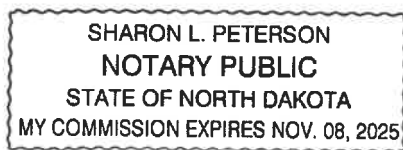

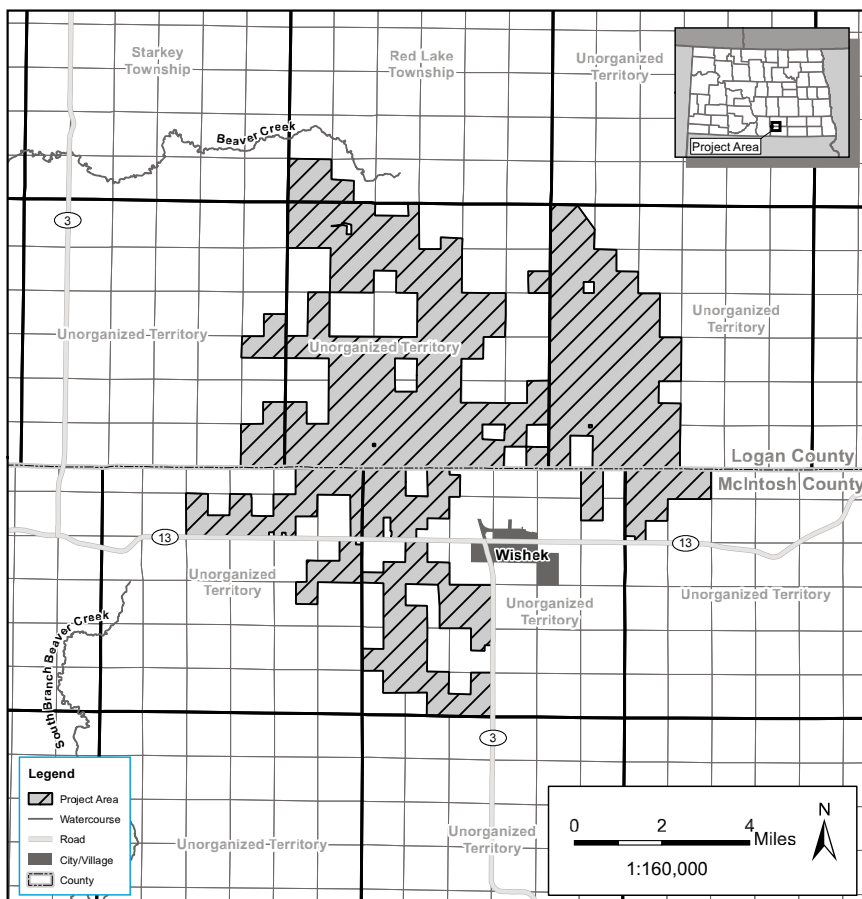

From the Files of the Ashley Tribune

June 5, 2014

- Rod Lee, representing Northern Border Pipeline presented a \$4,000.00 donation to the Zeeland Senior Citizens to help provide funding for senior citizen's meals in Zeeland and individual streets.

May 29, 1994

- The Ashley Chamber of Commerce, in conjunction with the Gold Star Saddle Club, will host Rodeo Days Saturday in Ashley.

- There is always risk and hazard in working with large-animal livestock. George Maher, extension safety specialist at North Dakota State University reports that since January of 1991, nine serious injuries involving large animal livestock have been reported in North Dakota. It is certain that more injuries are suffered and not reported. Three of the nine conflicts had fatal results. Types of livestock involved are beef and dairy cattle, horses, hogs, and occasionally sheep or goats.

June 6, 1974

- State Tax Commissioner Byron L. Dorgan reported this week that McIntosh County estate tax assessments for the fiscal year ending May 30, 1974, were \$9,085.84. This compares with assessments of \$5,295.85 for the previous period ending May 30, 1973. Of the total estate taxes collected, 65% is retained by the county and 35% is remitted to the state. The Game and Fish Department does not contemplate to moving of any fish from Coldwater Lake, according to Pershing Carlson, information chief of the department. Speculation in the McIntosh County area was that the department was planning such an action within the next few weeks.

- A review of tabulations of births and deaths recently prepared in the Division of Vital Statistics reveals that in 1973 McIntosh County had fewer resident births than deaths. The total population of the county based on the 1972 census is 5,545. Median age is 36.5 years

Flag Day is June 14

About a month ago, Tri-County News showed a Flag Disposal Ceremony being held by our local American Legion Post. This was performed by Legion Members to respectfully dispose of many American Flags that were no longer useable. The colors were faded, seams torn and generally were no longer capable of flying properly.

