ASKING ERIC

At over 60 years old, man wants to father a child

Dear Eric: Is it normal for an unmarried man over 60 to want a baby? Where should he look for a marriage-minded young woman willing to accept the age difference? How should he deal with the social stigma against

May-December relationships? — Ticking Biological Clock

Dear Clock: Anyone who is thinking about becoming a parent would be wise to ask themselves what's at the root of that desire, how a child can fit into their life and lifestyle, what skills and traits they have that would benefit a child, and what skills they can learn to help them be a better parent.

In short, they should go into it with eyes as wide open as possible. If you haven't already, start by asking yourself those questions and see what comes up. Wanting to be a positive force in a child's life and to feel the unique love that comes from being a parent is quite natural — if it wasn't, the species would be in greater peril than it already is.

Investigating your feelings will also help you to be a better potential partner and prepare you for conversations with said part-

ner about being an older parent and the stigma of May-December relationships. Be honest on dates and dating sites about what your hopes are and why.

The questions might also lead you to another answer: perhaps you want to be a positive presence for a child in another way, like volunteering, fostering or engaging more with relatives and friends and their children.

Try to be creative in your thinking. (Every parent will tell you that creativity is key anyway.) Maybe you don't actually want a baby (and the 4 a.m. feedings that come along with a baby). Maybe what you're really yearning for is family. There are so many different ways to create and grow a family.

Dear Eric: I read the letter from "Conflicted Sibling," whose senior citizen brother always leaves a mess when he visits and expects her to clean up after him. I recently retired after working many years as a professional social worker for the largest federally operated health care agency in the U.S.

I had many conversations with consumers of this health care agency who were older, often male, and complained that their family (siblings, offspring, etc.) would not do anything for them. They wanted the federal agency to fund house cleaning and

homemaking for them, when the federal agency in our area does not have any such program for homemaking or yard work.

I have listened to many sob stories about the rotten family members who are not willing to help. The truth often is that the family has gotten fed up with the individual's meanness and set a boundary of refusing to be taken advantage of by the person.

If her refusal to allow him to take advantage of her in this way ends their relationship, it wasn't anything to salvage in the first place.

Best suggestion is to refer this man to the Area Agency on Aging. There is an agency in every state. Your letter writer needs to engage her backbone and say "no." — Been There

Dear Been There: The Area Agency on Aging is a great resource. Sometimes with family members, part of setting a boundary involves saying "I need you to be a part of the solution, too." The letter writer's brother can find assistance and empowerment through the agency. Hopefully, this helps the letter writer to adjust their dynamic.

Dear Eric: I have a different suggestion for "Ready to Help." This is for the grandmother who wants to visit her grandchildren and daughter whose mother-in-law now apparently resides

in the guest room: Surely the daughter and her mother-in-law must have undergone some trauma to get to this current housing arrangement. It seems cruel to ask the mother-in-law to leave so granny can visit.

Perhaps a workable idea would be for granny to ask daughter when she could visit that would be of help to her, insisting on staying at a (hopefully) nearby hotel.

Granny could offer to take the kids out for some quality time alone with them to a park or museum or to any possible after-school games, clubs or activities. This visit could also include the kids staying overnight for an "adventure" at the hotel with the grandparents, and give the daughter a much-need, much-welcome break. — Another View

Dear View: Thank you for these suggestions. I wholeheartedly agree. If it's within the letter writer's means, a hotel stay is a great start.

More importantly, as you pointed out, there's an opportunity to relieve some of the tension in the house by being sensitive to the mother-in-law's situation and asking the daughter what would be most helpful.

Today's highlight On April 24, 1916, Irish republicans launched the Easter Rising, a rebellion against British rule in Ireland. Though the rebels surrendered to British forces six days later, the uprising set the stage for republican victories in the Irish general election of 1918 and the establishment of the Irish Free State via the Anglo-Irish Treaty in 1922.

Also on this date

In 1915, in what is considered the start of the Armenian genocide, the Ottoman Empire began rounding up Armenian political and cultural leaders in Constantinople.

In 1967, Soviet cosmonaut Vladimir Komarov was killed when his Soyuz 1 spacecraft smashed into the Earth after his parachutes failed to deploy properly during reentry.

In 1980, the United States launched Operation Eagle Claw, an unsuccessful attempt to free 53 American hostages in Iran that resulted in the deaths of eight U.S. service members.

In 1990, Space Shuttle Discovery blasted off from Cape Canaveral, Florida, carrying the \$1.5 billion Hubble Space Telescope.

In 1995, the final bomb linked to the Unabomber exploded inside the Sacramento, California, offices of the California Forestry Association, killing chief lobbyist Gilbert B. Murray. (Theodore Kaczynski was later sentenced to four lifetimes in prison for a series of bombings.)

