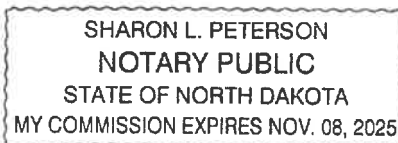

Grill safety primer

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), July is the peak month for grill fires. Surprisingly, the leading cause of fires is not proximity to the deck or home. It was due to a grill that needed to be cleaned. Use a brush that will not leave behind bristles because several emergency incidents have been reported where people ingest a bristle. Do not leave your grill unattended. Keep children and pets away from grills during operation. Do not place your grill directly under hanging branches, close to railings or close to other structures that could catch on fire. Nothing ruins a vacation or holiday like upset stomachs or bowels. Thaw foods in the refrigerator, not on the counter. Wash your hands before and after handling food. Do not reuse marinades. When grilling, bring a clean plate to serve the food. Cross-contamination can happen between raw and cooked food if the same plate used to transport the food to the grill is used as a serving plate. Cook to safe food temperatures. For quality, do not overcook items. The U.S. Department of Agriculture recommends 160 degrees Fahrenheit for ground beef and 165 degrees Fahrenheit for poultry. I grill using a meat thermometer rather than appearance. "It looked done" is not a safe cooking procedure. Keep hot food hot after cooking (140 degrees Fahrenheit or above) to prevent foodborne illnesses.

Here's a fun dessert that goes together in minutes. You can try it with various fruits, including apples, peaches, mixed berries or a customized mixture.

Grilled Fruit Crisp
Two tablespoons rolled oats
One tablespoon brown sugar

Two teaspoons butter
1 cup fruit, sliced or diced
Preheat grill or oven to 350 F. Combine oats, brown sugar and butter in a bowl until crumbly. Cut fruit and place on a 12-inch-by-12-inch foil sheet. Top with crumble mixture. Fold foil to create a packet, ensuring all sides are sealed. Grill for 15 minutes or until fruit is desired tenderness.

Each serving (with apple) has 90 calories, 4 g fat, 1 g protein, 13 g carbohydrates, 2 g fiber and 40 mg sodium.

