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PSC Schedules Public Hearing for Proposed Battery Energy Storage Project in Emmons County

BISMARCK, ND – The North Dakota Public Service Commission (PSC) will hold a public hearing on Thursday, November 20, regarding a proposal to construct a battery energy storage system in Emmons County, North Dakota.

Emmons-Logan Energy Storage, LLC, is requesting a siting permit for a 140-megawatt battery energy storage system with a four-hour duration to store excess energy available on the grid. The system would be capable of storing excess power from the grid when production exceeds demand. The estimated cost of the project is \$181 million.

The project is proposed to be located adjacent to the existing Emmons-Logan Wind Energy Center. The project area would encompass approximately 24 acres in Emmons County. The hearing provides an opportunity for members of the public to contribute to the PSC's official record. Any comments from members of the public must be received at a hearing to be part of the record. People with concerns or support/opposition for the project are encouraged to attend the hearing and present their information. Information received after the hearing will not be part of the official record and cannot be used as a basis for the Commission's decision unless certain additional procedures are followed.

The North Dakota Public Service Commission is a constitutionally created state agency with authority to permit, site and regulate certain business activities in the state including electric and gas
