NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING**

On April 30, 2018, in Case No. PU-17-483 the Commission adopted its Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order issuing Certificate of Corridor Compatibility Number 203, and Route Permit Number 213, to ONEOK Rockies Midstream, L.L.C., for the construction, operation and maintenance of approximately 45 miles of 12-inch diameter natural gas liquids pipeline and associated facilities in Williams and McKenzie Counties, North Dakota.

On January 3, 2023, ONEOK Rockies Midstream, L.L.C. (ONEOK) filed an application for amendment to Certificate of Corridor Compatibility Number 203 and Route Permit Number 213 for the construction of the 4-mile Cherry Creek Extension Pipeline Project (Project) originating at ONEOK's existing Lonesome Creek Gas Plant and terminating at the existing Antelope Creek pipeline junction in McKenzie County. The Project will be a 12-inch diameter natural gas liquids pipeline capable of delivering a maximum of 160,000 barrels per day with an initial anticipated increase of the flow rate from 50,000 to 70,000 barrels per day.

On January 12, 2023, ONEOK filed an application to waive the requirements to hold a separate hearing for the waiver application, waive any hearing requirements, and instead proceed by virtue of a notice of opportunity for hearing procedure.

The issues to be considered in the application for an amended certificate of corridor compatibility and an amended route permit are:

1. Will the location and operation of the proposed facility produce minimal adverse

effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?

2. Is the proposed facility compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?

3. Will the proposed facility location minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

The issues to be considered in the application for waiver of procedures and time schedules include:

1. Is the proposed facility of such length, design, location, or purpose that it will produce minimal adverse effects and that adherence to applicable procedures and time schedules may be waived?

2. Is it appropriate for the Commission to waive any procedures and time schedules as requested in the application?

Those interested are invited to comment on the application in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. Comments and requests for hearing must be received by March 24, 2023. If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a formal hearing.

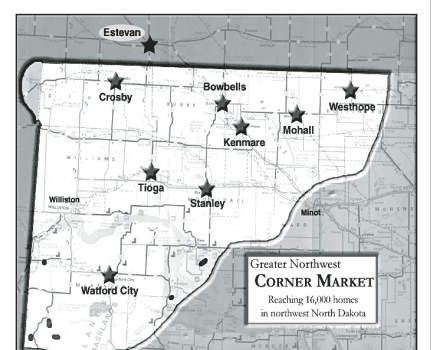

Council Member Sanford moved to approve the minutes of the city council meeting held January 4, 2023 as presented. Motion seconded by Council Member Renville and carried unanimously.

Sara Fitzpatrick gave an update on the Roughrider Center.
Chief Wellen gave an update on the police department.

Council Member Sanford moved to approve Resolution 2023-02 Resolution Destruction of Records. Motion seconded by Council Member Bulzomi and carried by the following roll call vote: ayes: Sanford, Devlin, Bulzomi, and Renville; nays: none.

Council Member Sanford moved to approve the recommendations from the Planning Commission meeting held January 30, 2023. Approved: Land Use Application - Zone Change submitted by City of Watford City (Little Bison Subdivision First and Second Addition). Motion seconded by Council Member Renville and carried by the following roll call vote: ayes: Renville, Sanford, Devlin, and Bulzomi; nays: none.

Council Member Sanford moved to approve the proposal from Mowbray & Son, Inc (Rough Rider Center Boiler Venting) in the amount not to exceed \$142,190. Motion seconded by Council Member Bulzomi and carried by the following roll call vote: ayes: Bulzomi, Sanford, Renville, and Devlin; nays: none.

Council Member Sanford moved to purchase a Foley AccuMaster 653 Reel Grinder and Foley AccuPro 573 Auto Bedknife Grinder from MTI Distributing totaling \$79,699.75. Motion seconded by Council Member Renville and carried by the following roll call vote: ayes: Renville, Sanford, Devlin, and Bulzomi; nays: none.

Council Member Sanford moved to approve a request for office furniture for the Economic Development Department in the amount of \$23,827.75 (city share \$15,645.55). Motion seconded by Council Member Bulzomi and carried by the following roll call vote: ayes: Sanford, Bulzomi, Devlin, and Renville; nays: none.

Council Member Bulzomi moved to approve the Roughrider Fund Business Startup and Expansion Grant application submitted by The Shed, LLC in the amount of \$20,000 to purchase signage and a dishwasher system. Approval is contingent on The Shed having a consultation with SBD and providing a W-9.
