On behalf of Oliver Wind IV, LLC and in response to questions received from Commission Staff, I am writing to provide additional information regarding the Oliver Wind IV, LLC (Oliver Wind IV) Tree and Shrub Mitigation Plan (the Plan), filed on April 28, 2025 and supplemented on May 2, 2025 in the above-referenced matters.

1. Status of Remaining Landowner Waivers

There are three remaining landowners that are designated as "opt out" in the Plan. Oliver Wind IV has obtained a written waiver from one of these landowners, which is attached to this submission, and is continuing to work with the remaining landowners to obtain written waivers.

2. Consultation Efforts Made with Landowners and the USDA-NRCS-North Dakota

Oliver Wind IV provides the following timeline of efforts to engage with the United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service for North Dakota (NRCS):

In February 2025, Oliver Wind IV's contractor, ECT, began performing initial work to prepare tree and shrub spacing and weed mat specifications. ECT confirmed the NRCS Field Office Technical Guide (FOTG) in early March 2025 to confirm species that could be planted in the area of the Oliver Wind IV Wind Energy Center and Transmission Line, based on the FOTG requirements and local soil types.

- ECT confirmed with its subcontractor, Prairie View, what species were available and how many of each species could be obtained on March 4, 2025.
- Beginning on March 13, 2025, ECT [and Oliver Wind IV] met with the Oliver County Soil Conservation District to discuss the proposed tree and shrub plantings.
- On March 14, 2025, ECT reached out to the Oliver County NRCS to request approval of the tree and shrub list to be presented to landowners. ECT modified the planned plantings based on recommendations from the Oliver County NRCS, and following these recommendations, further coordinated with Prairie View to confirm species availability in the area.
- On March 20, 2025, ECT provided a revised planting list to the Oliver County NRCS, once verification of availability was received from Prairie View, to procure additional plants.
- On March 25, 2025, Oliver County NRCS responded with additional questions, which ECT responded to on March 27, 2025.
- Following the receipt of this input from the Oliver County NRCS, ECT began reaching out to landowners on March 27, 2025. Initial contact with landowners included discussing tree and shrub removal that occurred on their property and inquiring whether they would like them to be replaced on a 2:1 basis at no cost to them. If landowners indicated that they wanted trees and shrubs replaced, ECT provided the landowner with a selection of approved NRCS trees and shrubs, based on soil types on their property. All NRCS-approved species were available for the landowners' selections. Landowners that opted in to have trees and shrubs replanted were able to choose the quantity and species to be planted on their properties.
- Based upon feedback from landowners regarding available species types and the desire expressed by landowners for additional evergreens, on April 11, 2025, ECT verified with Prairie View whether additional evergreens would be available for planting. Once Prairie View verified it could obtain additional evergreens, ECT confirmed to each landowner that opted in for tree and shrub planting the ability to select additional evergreens.
- ECT was generally communicating with landowners at least every 4-7 days at minimum between March 27 and April 22, 2025, and in some cases, communications with landowners were occurring daily during this period.
- Once landowners had made planting selections, ECT developed specific planting plans for each landowner, ensuring that landowners had the final say regarding the location of plants, spacing of plants, and spacing of rows. Maps of planting plans were sent to landowners for verification, and once ECT received final verification from the landowner, ECT finalized the planting plan for submittal to the Commission.