This ceremony is typically done on Flag Day, to respectfully dispose of flags and celebrate our United States Flag, but this year we wanted to deplete the large number of flags that had accrued through the past few years.

The American Legion will be performing a brief Flag Disposal Ceremony on the evening of the 4th of July Celebration in Gackle, at 8 PM on the infield of the Al Bye Memorial Baseball Diamond. Please bring a chair and watch, as we honor and dispose of remaining "out of service" flags.

What is Flag Day? Honestly, I don't recall ever celebrating it, but I always knew it was an important day because our Main Street was always adorned with flags flying on both sides, thanks to our local American Legion Post.

Today I thought we should all learn together. What is this Flag Day all about?

It seems that back on June 14th, 1777, the Second Continental Congress passed a resolution saying: "The flag of the thirteen United States will be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

Back in 1861, a gentleman named George Morris of Hartford, Connecticut, suggested June 14th be an occasion to honor the adoption of the American flag.



In the 1880's a grade schoolteacher named Bernard J. Cigrand, from Wisconsin, held the first recognized observation of Flag Day.

This idea continued to spread through Illinois, New York, Pennsylvania, and other Northeastern States.

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation declaring June 14th as Flag Day, but it wasn't until 1949 that National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress (signed by President Harry S. Truman). Please note the wording. Flag Day is not a federal holiday.

The week of June 14 (June 9th-15th, 2024) is designated as "National Flag Week". Please join us in celebrating our nation and our flag by displaying your American Flag.

By coincidence, the U.S. Army considers June 14, 1775 as its Birthday. To my fellow veterans who served in the U.S. Army, Happy Birthday!

If you have flags that are ready for disposal, please give them to any of our American Legion members. You can also call Jon Metz (701-630-2297) or Randy Entzminger (701-710-0900) for drop off. A new drop-off container is planned at the hall later this year.

If you need a quality 3' x 5' Flag, the American Legion in Gackle does have them for sale. They are quality polyester flags with embroidered stars, double stitched seams on the stripes and 4 rows of stitching on the outer edges, so they are pretty durable. Yes, they are made in the U.S. The cost per flag is \$30 each.