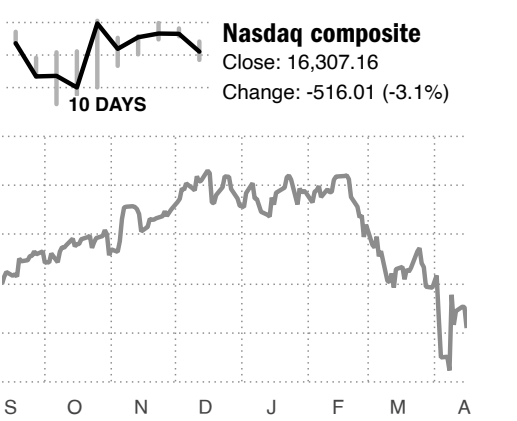
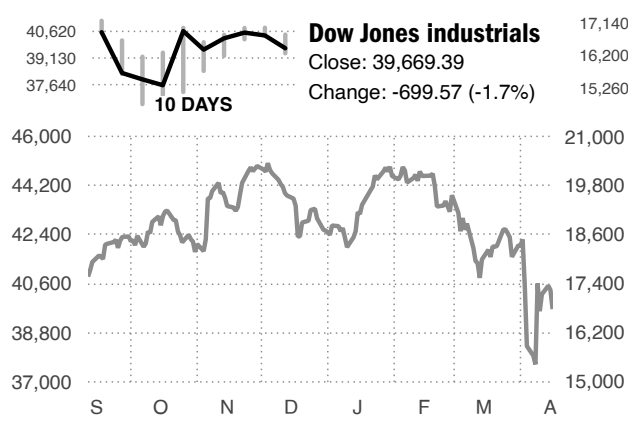

NOTICE OF FILING A PERMIT RENEWAL AND REVISION TO CONDUCT SURFACE COAL MINING AND RECLAMATION OPERATIONS The Coteau Properties Company, 204 County Rd 15, Beulah, ND 58523, as applicant, has filed an Application for Renewal of Permit NACT-0401 with the North Dakota Public Service Commission. The current permit area covers portions of Sections 4 and 9, T145N, R87W, and Sections 21, 22, 23, 25, 26, 27, 28, 33, 34, 35, and 36, T146N, R87W, of the Fifth Principal Meridian, Mercer County, North Dakota. The total acreage within the permit area is approximately 6,070 acres. The permit term will be from September 27, 2025 to September 26, 2030. The Coteau Properties Company has also filed an application for Revision 52 to Permit NACT-0401 with the North Dakota Public Service Commission. This revision identifies the coal removal subarea that will be mined during the next five-year permit term, and addresses all operational changes proposed during the next permit term. Antetokounmpo at a loss after another early exit

Giannis Antetokounmpo had to have known the question was coming.

"Do you think that you can still win that second championship here in Milwaukee after a third straight first-round exit?"

The question came after the Bucks' season ended in Indianapolis on Tuesday night. Antetokounmpo is surely asking himself the same question.

Antetokounmpo didn't have a public answer for it following the 119-118 overtime, season-ending loss in Game 5 of Round 1 against Indiana. But he needs that answer sometime over the coming days or weeks, because he is now at the crossroads that plenty of superstars have reached over the years.

Stay or go?

Yes, a fair question — though it's not really Antetokounmpo's decision. He's under contract to the Bucks for multiple seasons. Even if he asks for a trade, they don't have to accommodate him.

It could be great for Antetokounmpo; he'd pick a new spot and that team would instantly be considered a title contender. It could be great for the Bucks; most teams after years of contending have to hit the reset button at some point anyway, and they could get a haul of players and picks to begin anew.

"I'm not going to do this. I'm not going to do this," Antetokounmpo said in response to the question. "I know ... whatever I say, I know how it's going to translate. I don't know, man. I wish I was still playing. I wish I was still competing and going back to Milwaukee. I don't know."

Antetokounmpo is in his prime. He's about to finish in the top four of the voting for the NBA MVP award — a trophy he's won twice — for the seventh consecutive year. He just averaged 30 points per game for the third year in a row. He just averaged at least 25 points and 10 rebounds for the eighth straight season; only Shaquille O'Neal, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Karl Malone have more such seasons.

ROCKETS 131, WARRIORS 116: Fred VanVleet scored 26 points, Amen Thompson added 25, and host Houston avoided elimination with a rout of Golden State in Game 5.

Warriors coach Steve Kerr threw in the towel early in this one with the game out of hand. A layup by VanVleet midway through the third quarter made it 93-64, though the Warriors did rally to within 109-92 with eight minutes left. Dillon Brooks added 24 points on a night when all five Houston scored in double figures.

