

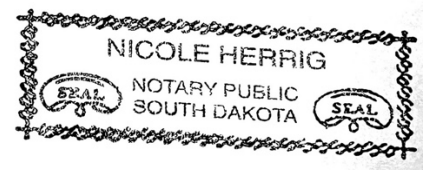

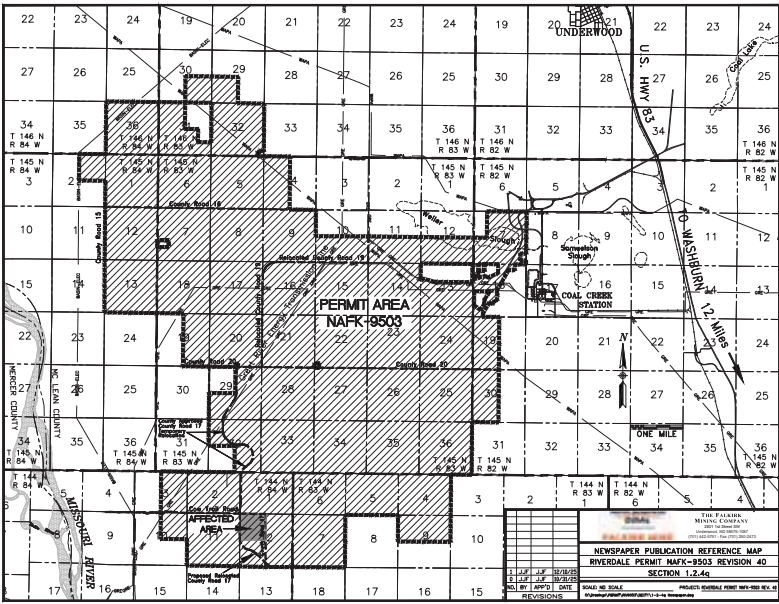

Notice Of Filing A Permit Revision To Conduct Surface Coal Mining Operations

The Falkirk Mining Company, P.O. Box 1087, Underwood, ND 58576, has filed an application (Revision No. 40) to Permit NAFK-9503 to mine federal coal and add mining plans in the NW¼ of Section 12, T144N, R84W. As a result of mine plan changes due to federal coal, there will be minor delays in the coal removal on adjacent tracts. As a result of this permit revision, Falkirk updated the introductory, legal, surface and coal interest ownership, geology, operations plans, transportation facilities and reclamation plans.

Adams resumes chase of ‘mythical’ Super Bowl

LOS ANGELES — Davante Adams reached the NFC championship game four times during his eight seasons with Aaron Rodgers and the Packers.

Every time, Green Bay came up just short of the Super Bowl — and Adams still feels the pain.

“It just feels almost like a mythical thing to me at this point,” Adams said Wednesday. “You do everything you can to get there, and it’s been so hard. Been working so hard at it.”

After an ensuing three years spent nowhere near a Super Bowl, Adams is back for his fifth shot when his Los Angeles Rams (14-5) visit the Seattle Seahawks (16-3) on Sunday for another NFC title game.

The 33-year-old Adams is still going strong as the league leader in touchdown receptions and a key component of the NFL’s top offense. But when the decorated receiver says he craves that final, ultimate team success far more than individual accolades, it’s clear he’s among the rare athletes who absolutely mean it.

“Forgive me if I’m not smiling ear-to-ear after the first win or the second (playoff) win, having been here so many times and understanding what it takes to get where we’re ultimately trying to go,” Adams said. “We’re close, and we’ve just got to finish it off.”

Although Adams has been waiting the longest, he’s far from the only Rams player who will be playing for a chance at a Super Bowl debut when they face the top-seeded Seahawks for the third time this season.

Sean McVay led the Rams to a championship four seasons ago, but only a handful of players are left from that team — just two on defense.

Matthew Stafford, tight end Tyler Higbee and cornerback Darious Williams are the only players left who made major contributions to that Super Bowl title run and also played extensively for the current team. Williams left and returned to the Rams, as did linebacker Troy Reeder and center Coleman Shelton.

