Pursuant to Section 4 of the Natural Gas Act and Part 154 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's ("Commission") regulations, 18 C.F.R. Part 154, Viking Gas Transmission Company ("Viking") hereby submits for filing and acceptance the tariff records listed below for inclusion in its FERC Gas Tariff, Volume No. 1 ("Tariff"). The proposed tariff records are submitted to become effective January 29, 2026.

Part 10.0, Summary of Non-Conforming and Negotiated Rate Agreements, v. 35.0.0
Part 10.5, Sequent Energy Management LLC PAL Agreement RLN-5009, v. 7.0.0
Part 10.10, Reserved for Future Use, v. 3.0.0

Statement of Nature, Reasons, and Basis for the Proposed Changes

A. Negotiated Rate PAL Agreement

Pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § Section 154.1(d), Viking submits for Commission review and approval one negotiated rate Parking and Lending ("PAL") agreement for inclusion in Viking's Tariff. While Viking only seeks Commission approval of the executed negotiated rate PAL agreement, Appendix C contains copies of the conforming master PAL agreement with Sequent Energy Management LLC ("Sequent") to provide complete documentation. The terms of the negotiated rate agreement are described below:

Contract No. RLN-5009 with Sequent

Viking and Sequent entered into a master PAL agreement on June 25, 2009 ("PAL034"). Pursuant to PAL034, on January 29, 2026, Viking and Sequent entered into a negotiated rate

PAL agreement effective January 29, 2026. The negotiated rate PAL agreement allows for Sequent to loan up to 1,000 Dekatherms on January 29, 2026, with a payback period between January 29, 2026 and February 2, 2026. Viking and Sequent agreed to a negotiated daily rate of \$1.0000 per Dekatherm, which is above the maximum tariff rate.

On March 26, 1997, in Docket No. RP97-249-000, the Commission authorized Viking to charge negotiated rates for its transportation services.¹ Viking's negotiated rate provisions were made pursuant to the Commission's Policy Statement which was issued January 31, 1996.² Pursuant to Order 714,³ Viking is filing the negotiated rate agreement as a tariff record. The information set forth in Volume No. 1 of Viking's Tariff fully discloses the essential conditions involved in the negotiated rate transaction, including a specification of all consideration. The negotiated rate agreement does not deviate in any material respect from the form of PAL service agreement in Viking's Tariff.

B. Removal of Agreements

In compliance with 18 C.F.R. §154.602, Viking is providing notice of the termination of one negotiated rate PAL agreement ("VR1133") on file with the Commission. Additionally, Viking proposes to remove from Part 10.5 of its Tariff, a non-conforming agreement ("AF0357"), that was amended and extended as a fully conforming agreement as of September 1, 2025.

Viking seeks a waiver of the 30-day notice of termination pursuant to the service agreements listed below. No customers were adversely affected by the terminated VR1133 agreement, which expired on its own terms, or by the extension and modification of the AF0357 agreement. Viking submits tariff record changes to Part 10.0, Summary of Non-Conforming and Negotiated Rate Agreements, as noted above, to remove the following agreements:

Proposed Effective Date

Pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 154.7(a)(3), Viking respectfully requests that the negotiated rate PAL agreement and the tariff records submitted herewith be approved effective January 29, 2026. In accordance with 18 C.F.R. § 154.7(a)(9), Viking hereby files a motion to place the proposed tariff records into effect at the end of any suspension period if one is so ordered by the Commission in this proceeding.

Waivers

Pursuant to Section 154.7(a)(7) of the Commission's regulations,⁸ Viking respectfully requests a waiver to Section 154.207 of the Commission's regulations⁹ as the effective date of the agreements is less than 30 days prior to the tariff's proposed effective date. Viking has not identified any additional waivers of the Commission's regulations needed to permit its filing to become effective as proposed; however, Viking respectfully requests that, should the Commission determine that any such waivers are required, the Commission grant such waivers as are necessary in order that the revised tariff records may be made effective as proposed.
