Edwards has opportunity to fit in next to top talent

The United States still certainly touts the largest depth of talent in men's basketball in the world, exemplified by the country's roster filled with one elite NBA player after another.

But one question for Team USA does remain: Who's the best player?

The near-consensus-best four players in the world — Nikola Jokic, who will lead Serbia against the U.S. on Sunday to open Olympic group play, Luka Doncic, Giannis Antetokounmpo and Shai Gilgeous-Alexander — are all internationals.

NBA player rankings would suggest the top American is Jayson Tatum, who just led a supremely talented Celtics roster to a title, or 2022-23 NBA MVP Joel Embiid.

"Best American player" is a title that has been up for grabs since LeBron James seemingly aged out of the role, though in pre-Olympic games, James sure still looks to be the player most leaned upon when the going

gets tough.

Steph Curry and Kevin Durant are also getting up there in age, but on any given night they are more than capable of being the best player on the court.

Perhaps it is Tatum, Embiid or even a guy like Anthony Davis.

Timberwolves fans would like to argue that it is Anthony Edwards. And, frankly, Edwards does have a growing case. He's one of the most stunning athletes in basketball, and his scoring and general Basketball IQ are indeed growing

each year. Defensively, he makes some jaw-dropping plays while defending the ball handler. And Edwards, who certainly possesses the charisma and confidence to be the face of American basketball, doesn't turn 23 years old until next week.

Still, the Wolves guard likely hasn't yet claimed that role. His awareness and decision-making haven't yet ascended to that level, though he does appear to be on his way.

And if there's a big shot to be taken at some point during the Paris Games,

Edwards will not shy away from taking it. But there shouldn't be a rush to make him "the guy." Not on this team, and especially not on this roster.

Edwards made headlines during Team USA training camp earlier this month in Las Vegas when he told reporters — perhaps tongue-in-cheek — that he's "the No. 1 option" on this stacked team.

"They've got to fit in around me," he said. "That's how I feel."

Edwards always speaks with a comical level of bravado, so parsing through comments to find his true feelings can be a bit of a chore. In general, he has the utmost respect for the game's greats. Durant has always been the basketball icon whom Edwards most

admires.

That doesn't mean he'll defer in key moments. And that's what the public loves about Edwards.

But would it be the worst

thing if he did make an effort to fit around other great players? He'll never be asked to in Minnesota. That's not his role, nor will it ever be.

Receiver Nailor trying for increased availability

Though it's still very early in Vikings training camp, Jalen Nailor is slowly starting to separate himself in the battle to be the team's No. 3 receiver.

In a competitive practice Saturday at TCO Performance Center, Nailor was the best receiver not named Justin Jefferson or Jordan Addison. He highlighted an impressive performance by catching several touchdown passes during a dominant display in the red zone.

"It was amazing," Nailor said. "Just being able to make plays and see the guys get hyped about that."

This is nothing new for Nailor. The man who goes by "Speedy" might be the fastest receiver on the team, and he made a fan out of head coach Kevin O'Connell in the early stages of last season. Frankly, if Nailor would have stayed healthy, he likely would have worked himself into a role within

the offense.

"When he has been out there, he's made plays consistently," O'Connell said. "He's proven what he is as a football player. It's not a question of that. It's just a matter of, 'Can he be out there?'"

That's something that Nailor tried to take into his own hands this offseason. He knew he couldn't keep doing the same thing he had been doing, so he switched up his workout regimen, taking up pilates and yoga as a way to push himself outside of his comfort zone.

"I had to take a whole different approach," he said. "Just trying to have more flexibility to limit the injuries."

He got the idea from watching veterans like Josh Metellus work on their bodies.

"I'm seeing what he's doing off the field and trying to implement that into my game," Nailor said of Metellus' workouts. "Just trying

to make sure I can be available."

That has been easier said than done for Nailor throughout his career, even dating back to his time in college at Michigan State. He acknowledged how frustrating it has been, crediting his wife and daughter with keeping him sane, especially last season during separate stints on injured reserve.

