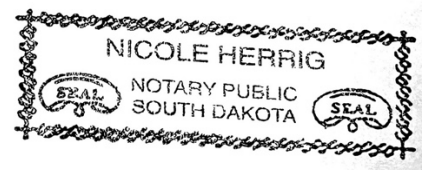

NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

On July 31, 2026, Otter Tail Power Company (OTP) filed a request for approval of its Advanced Metering & Distribution Technology Cost Recovery Rider (AMDT Rider) Rate for 2027. The purpose of the AMDT Rider is to recover the costs associated with advanced metering infrastructure and demand response not presently reflected in retail rates from OTP North Dakota customers.

OTP proposed to recover approximately \$2,457,724 during the recovery period from January 1, 2027, through December 31, 2027, through a per meter charge for each customer class. The proposed residential rate will decrease from \$2.28 per meter per month to \$1.86 and the Large General Service – Secondary rate will decrease from \$21.29 per meter per month to \$14.26.

The issues to be considered in this proceeding are:

1. Do the investments and associated costs qualify for recovery?
2. Whether the rate adjustments are consistent with the terms of OTP's tariff?
3. Are the proposed rates just and reasonable?

Those interested are invited to comment on the application in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. Comments and requests for hearings must be received by October 9, 2026. If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a formal hearing.

Where does gun violence prevention stand a year after Annunciation shooting?

ST. PAUL — Dan Manchon and Mike Roaldi, who both have children at Annunciation Catholic School in Minneapolis, weren’t politically active in the past. That changed after Aug. 27, 2025.

Manchon has two daughters, ages 8 and 10, who were in the church that morning, when their classmates, 8-year-old Fletcher Merkel and 10-year-old Harper Moyski, were killed and 29 others were injured.

He said the parents all felt, “Is there anything we can do to keep this from happening to others?”

Roaldi, who has three kids at Annunciation — the youngest of whom was close friends with Fletcher — told Forum News Service he shied away from politics in the past, even when he had “strong feelings” about it.

“If you’re not gonna stand up and try to do something after you’ve been through something like this, when are you?” he said recently.

Jake and Kris Kelly have a son at Annunciation who’s heading into eighth grade, and Kris said the advocacy has given them “comfort.”

For the Annunciation parents, that advocacy hasn’t been about aligning with one political party or finding one single policy that can pre-

vent the next shooting.

“I think there’s far more middle ground than people think,” Jake Kelly said. “It’s a combination of everything. It’s a combination of mental health ... of social media ... of continuing red flag laws.”

“Keeping kids safe is not controversial,” he added.

Parents reflect on last session

Manchon, Roaldi and the Kellys are members of the Annunciation Light Alliance, a nonpartisan parents advocacy group that pushed for gun violence prevention measures at the Capitol last session.

When Manchon met with lawmakers, he recalls a few who

Community marks one year since Annunciation shooting

MINNEAPOLIS — While the occasion was a somber one, Pearl Park in south Minneapolis was filled with music, smiles and hugs on Thursday as community members came together to collect school supplies, make care kits for homeless youth, and plant trees and flowers.

Aug. 27 marked one year since the shooting at Annunciation Catholic Church that killed 8-year-old Fletcher Merkel and 10-year-old Harper Moyski, and injured at least 29 others.

“It’s been nearly one year since we lost our beloved Harper and Fletcher, and so we don’t look at this as an anniversary or a celebration,” Principal Matt DeBoer said in a prerecorded interview shared by the city.

“We’re calling it Remembrance Day because we will never forget, and we do remember the love, the light, the joy, the hope, the fellowship, and the community that Harper and Fletcher brought to us in their brief time here on Earth,” he said.

While community members were welcome at the Pearl Park event about a mile away, Annunciation leadership asked for privacy around the church and school. Campus observances were private and not open to the public.

Tom Bond, community engagement manager for Avenues for Youth, which helped organize the public event, said the idea to help a homeless organization was a request from one of the Annunciation kids. He said that has really “struck” him.

“The phrase everyone’s throwing down today is like helping is healing,” Bond said. “A student, after everything they’ve gone through over the

last year, chose to help us.”

Molly Curtis, who lives in south Minneapolis and works at Children’s Hospital, said she came to Pearl Park to support the community. While she wasn’t working on the day of the shooting, she said many of her colleagues are still “really reeling from it.”

Curtis said she felt really “heavy” on Thursday, and that it’s surprising a whole year has passed since the shooting.

“My kids start school in the next couple of weeks, and there’s a lot of excitement that comes with this time of year, and so, to contrast that with the tragedy, and how a year ago those families were so excited to be starting school,” she said. “I think that’s been sitting really heavy with me.”

Curtis has been living in Minneapolis for four years; after the past year, witnessing the sense of community that came forth from Annunciation and Operation Metro Surge, she and her husband said: “We’re staying forever.”

“This is such an amazing place in terms of what people do in the face of tragedy and hardship and kind of rallying around each other,” she said. “I feel like I’ve just been completely bowled away by how everybody has reacted to this really, really hard year.”

Patty Matthews lives in Apple Valley and is the Moms Demand Action director for the south Metro.

Matthews said she saw some of the Annunciation parents whom she has gotten to know through her advocacy work at the park on Thursday, and wanted to “give them a hug and just to reassure them that we as a community care.”

“The biggest thing is the trauma’s not over,

and we just need to remind everybody that it may be a one-year ... but it’s not over, and it’s not going to be over,” she said.

Matthews said the Annunciation community has had so much courage over the past year to tell their stories.

“Their response to everything was move your feet ... They have continued to say, this is

awful. This is a tragedy. But we need to move our feet. We need to care for people,” she said. “They haven’t focused on [themselves]; they’ve focused outward.”

Matthews was referring to something Principal DeBoer said last year during a news briefing following the shooting. The phrase has stuck with the community, appearing on

Annunciation sweat-shirts and T-shirts.

“There’s an African proverb that says, ‘When you pray, move your feet.’ So I beg you, I ask you to please pray, but don’t stop with your words. Let’s make a difference and support this community, these children, these families, these teachers,” DeBoer said at the time.

With the help of over 200 volunteers,

Thursday’s event produced 150 care kits for homeless youth, 60 native plants along the boulevard near the park, and three carloads of school supplies for Minneapolis Public Schools, as well as boxes full of food donations.

3. Are the proposed rates just and reasonable?
Those interested are invited to comment on the application in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. Comments and requests for hearings must be received by October 9, 2026. If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a formal hearing.