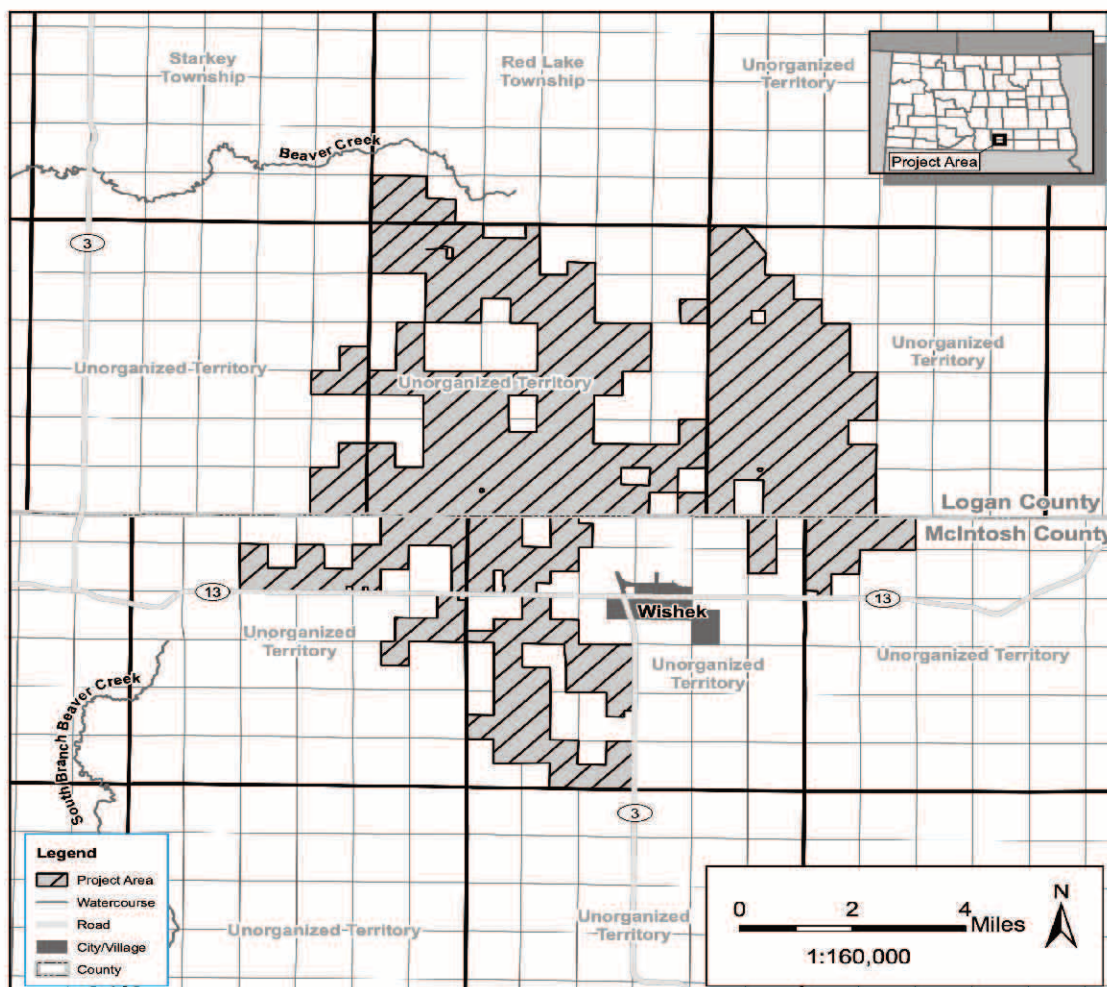

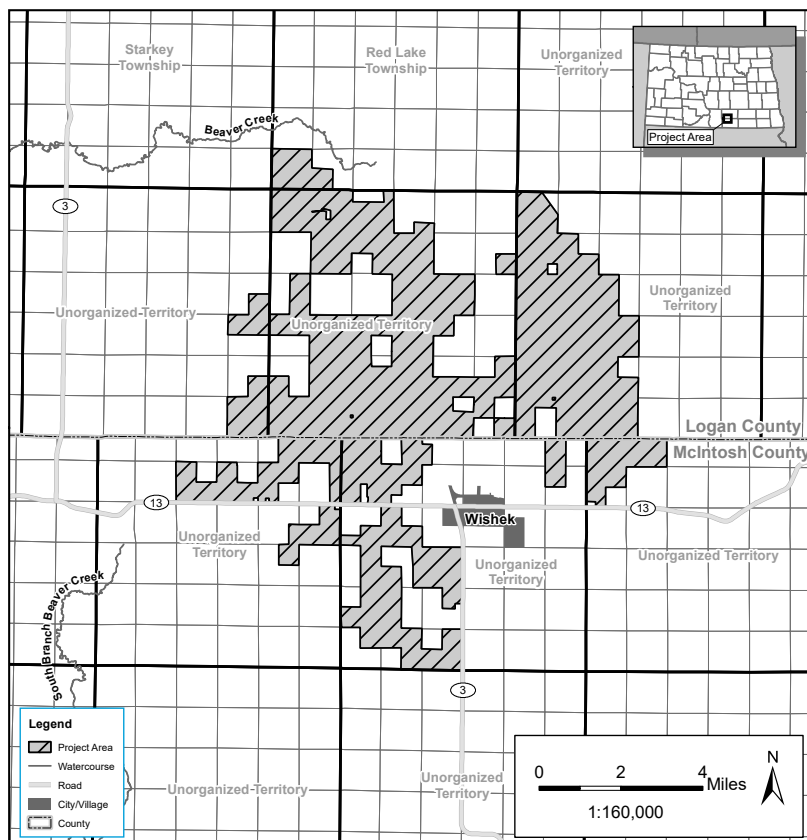