"Whenever I go home, it's a blessing to see their faces," Nailor said. "Everything from the outside world goes away, and I'm able to focus on them."

Now that he's back with the Vikings this season, however, Nailor is focused on making an impact. He is feeling comfortable in the offense, and he believes his ability to play inside and outside should give him the upper hand as he goes up against some of his peers.

"Just trying to make plays when my number is called," Nailor said. "That's the biggest thing for me."

What does a successful camp look like for Vikings' McCarthy?

J.J. McCarthy is trying his best to keep things in perspective with training camp in full swing at TCO Performance Center. Though the Vikings selected McCarthy with the No. 10 pick in the 2024 NFL draft, he currently sits behind Sam Darnold on the depth chart.

How is he sizing up the competition?

Interestingly, McCarthy likened it to his freshman year at the University of Michigan when he spent most of the time behind Cade McNamara on the depth chart at quarterback. He trusted the process under former Wolverines coach Jim Harbaugh and he plans on doing the same thing under Vikings coach Kevin O'Connell.

"I'm not focused on the outcomes of each single day," McCarthy said. "I'm focused on learning how to get better."

That's exactly how McCarthy should be handling things at the moment. Who cares that it's about as cliché of an answer as possible? At least he understands that he has a lot to learn as he begins his journey in the NFL.

"I stayed back this summer to not take my head away

from it," McCarthy said. "Just continued to dive into the playbook and focused on the little things."

The difference has been palpable for McCarthy when comparing his knowledge from organized team activities to training camp.

"I feel like being around this building every single day, my comfortability in this offense is growing exponentially," McCarthy said. "I'd say in OTAs it was very hard for me to get out a play call. That was my biggest goal going into this training camp. To be able to hear it once and execute it and regurgitate it

to the guys with confidence."

Asked about the biggest thing he's learned so far in training camp, McCarthy launched into a jargony soliloquy about a particular play from earlier this week. He described the coverage he was seeing after taking the snap, then went into detail about how things played out. His main takeaway from that experience?

"I wasn't decisive enough," McCarthy said. "I got lucky and it was a completion. I should've got it down to the underneath guy. Just picked up the first down, moved the chains, and not get greedy."

The Dickinson Public School Board held its annual meeting on July 15, 2024, at the Professional Learning Lab. Board members present were Board President Michelle Orton, Board Vice President Kim Schwartz, Board Member Brent Seaks, Board Member David Wilkie, and Board Member Jason Rodakowski. Also present were Superintendent Dr. Marcus Lewton, The Dickinson Press Reporter Manuel Holguin, Jr., The Dickinson Press Reporter LeAnn M. Stasiowski, and School Board Secretary Twila Petersen.

Call to Order – Board Chair Pro Tem Brent Seaks called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. He invited other Board members and the audience to join him in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Participation – There were no requests for public participation.

Election of Officers – Board Chair Seaks opened the floor for the election of officer for the position of president of the school board. Mrs. Schwartz moved to nominate Michelle Orton as president of the Dickinson Public School Board. Mr. Wilkie seconded the motion. Chair Seaks made three calls for additional nominations. There were no further nominations. A voice vote was taken on the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Elected Board President Michelle Orton conducted the election for the position of vice president of the school board. She opened the floor for nominations. Mr. Wilkie moved to nominate Kim Schwartz as vice

