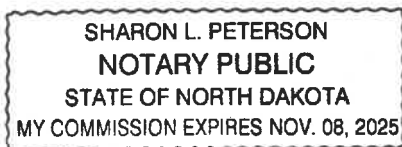

On April 8, 2015, in Case No. PU-14-689 the Commission adopted Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order issuing Certificate of Corridor Compatibility Number 164, and Route Permit Number 176, to Caliber Midstream Partners, L.P., for the construction, operation, and maintenance of approximately 4.4 miles of 6-inch natural gas liquids pipeline and associated facilities in McKenzie County, North Dakota. On April 29, 2015, the Commission amended its original Order and issued the First Amended Certificate of Corridor Compatibility Number 164, and First Amended Route Permit Number 176, to Caliber Midstream Partners, L.P.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

JORDAN KANNIANEN
DISTRICT 4 SENATOR

Hello to the people of District 4.

I greet you and hope you're well.

One issue that's been concerning commissions and residents of oil and gas producing counties is the requirement that counties levy 10 mills in their road and bridge fund to be eligible to receive their gross production tax disbursements from the state. Since the gross production tax is a tax "in lieu of" property tax (counties can't assess property taxes to oil and gas sites), it's frustrating that counties have to tax their citizens more to be eligible for these in lieu of payments. To address this, Senator Dale Patten sponsored, and I and others co-sponsored, SB 2162, which would strip this requirement. It recently passed the Senate unanimously and now goes to the House.

I introduced SB 2178 which increases the cap on township special road funds from \$100k to \$500k. With the increased costs for gravel road maintenance and construction, some townships have struggled to have sufficient funds on hand from year to year. Increasing the special road fund cap would allow township boards to save for larger projects and not be as restricted in their general fund levy authority.

Several bills related to income tax relief and property tax relief have been introduced in each chamber. The Finance and Tax committee is currently holding hearings for them and will weigh them all in the balance. We are looking forward to passing extensive tax relief – the question is what the final result will look like.