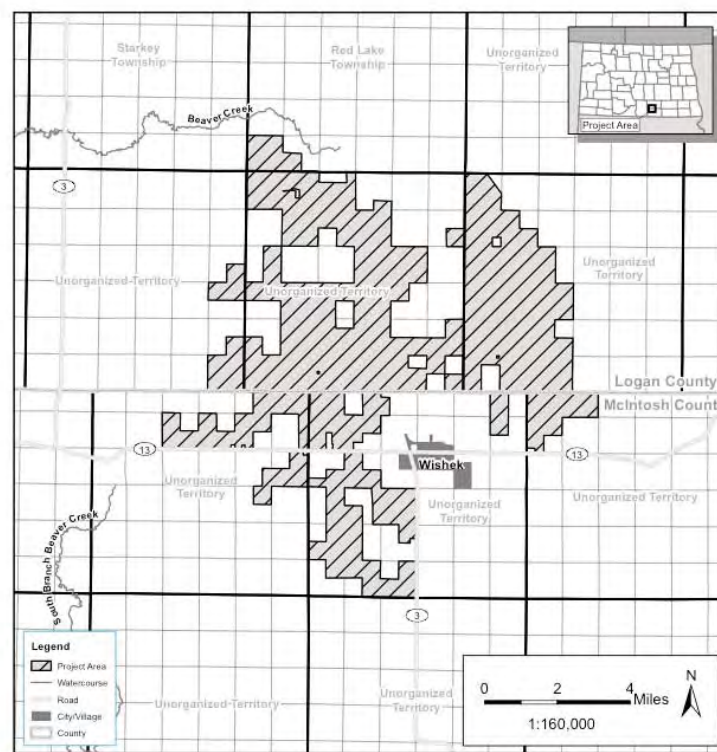

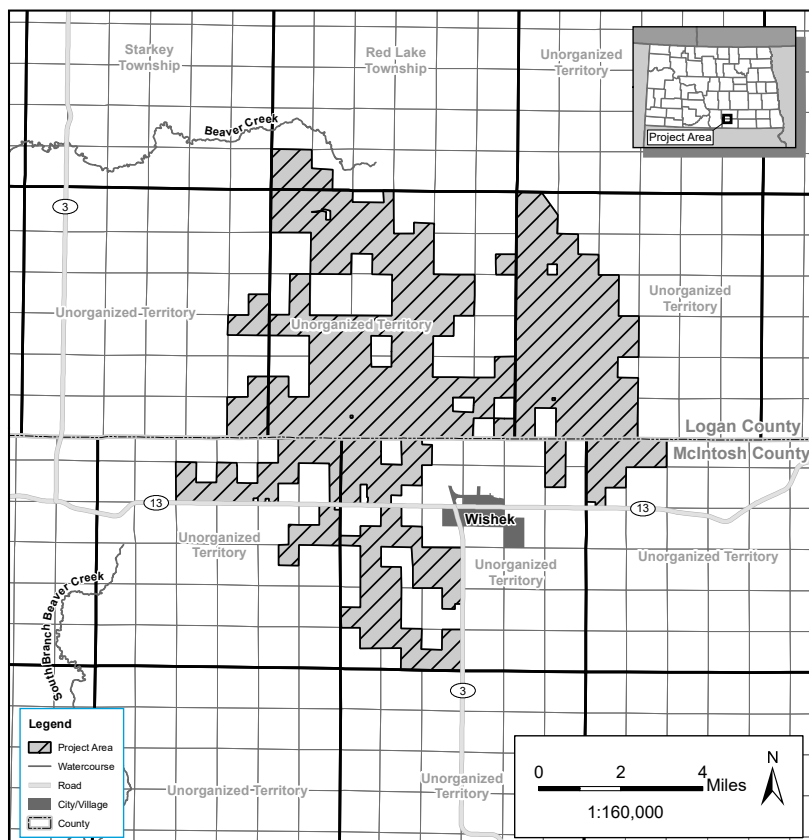

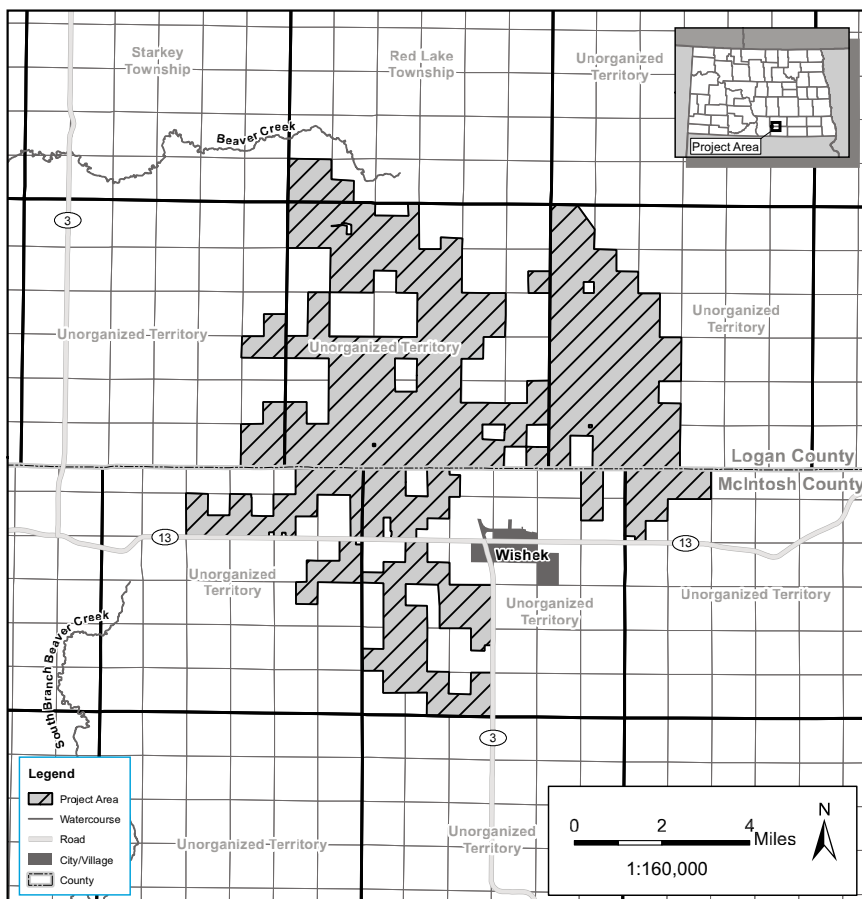
