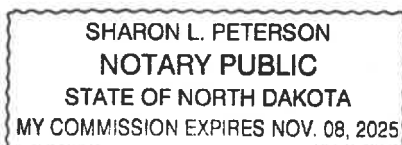

Honkers Lose-Out in Region 7 Baseball Tourney

vs Renville County, 11-5
May 20, KBBC took on Renville in round one of the Region 7 Tournament in Burlington.

A noon first pitch under sunny skies on a 90 degree afternoon. The Honkers were in their yellow warm weather jerseys and ready to get their first program win over the Muskrats.

Walker Braatan was on the hill for Renville and Carson Thingvold for Kenmare.

KBBC was first to bat and they scored 4 runs in their half of the first inning. Derrick Handeland got things started with a single to center and a stolen base. Trevor Kreklau sac bunted Handeland to third and Delaney Feldman hit a hard ground ball over the top of second base which scored the first run of the game. Web Lowry then walked. Cohen Seime followed with a single to right center scoring Feldman. Lowry stole third, Seime stole second, and then Peyton Nelson lined to center scoring both runners. An exciting start.

The Muskrats were not impressed. In their half of the first they scored three runs of their own with some help from a Kenmare outfield error.

Top of two saw Handeland smash a ball down the left field line for a double. Kreklau would again sac bunt him over to third, and Handeland scored on the next pitch as it got away from the Renville catcher.

Thingvold settled in the second and cruised through to the fifth, holding the Rats scoreless. Web Lowry relieved him and by that time the Kenmare offense was hammering the baseball. Some Renville pitching control problems coupled with well timed Honker hits made for six additional Kenmare runs.

Lowry had a comfortable cushion coming home. He gave up a run in the sixth but was tidy in the last.

A good start to the region tournament for KBBC, an 11-5 win. The Honkers plated 11 runs and left 10 runners on base! Lots of potential.