Reeder now plays mostly special teams, while Shelton and starting left tackle Alaric Jackson were backups in 2021. Receiver Tutu Atwell was injured as a rookie and right tackle Rob Havenstein is injured now.

But nobody has been waiting longer than Adams for his first shot at a championship ring. He is one of the most consistent receivers of his generation, posting eight seasons with at least 997 yards while moving up to 26th in NFL history with 12,633 yards.

Darnold feeling ‘really good’ after playing with injury

RENTON, Wash. — After playing with an oblique injury in the Seattle Seahawks’ 41-6 win over the San Francisco 49ers in the divisional round, quarterback Sam Darnold said he has felt “really good” in the days since the victory.

“Just attacking rehab these last couple days,” Darnold said Wednesday. “Obviously will be throughout the week. Like I said, just got to continue to prepare and get my body right for Sunday.”

The eighth-year quarterback was confident last week he would be able to play in the Seahawks’ first home playoff game in front of fans in nearly a decade and followed through.

Before being pulled in the fourth quarter of a blowout win, Darnold completed 12 of 17 passes for 124 yards and a touchdown.

Coach Mike Macdonald said that Darnold’s health continues to improve, but that he will not be a full-go in practice during the week leading up to Sunday’s NFC championship game against

the Los Angeles Rams.

“We have a plan,” Macdonald said. “We’re going to work through it; see how the day goes; then kind of take it day by day and take it to tomorrow. But he won’t be like throwing every ball every play for the whole week, no.”

Mixon faces uncertain future after missing season

HOUSTON — Joe Mixon’s status for next season remains uncertain after the Houston Texans running back missed all season with what general manager Nick Caserio called a “freak” foot injury Wednesday.

“We haven’t seen Joe in a little bit, so I think at some point we’ll see him and then we’ll be able to evaluate kind of where he is and then based on information, we’ll see where his status is,” Caserio said.

The Texans provided few details on the 29-year-old Mixon’s recovery throughout the season after announcing in training camp that he sustained a foot injury away from the facility in the offseason.

Asked for details about his injury Wednesday, Caserio gave a bit more information but still didn’t specify exactly what the injury was.

“It wasn’t like he was riding a snowmobile or anything like that,” Caserio said. “It was more of a medical condition or situation that never... really didn’t improve maybe as much as everybody would have hoped. I’m not trying to evade the question, that’s the reality of the situation. He didn’t jump off a building. He wasn’t cliff diving or anything. He wasn’t doing anything irresponsible. It was just a freak thing.”

The Texans reached the divisional round of the playoffs for a third straight season, but their offense took a major hit with Mixon out all season with the injury. It came after he ran for 1,016 yards and 11 touchdowns in his first season with the team in 2024. He has one year remaining on a three-year, \$27 million contract extension he signed after joining the Texans following seven years with the Bengals.

Coleman draws attention after McDermott’s firing

ORCHARD PARK, N.Y. — As if Buffalo Bills wide receiver Keon Coleman didn’t attract enough negative attention for showing up late to meetings during an underperforming season.

On Wednesday, the second-year player was drawn into the conversation involving team owner Terry Pegula’s abrupt decision to fire coach Sean McDermott on Monday.

Pegula shared the podium with general manager Brandon Beane during an end-of-season news conference. And the owner interjected when questions turned to Beane’s failure to improve the team’s group of receivers last offseason and Coleman’s lack of development.

“Can I interrupt?” the owner said. “I’ll address the Keon situation.”

Pegula then explained it was the coaching staff that pushed for Coleman being

the Bills’ second-round pick in the 2024 draft.

“I’m not saying Brandon wouldn’t have drafted him. But he wasn’t his next choice,” Pegula said.

“Ultimately, I’m not turning a pick for a player that I don’t think we can succeed with. So, don’t misunderstand that,” Beane added.