president of the Dickinson Public School Board. Mr. Seaks seconded the motion. President Orton made three calls for additional nominations. There were no further nominations. A voice vote was taken on the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the Consent Agenda or Addition/Removal of Consent Agenda Items – Included in the consent agenda are the minutes from the June 24, 2024, School Board Meeting, and the July 11, 2024, Board Workshop. Mrs. Schwartz moved to approve the consent agenda as presented. Mr. Wilkie seconded the motion. A brief video was displayed recognizing some of the accomplishments of students, coaches, advisors, and educators. A voice vote was taken on the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the Agenda – Mr. Seaks moved to approve the agenda as presented. Mrs. Schwartz seconded the motion. A voice vote was taken on the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Superintendent's Report – Superintendent Dr. Lewton addressed the Board. He reported the Central Office Administrators have been working on the Cognia review. The Cognia accreditation is scheduled for November 2024. Dr. Lewton updated the Board on the students preregistered for kindergarten. There are 292 kindergarteners compared to 276 preregistered this same time last year. The Dickinson Public Employee Back-to-School Breakfast sponsored by Bravera Bank and the Dickinson Public School Board is scheduled for Monday and Tuesday, August 19 and 20 th . The North Dakota School Boards Association has updated the policies related to Title IX. Dr. Lewton anticipates presenting those policies to the Board for consideration at the August Board Meeting. The Human Resources Department recently held a successful job fair and has another one scheduled for July 25. Dr. Lewton listed the certified positions that currently remain open.

Business Topics - Informational Topics Board Goals – Posted on the website utilizing the BoardDocs link is posted information on Board Goal Progress Measure 3.3. This progress measure pertains to the percentage of students who scored at or above the Board's goal in mathematics. Also posted is information on Goal Progress Measure 3.5. This progress measure pertains to the percentage of students who scored at or above the Board's goal in reading. The progress measure data utilized for mathematics and reading was retrieved in July 2024 from the ACT exams.

Superintendent Dr. Lewton addressed the Board. He explained the Board goal relates to those students who are Choice Ready. The Board's goal was for the percentage of students to increase from 53 percent in the spring of 2022 to 78 percent in the spring of 2027. The skills identifying a student as postsecondary ready reflect a score of 22 or above in the reading subject area and a score of 21 or above in the mathematics subject area of the ACT. This data has been tracked for the last three years. The data indicates student percentages dropped in mathematics this year to 32 percent. The data from 2022 indicated a baseline of 35 percent. The ACT reading scores remained the same in comparison to 2022.

Dr. Lewton noted students could be postsecondary ready and not score 22 in reading or 21 in mathematics on the ACT. There were other ways to increase the skills through dual credit courses and advanced placement courses. He reminded the Board the data over the years will be from a different cohort of students being tested.

The District has increased initiatives in the number of Tier 3 interventions for students. Additionally, there are professional development opportunities to assist teachers in effectively intervening with students during classroom time.

Superintendent Dr. Lewton presented a scenario for mathematics courses for a high school student. A student who has completed Algebra I, Algebra II, and geometry would average 14 on the ACT mathematics. The national average for mathematics on the ACT is 20.3 for students who take algebra, geometry, and trigonometry. Dr. Lewton explained for a student to receive a score of 21 in the ACT mathematics, the student should have some exposure to trigonometry.

The ACT exam has previously been an accountability measure option. Dr. Lewton stated the ACT exam will no longer be a measure of accountability in the State of North Dakota. Dickinson High School juniors will continue to take the ACT exam.

As a requirement by the Department of Public Instruction, next school year, every sophomore will take a new test called the ND-A+. Dr. Lewton suggests the Board review its goals at the upcoming Board Retreat. There could be readjustments after the fall test results are received.

There was a discussion regarding sample testing of the ACT and the scheduling of mathematics courses so there was not a large gap between taking one mathematics course and the next mathematics course.

This agenda item was informational only. No action was requested.

Update from Construction Manager at Risk on High School Renovation and Additional Security at Elementary Schools – Available on the website utilizing the BoardDocs link is updated information from JE Dunn Client Solutions Representative James Kramer. There are also photos posted of the renovations at three of the elementary schools.

Superintendent Dr. Lewton addressed the Board. He provided an update on renovations at Lincoln Elementary, Heart River Elementary, and Roosevelt Elementary. He reported ICON Architecture will be meeting with Dickinson High School user groups soon. This agenda item was informational only. No action was requested.

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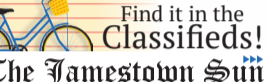

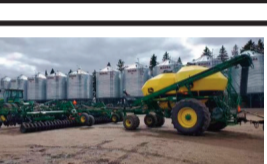