Haliburton scolds father over fracas

INDIANAPOLIS — Pacers guard Tyrese Haliburton was so excited about Indiana's improbable overtime rally that he didn't realize what led to the postgame scuffle between his teammates and the Milwaukee Bucks on Tuesday night.

Then he got to the locker room, watched the replay and winced when he saw his father, John, on the court, confronting two-time MVP Giannis Antetokounmpo.

"I had no idea it happened until I got back to the locker room and they showed me the video of my pops," the two-time All-Star said after he made the decisive layup with 1.3 seconds left to give Indiana a 119-118 victory and a 4-1 series win. "We had a little talk about it. I don't agree with what transpired there. I think basketball is basketball and let's keep it on the court. I think he just got excited."

Antetokounmpo wasn't pleased, either, after his team blew a seven-point lead in the final 40 seconds of overtime, sending the Bucks to their third straight first-round exit. The two-time MVP didn't recognize John Haliburton, thinking he was just another fan who had run onto the court.

Hawks' Daniels wins most improved award

Atlanta's Dyson Daniels has been voted the NBA's most improved player, beating out fellow finalists Cade Cunningham of Detroit and Ivica Zubac of the Los Angeles Clippers.

Daniels' first season in Atlanta was nothing like either of his first two NBA seasons with New Orleans. His numbers soared with career-bests in points (14.1), rebounds (5.9), assists (4.4), steals (3.0) and a field-goal percentage of 49.3%.

Antetokounmpo at a loss after another early exit

Giannis Antetokounmpo had to have known the question was coming.

"Do you think that you can still win that second championship here in Milwaukee after a third straight first-round exit?"

The question came after the Bucks' season ended in Indianapolis on Tuesday night. Antetokounmpo is surely asking himself the same question.

Antetokounmpo didn't have a public answer for it following the 119-118 overtime, season-ending loss in Game 5 of Round 1 against Indiana. But he needs that answer sometime over the coming days or weeks, because he is now at the crossroads that plenty of superstars have reached over the years.

Stay or go?

Yes, a fair question — though it's not really Antetokounmpo's decision. He's under contract to the Bucks for multiple seasons. Even if he asks for a trade, they don't have to accommodate him.

It could be great for Antetokounmpo; he'd pick a new spot and that team would instantly be considered a title contender. It could be great for the Bucks; most teams after years of contending have to hit the reset button at some point anyway, and they could get a haul of players and picks to begin anew.

"I'm not going to do this. I'm not going to do this," Antetokounmpo said in response to the question. "I know ... whatever I say, I know how it's going to translate. I don't know, man. I wish I was still playing. I wish I was still competing and going back to Milwaukee. I don't know."

Antetokounmpo is in his prime. He's about to finish in the top four of the voting for the NBA MVP award — a trophy he's won twice — for the seventh consecutive year. He just averaged 30 points per game for the third year in a row. He just averaged at least 25 points and 10 rebounds for the eighth straight season; only Shaquille O'Neal, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Karl Malone have more such seasons.

ROCKETS 131, WARRIORS 116: Fred VanVleet scored 26 points, Amen Thompson added 25, and host Houston avoided elimination with a rout of Golden State in Game 5.

Warriors coach Steve Kerr threw in the towel early in this one with the game out of hand. A layup by VanVleet midway through the third quarter made it 93-64, though the Warriors did rally to within 109-92 with eight minutes left. Dillon Brooks added 24 points on a night when all five Houston scored in double figures.

Haliburton scolds father over fracas

INDIANAPOLIS — Pacers guard Tyrese Haliburton was so excited about Indiana's improbable overtime rally that he didn't realize what led to the postgame scuffle between his teammates and the Milwaukee Bucks on Tuesday night.

Then he got to the locker room, watched the replay and winced when he saw his father, John, on the court, confronting two-time MVP Giannis Antetokounmpo.

"I had no idea it happened until I got back to the locker room and they showed me the video of my pops," the two-time All-Star said after he made the decisive layup with 1.3 seconds left to give Indiana a 119-118 victory and a 4-1 series win. "We had a little talk about it. I don't agree with what transpired there. I think basketball is basketball and let's keep it on the court. I think he just got excited."

Antetokounmpo wasn't pleased, either, after his team blew a seven-point lead in the final 40 seconds of overtime, sending the Bucks to their third straight first-round exit. The two-time MVP didn't recognize John Haliburton, thinking he was just another fan who had run onto the court.

Hawks' Daniels wins most improved award

Atlanta's Dyson Daniels has been voted the NBA's most improved player, beating out fellow finalists Cade Cunningham of Detroit and Ivica Zubac of the Los Angeles Clippers.

Daniels' first season in Atlanta was nothing like either of his first two NBA seasons with New Orleans. His numbers soared with career-bests in points (14.1), rebounds (5.9), assists (4.4), steals (3.0) and a field-goal percentage of 49.3%.
