors who are listed on Judge Hogan's hearing sheets as having testified regarding their concerns with the proposed route and are still affected by the pipeline route based on our route comparisons:
